GROUNDWATER UPDATE

The **Central Texas Groundwater Conservation District (CTGCD)** is holding a second public meeting to evaluate the potential establishment of a groundwater management zone in the Briggs, Oakalla, and NE Burnet

County area for the Trinity aquifer. Five Stakeholder Committee meetings were held between May and July to gain perspectives on the formation of a management zone.

The Stakeholder Committee consisted of local property owners that included goat and cattle ranchers, business owners, an environmental engineer, an RV park developer, a Master Naturalist, a Firefly representative, and a custom home builder. The upcoming public meeting will deliver the Stakeholder Committee recommendations to the public. It is an opportunity to ask questions of the CTGCD and provide feedback. The meeting is open to all residents, stakeholders, and interested parties in the Briggs, Oakalla, Watson, and Joppa areas and other portions of NE Burnet County.

NATURAL GAS LINE

A second natural gas pipeline has received final investment approval for installation through the Briggs Community. It's a 42-inch diameter line that will follow the exact same route in the same ROW as the previous one. It's anticipated to go into service mid-2028.

FULL-TIME AMBULANCE

In the November election, residents of Northeast Burnet County will have an opportunity to decide if they want an emergency ambulance stationed 24/7 right here in our community at the fire station in Briggs. Currently, the closest ambulance to our community is over 20 minutes away in Bertram, and if it's busy, the next closest ambulance is over 26 minutes away in the city of Burnet. These ambulances are part of the Burnet Fire Department and provide exceptional EMS service, but when minutes count, they are just too far away. Someone suffering from a serious heart attack, stroke or trauma will likely not survive.

Prop A proposes the creation of a new Emergency Services District with the objective of enhancing emergency medical services within the community. If Prop A is approved, the resulting funding would enable a contract with Burnet Fire, ensuring an ambulance is stationed in Briggs and others as backup. This dedicated presence aims to significantly improve ambulance response times and support residents in time-critical medical and trauma situations. Funding for the new district would be sourced from a new property tax rate of 10¢ per \$100.00 appraised valuation within the designated service area.

POWER LINES

ONCOR/LCRA proposed installing VERY high-voltage electric lines through the Briggs community. There are three separate proposed routes that come within a few miles of downtown Briggs. Final routing decisions are anticipated in early to mid-2026. An organized group called "Save the Lampasas 25" is working to oppose the G5 segment of the proposed lines. At least 2 other groups of local citizens have started discussions oriented toward opposition to the lines. Next meeting on this issue is at Oakalla Fire Station Thursday, Sept. 25 from 5:00 to 7:00pm.

Commissioner's Corner:

What a year this has been around Precinct 2, with the tornados, flooding, proposed train routes and now the huge proposed 765 kV transmission line. You can find more info and maps regarding the transmission line at www.oncor.com
We just passed the FY2026 County Budget. Some highlights include a decrease in the tax rate from .3541 to .3323, no cost of living raises for elected officials, and a 3% cost of living increase plus a 2% step added to the payscale for employees. This will help us be competitive with other entities in the area, which gives us the ability to attract and retain our good workers.

Since 2019, we have wanted more patrols in the rural parts of the county. We added four new deputy positions to this budget. According to Sheriff Calvin Boyd and Chief Deputy Alan Trevino, this will enable us to have deputies assigned to areas for better response times. More details on what those areas will be are coming soon.

The Briggs Community Center project will continue to be a work in progress for a while longer. We recently hired a firm to draw up detailed engineering plans of the building. These plans, as well as the remodel, are funded with tourism tax dollars that can be used for historical preservation and will not come from your property taxes.

A county-wide burn ban was put in place on Tuesday September 16 at noon. You can track the status of the burn ban on the county website, www.burnetcountytexas.org, for ESD #8 residents you can track on their website nebcfirerescue.org
