Voter motivation activities at 10 churches Oct. 28 and Nov. 4

A campaign to energize the African American faith-based community to turn out at the polls in the Lansing area Nov. 6 has been launched by Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. and AARP Michigan, in partnership with the Skinner Leadership Institute.

The 2018 Turnout Sunday Campaign, especially targeted to voters 50 and older, will reach congregations at 10 Lansing area churches on Oct. 28 and Nov. 4. Churchgoers will hear about the importance of the 2018 Midterm Elections, what to expect to see on the ballot, location of polling places, and other information.

In March of 1913, nearly six weeks after its founding, several Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. Founders marched in the historic Suffragist March under the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. banner, the Sorority's first public act. "Today, the Lansing Alumnae Chapter continues what was started over 105 years ago, as we push to mobilize and educate voters across the greater Lansing area," said Pamela Ford, President of the Lansing Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. "We cannot tell people how to vote, but we want them to feel empowered in their vote." AARP Michigan staff and volunteers will distribute information about seven tips for voting and the AARP national "Be the Difference. Vote" campaign.

"Critical issues like Medicare, Social Security, family caregiving, prescription drugs and financial security are all on the line in this election," said Paula D. Cunningham, State Director of AARP Michigan. "Use your vote to hold the

politicians accountable and make them pay attention to the issues that really matter to you."

Michigan is among six states targeted for intensive voter engagement. The 2018 Turn-out Sunday Campaign offers educational webinars and guidance on hosting voter education and mobilization activities such as: prayer breakfasts, National Turn-out Sunday Services, and get-out-the-vote trainings, to equip pastors across the nation with vital tools such as: Information about what's at stake in the 2018 Midterm Elections; Pastors' and churches' rights when participating in elections; Pre-election engagement activities; Election Day turnout planning and support.

Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. and AARP Michigan are grateful to local churches that have made a commitment to ensure their church membership is educated and ready to vote in the upcoming Nov. 6 General Election. Both organizations will have representation at the churches in the Greater Lansing area.

Be Informed about Your Rights and Resources before going to the Polls on Nov 6

As we approach the Tuesday, November 6 Election, I wanted pass along information to assist you to make the voting process as easy as possible as allowed by law, so that your voice can be heard in our democracy. Before going to the polls, visit Lansing-mi.gov/clerk or call 517-483- 4133 if you have questions. You will discover links to:
Voter Registration Verification & Polling Location (with a map!)
Preview YOUR Personal Sample Ballot
Absentee Ballot Request Forms
Links to Nonpartisan Voting Resources
Poll Watchers and Poll Challengers
Summary of what they are allowed and not allowed to do.

I recommend taking a few minutes to review the ballot and make sure you know where you vote on November 6. It can save you time, and help you make informed choices. Many people often incorrectly believe that they are unable to vote. Citizens who have served their time in jail or people who have moved within the City are STILL

able to vote. Don't assume that you are unable to vote. Visit lansingmi.gov/clerk and click the "Am I Registered to Vote?" link or call my office to see if you are registered and where to vote at. Polls are open from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m. Anyone in line at 8 p.m. has the right to stay in line and vote before the precinct can close. We have a link to the League of Women Voters' website, Vote411.org, which is a very helpful resource for nonpartisan information on the proposals and candidates. Election workers at a precinct are not allowed by law to explain the purpose of a ballot proposal or answer questions about candidates ensuring that our workers do not bias a voter in any way. No Longer able to vote for Straight Ticket
Due to the elimination of straight-party voting, voters will need to mark their candidate choice in each one of the partisan races on the ballot. If you do make a mistake, you have the right to spoil your ballot and get a new blank ballot to start over to ensure your votes are recorded.

Please be aware that Proposal 3 is on the ballot and among other items would restore straight ticket voting if passed. Therefore, straight ticket voting could return as an option after this election.

Photo ID and Voting
If you happen to forget your photo identification on the way to the polls or do not possess an acceptable ID, your vote will still be counted in most situations. There is a brief affidavit to sign that states that you do not have an ID with you at that time. Also, you do NOT need your voter registration card to vote. The following types of photo ID are acceptable at polling locations:
Michigan driver's license or state-issued ID card
Driver's license or personal identification card issued by another state
Federal or state government-issued photo identification
U.S. passport
Military ID with photo
Student identification with photo from a high school or accredited institution

of higher learning
Tribal identification card with photo

There is very specific types of voters who must show approved photo identification such as first time voters in Michigan who completed a mail-in voter registration form rather than completing the voter registration process at the Secretary of State, County or local clerk's office.


Absentee Ballots
On Election Day, we will accept absentee ballots at the South Washington Office at 2500 S. Washington or at the City Hall, 124 W. Michigan until 8 p.m. If you do not drop off your ballot, you can still vote in person at your precinct. If you bring your absentee ballot to your precinct, you will have to surrender it and start with a new one to vote at the polls. I hope you found this article informative and will take advantage of the resources available to make an informed decision on Tuesday, November 6.

MSU LOOKING TOWARD A CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON

EAST LANSING - How do you follow a 30-5 Big 10 Championship season that somehow feels like a bust?

If you're Tom Izzo and the Michigan State University basketball team you cherish the experience, learn from it, and build.

At least that's the plan.

"Our goals remain the same," said junior guard, Josh Langford. "We still can win a national championship. Nobody likes losing the first weekend in the tournament, but you learn from it. You must learn from it but not dwell on it. I'm looking forward to us getting going with the season."

With three starters and 60 percent of last season's scoring among the six returning members of last season's playing group, the Spartans appear to have plenty of experienced players upon which to build.

At the core is a trio of three-year starters in juniors Cassius Winston, Nick Ward and Langford. They are joined in the starting line-up by seniors' co-captain, Matt McQuaid and forward, Kenny Goins.

