

Aretha Franklin Had Close to \$1M in Uncashed Checks When She Died 1 Year Ago

At the time of her death last year, <u>Aretha Franklin</u> had almost \$1 million in uncashed checks in her posses-

sion, *Billboard* reports. Newly-filed court papers detail that the checks were discovered during an inventory of Franklin's possessions.

The inventory found that Franklin had a check for \$702,711.90 from Sound Exchange and Screen Writers Guild as well as uncashed checks to her publishing company, Springtime Publishing, from EMI, BMI, Carlin Music and Feel Good Films in the amount of \$285,944.27 — in total, \$988,656.17 in uncashed checks.

The findings are just the latest development in the <u>battle over</u> the Queen of Soul's estate. When Franklin died on Aug. 16, 2018, at the age of 76, she left behind four sons: Clarence, Edward, Teddy and Kecalf. Originally, no will was found and under <u>Michigan</u> law, her estate was set to be divided equally

between her children. However, nine months after her death, three handwritten wills — two from 2010 and one from 2014 — were found in her home.

The discovery of the wills, if they were found valid, would change the distribution of her assets. Each of the brothers have retained their own legal teams, and the authenticity of the documents is under review by a handwriting expert. Attorneys for <u>Kecalf</u> tracked down one of the banks that issued checks to Franklin, and the bank reportedly confirmed there were instances of uncashed checks since 2012, causing them to be reissued in 2016.

Kecalf's attorneys, Charlene Glover-Hogan and Juanita Gavin Hughes wrote in a recent court motion of their disappointment with the proceedings. "It is totally unacceptable that it has taken a year for the heirs to begin find out what their mother owned on the date of her death," they said. "To date, the heirs still do not know what was owned on Aretha Franklin's date of death."

They also claimed that Kecalf's cousin, Sabrina Owens, who was appointed as the personal representative of the estate, did not distribute an inventory of the estate to the four heirs until six months after it was due by law. According to court papers, the inventory she eventually complied was missing large components, including bank statements, tax bills, appraisals for the value of her homes and blue book values of her cars.

Franklin died of pancreatic cancer in August 2018 in her Detroit apartment at the age of 76. In January, *TMZ* reported that the IRS claimed Franklin owed more than \$6.3 million in back taxes from 2012 to 2018 as well as an additional \$1.5 milling in penalties, although <u>Franklin's estate disputed the claim</u>.







On my way to Movie Night at the Metropolitan Community Church in Detroit, I stumbled onto concrete and landed on my right side. Three days later, I barely made it to the Battle Creek VA. The pain level, on a scale of 0 - 10, was 20. With medication, the pain level dropped to 4. From this experience, I added to my self-care routine: (1) keep my staff handy; (2) exercise; and (3), rest nine to eleven hours per 24 hours, whether awake or asleep.

When you pray, add to your prayer the "5 Ways to Not Be Used." And, for the sake of self-care, "See where you're going and watch where you step," Wisdom words from the late Rev. Dr. 'Pop' Fred Sampson, Tabernacle Missionary Baptist Church, Detroit.

THE REALS OF JUSTICE

Search Warrants Part By: Ayanna D. Neal

A search warrant is an order issued by a magistrate or judge, in the name of the state, directed to a law enforcement officer, commanding him or her to search a person, place or thing, for property or evidence of a crime and to confiscate any evidence related to said crime they find. The Michigan and United States Constitutions protect against unreasonable searches and seizures by not allowing a war-



rant to be issued without probable cause, supported by oath and affirmation. People v. Levine (Brian), 461 Mich 172, 178 (1999) US Const, Am IV; Const 1963 art 1, §11. The Fourth Amendment says, "The right of the people to be secure in their person, houses, papers, and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized."

A magistrate who issues a search warrant has to be "neutral and detached," and must disqualify him or herself if they are associated in any way if they had a pecuniary interest in the outcome, if they're connect with law enforcement, associated with the prosecution of the suspect (s), or if a party is a relative.

A search warrant is also required to describe with particularity the place that is to be searched. Additionally, a warrant permits the search of a place to include the search of containers within that place that might contain the items that are named in the warrant. A search warrant for a residence can also include the yard, or curtilage of the residence as well as any outbuildings including an attached or detached garage. Michigan has a "knock-and-announce" statute that requires that law enforcement executing a search warrant to give notice of their authority "and purpose and be refused entry before forcing their way in." People v. Fetterley, 229 Mich App 511, 521 (1998). If law enforcement seizes any property during the search warrant a copy of the warrant must be given to the person as well as leaving a copy of the tabulation at the place where property was taken. Law enforcement also must file the tabulation with the magistrate or judge.

An affidavit is a statement made under oath for a search warrant that contains facts that describe probable cause to believe that a crime or crimes have been committed and that evidence of the crime (s) will probably be found in the place to be searched. An affidavit for a search warrant is nonpublic information per MCL 780.651(8) except that on the 56th day "following the issuance of a search warrant, the search warrant affidavit contained in any court file or court record retention system is public information unless, before the 56th day after the search warrant is issued, a peace officer or prosecuting attorney, obtains a suppression order from a judge or district court magistrate upon a showing under oath that suppression of the affidavit is necessary to protect an ongoing investigation or the privacy or safety of a victim or witness." MCL 780.651(9)

There are exceptions to the warrant requirement such as exigent or emergency circumstances such as hot pursuit, emergency aid and community caretaking. If there has been a custodial arrest a search of the person arrested doesn't require a warrant or additional requirements. There is an automobile exception to the warrant requirement and that is because automobiles are readily mobile and can travel on public highways. An inventory search is an exception to the warrant requirement but there must be an established reasonable procedure in place and followed by law enforcement. This is often seen for a vehicle inventory search in which a police department has a procedure for all officers to follow, for example, impounding a automobile if the owner or driver of the automobile is arrested. Other exceptions are an investigative or Terry stop, a brief investigative stop of a person if law enforcement has reasonable suspicion that crime is afoot. During such a stop law enforcement can only perform a limited pat down search for weapons if law enforcement has reasonable suspicion that the person is armed. Consent, special needs, Inspections, Border Searches and Regulatory searches are also exceptions to the warrant requirement. Examining the expectation of privacy that a person might have at a place or in an object must be balanced with the level of intrusiveness of a search and any central public interest.

A search warrant can be attacked but there must be specific allegations that there was a reckless disregard for the truth by the affiant, the law enforcement officer who makes the oath before the magistrate or judge, or deliberate falsehood made with an offer of proof. A search warrant can still be determined to be valid even if that standard is met if there is still probable cause after the challenged parts of the affidavit are removed.

Search warrants are a huge part of investigations especially with the daily use of technology. Almost every single day we leave digital imprints of what we're doing, where we are, who we're with and when. Search warrants are an investigative tool that can obtain evidence that can be used in a variety of ways. Evidence issues can be extremely complex. If you or a loved one are facing criminal charges consulting with a qualified criminal defense attorney is critical.
