1967: The Jimi Hendrix Experience's LP Are You Experienced? entered the charts.

1970: Jimi Hendrix takes the stage at a Eric Burdon and War concert at London club Ronnie Scott's, marking the last time the guitarist will ever play in public.

1972:'I'll Be Around' by the Spinners charted eventually reaching number one.

1977: Musiq Soulchild was born. He is a R&B singer and songwriter. He turns 36 today.

1986:Kyla Pratt was born. She is an actress of film and television. She turns 27 today.

1990:Janet Jackson performed at New York's Madison Square Garden. After the show she presented the UNCF with a check for \$450,000.

1992:Dionne Warwick appeared at a fund-raiser for presidential hopeful Bill Clinton at millionaire Ted Field's Beverly Hill Mansion and sang 'Amazing Grace'.

1994: Whitney Houston began the first of seven performances at Radio City Music Hall in New York. All of the shows were sell-outs, grossing more than \$2,500,000.

1995:'Kiss from a Rose' charted eventually reaching number one Pop and winning Record of the Year honors at the Grammy Awards.

2002: A Consecration Ceremony for the Key West African Refugee Cemetery took place.

2003:The Vocal Group Hall of Fame held its 6th annual induction ceremonies. The Whispers, the Commodores, Earth, Wind & Fire, the Five Satins, the Charioteers, the Isley Brothers, the Impressions and Martha and the Vandellas all were inducted.

2004:Izora Armstead of the Weather Girls passed away. She was a singer, songwriter and manager. She was 62 years old. 2007:Louis J. Willie Jr. passed away at age 84. He was a black insurance company executive who helped to defuse a racial dispute surrounding the 1990 PGA Championship by becoming an honorary member at the host course, the all-white Shoal Creek Country Club in suburban Birmingham, even though he was not an avid golfer. Afterward, the PGA and other golf groups said they would no longer hold tournaments at clubs that lacked minorities or women as members.

2007:Ed Smith passed away. He was a Democrat operative who spent his life in a wheelchair (childhood polio) while registering voters and working for civil rights and was a force in North Carolina Democrat politics, working on at least 60 political campaigns. He died of pneumonia at age 56.

2008: Norman Whitfield passed away. He was a Grammy Award winning songwriter and producer who co-wrote a string of Motown classics including "War," "Just My Imagination," and "I Heard It Through the Grapevine." Common Questions about Voter Registration:

First Step in Order to Vote

The first step to voting is that you have to be registered to vote, if you're eligible. In Michigan, you must be registered to vote at least 30 days before an election. The Voter Registration Deadline for the Election is Tuesday, October 9. These election laws that govern deadlines and registration requirements are the same for all communities in Michigan, but I will specifically refer to laws as they apply to the City of Lansing.

Who is eligible to vote? In order to vote in Michigan, you must be (1) a United State

citizen, (2) at least 18 years of age by Election Day (Nov. 6), (3) a resident of the City of Lansing or city or township in which you are applying to register for at least 30 days prior to the election, and (4) not confined in prison after being convicted and sentenced. People convicted of a felony CAN vote after their term of incarceration has ended. Citizens awaiting a trial can still vote, too.

Who Needs to Complete a Voter Registration Form?

After you register to vote for the first time in Michigan, you should only re-register when you move or when you change your name. Re-registration is also necessary if for any reason your registration has been cancelled. Updating your voter registration can be done online at expressSOS.com when you update your driver's license or State ID card.

First Time Voters & Absentee Voting

If you have never voted in Michigan and want to vote absentee, you must show ID and register in person at your county, city, township clerk or a Secretary of State Branch office, instead of mailing the form. This law often impacts college students who want to vote in their home town. It is entirely legal for students to register to vote at their campus address.

Voting & Moving

Voters who have moved WITHIN the City of Lansing can still vote at the polling location where they were registered to vote before they moved. Michigan law has a 60 day requirement to reregister if someone moved between municipalities like moving from Delta Township to the City of Lansing.

For example, if your neighbor has moved into the City of Lansing prior to September 7 (60 days), then they must update their voter registration with their new address. Another scenario is that if a family member has moved in with you after September 9 and did not update their voter registration, then they can still go back to their old precinct and vote one last time. These deadline and requirements can be confusing. Please do not hesitate to call your municipal clerk for clarification for your specific circumstance.

If you are not sure if you are registered or which address you are registered at, you can visit Michigan.gov/vote or call your municipal clerk. City of Lansing residents can call 517-483-4133.