The group gives the Spartans one of the most experienced line-ups in the nation and one which has perhaps logged more floor time together than any Izzo has fielded in his 24 seasons at the Spartan helm.

It won't be easy. Ranked 10 in the preseason poll, the Spartans open their regular season November 6 in Indianapolis against number one Kansas, host Florida Gulf Coast, Louisiana Monroe, and Tennessee Tech, then hit the road to face UCLA and either North Carolina or Texas in Las Vegas, visit Louisville in the ACC/Big 10 Challenge and begin conference play at Rutgers - all before December.

By Christmas they will have also entertained Iowa and always dangerous Oakland at Breslin and traveled to Florida. That's 12 games likely against top 10 and three other top 25 and two conference opponents. That's a tall order, Izzo hopes their experience will carry them through.

"Experience is everything," said Winston, who looks to build upon a stellar sophomore season which saw him lead the Big 10 in assists with 6.9 and in 3-point accuracy with 56 percent shooting. "Talent can some games, but experience wins championships. When you get tired, you make the smarter play, when you need a stop, you know how to dig in, when you need a basket, you know what play to run. All that comes from experience."

The Spartan experience is not without talent, mind you. A Cousy Award finalist and third team All Big 10 selection, Winston averaged 12.6 points. Ward chipped in 12.4 points and 7.1 rebounds per game to earn All-Big 10 third team honors. Langford averaged 11.7 points per contest, led the Spartans scoring six times, and was named the team's top defensive player.

A senior, McQuaid has been a fixture in the playing group three seasons. He provides steady outside shooting, dependable ball handling and tough defense. In his fifth season, Goins is a versatile swing man who adds solid defense, rebounding and increasingly reliable mid-range shooting.

Coming off the bench will likely by sophomore big man, Xavier Tillman and red-shirt junior, Kyle Ahrens.

Tillman is touted by Izzo as perhaps the hardest working, most improved player on the roster. He'll split time between the power forward and center spots. He's dropped 20 pounds and gone from 21 percent body fat to 11, making him quicker and more athletic. Making 300-500 jump shots in the gym per day has also improved his scoring potential.

Ahrens, who appears to be healthy for the first time in his MSU career, may be due for a breakout season.

Four freshman, Marcus Bingham Jr. 6-11 forward Grand Rapids, Gabe Brown, 6-7 forward from Ypsilanti, Aaron Henry, 6-6 forward from Indianapolis, Foster Loyer, 6-0 guard from Clarkston, will be used to fill in as they gain physical maturity and experience.

Henry gained a bit of note through his play in the local summer league appears most likely to make a quick contribution. Bingham, with his 7'-5" wingspan could help inside, especially defensively, but he'll need to add bulk to be able to withstand the physicality of a major college season. Loyer is slated to backup Winston at the point and Brown should crack the rotation by mid-season as he gets acclimated.

Smooth Jazz, Sweet Sax Sound of Tom Braxton

Tom Braxton is looking forward to performing in mid-Michigan for the first time on Friday November 23rd at 7 pm.

The Texas saxman has shared the stage with many well-known artists including Dave Koz, Rick Braun, Peter White, Candy Dulfer, Brian Culbertson, Bob James, George Duke, Earl Klugh, Kirk Whalum, Jonathan Butler, Warren Hill, Jeff Golub, Marcus Miller, Keiko Matsui, Aretha Franklin, Luther Vandross, Sheila E., and Phillip Bailey. Braxton knows how to charm audiences of all ages and he knows that his "music originates from a deep place inside that is based around my faith, a love for my family and his my life experiences."

Braxton's fascination with the sax started 2 years after he began playing piano when, his father, a retired band director and saxophonist gave him his first horn. "I have to credit my dad with connecting me to jazz at an early age. He introduced me to all the jazz legends: Lester Young, Miles, Coltrane, Charlie Parker, Stitt, Getz, Ben Webster, Coleman Hawkins, and many more. He would share how he had heard Count Basie and Duke's original bands and the great Ella Fitzgerald".

The high school valedictorian attended Texas Tech University on track and music scholarships. During his college years, Braxton formed a jazz-fusion band that toured the southwest and opened concerts for Joe Sample, Stanley Clarke, George Howard. He launched his solo career after graduating summa cum laude with a Bachelor of Music/ Performance degree.

Career highlights include "having the opportunity to record a duet with long-time friend Kirk Whalum on the song 'Peacemaker' on his first CD; touring with the late Wayman Tisdale; teaming up with the late Ricky Lawson "the drummer to the stars" and being inducted into the West Texas Walk of Fame (Lubbock, Texas) with his father James "J.T." Braxton.

"I have to credit Bernard Wright with getting me the gig with Wayman. I flew to Sacramento and played with Wayman where we opened a concert for the Yellowjackets. I'll never forget it...it was 1992!" Tom then toured extensively with Wayman Tisdale for 17 years, serving as Musical Director for 10 of those years. Wayman was quoted saying, "When I'm on the road, Tom is the saxophonist I want to have with me. I love that sweet sound he gets on the horn."

Braxton is an extraordinary composer, producer, and arranger who transitions from soprano, alto, and tenor saxophones with little effort. He has an acquired a skill of blending his musical talent and sharing his versatility on piano, keyboards, and flute. Braxton is a repeat performer on the Smooth Jazz Cruise and has been a featured performer to showcase his talents in Jazz, Latin, Funk, and R&B. He has opened concerts for many jazz headliners including Norman Brown, Boney James, Najee, Dave Brubeck, Cab Calloway, Spyro Gyra, The Rippingtons, David Benoit, Pieces of a Dream, Michael Franks, and The Crusaders. He has released 9 albums plus a collaboration project.
