Critical Incident Reporting

The Critical Incident Management Process was designed by DDD and implemented to place incident reporting and follow up processes that improve the overall quality of outcomes for participants in HCBS services.

Effective October 1, 2022, DDD published an updated Incident Reporting & GER Guide to assist DD providers with the new Critical Incident Management Process.

DDD defines reportable incidents as any incident, injury, or illness which occurred during the provision of waiver services in the following categories:

- Actual or Potential Airway Obstruction
- Allegation, Suspicion, or Actual Events of Abuse, Neglect, or Exploitation of a Child or a Vulnerable Adult
- Communicable Disease
- Death of a Participant
- Emergency Situations
- Fall with Significant Injury
- Fatal 5
- Incidents Involving Emergency Personnel Requiring Emergent Response
- Infestations
- Injuries of Unknown Origin Raising Suspicion
- Injury Requiring Medical or Nursing Interventions beyond First Aid
- Medication Errors
- Misconduct not Involving Law Enforcement
- Missing Person(s)
- PRN Psychotropic Medication Usage
- Property Damage
- Suicide Attempts
- Swallowing Inedible Items
- Unplanned Hospital/Emergency Room/Urgent Care Visit
- Use of Emergency Safety Interventions
- Use of Restraint or Prohibited Practices
- Vehicle Accident



What was the Protestant Reformation?

At the heart of the Protestant Reformation, which began on October 31, 1517, lay four basic questions: Where does religious authority lie? How is a person saved? What is the church? What is the essence of Christian living?

In answering these questions, Protestant Reformers developed what would be known as the "Five Solas" (sola being the Latin word for "alone"). These five essential points of biblical doctrine clearly separate Protestantism from Roman Catholicism.

- 1 <u>Sola Scriptura</u>, "Scripture Alone." The Bible alone is the sole authority for all matters of faith and practice. Scripture and Scripture alone is the standard by which all teachings and traditions of the church must be measured.
- 2 <u>Sola Gratia</u>, "Salvation by Grace Alone." Salvation is proof of God's undeserved favor; we are rescued from God's wrath by His grace alone, not by any work we do. God's blessing in Christ is the sole efficient cause of salvation. This grace is the supernatural work of the Holy Spirit who brings us to Christ by releasing us from our bondage to sin and raising us from spiritual death to spiritual life.
- 3 <u>Sola Fide</u>, "Salvation by Faith Alone." We are justified by faith in Christ alone, not by the works of the Law. It is by faith in Christ that His righteousness is imputed to us as the only possible satisfaction of God's perfect standard.
- 4 <u>Solus Christus</u>, "In Christ Alone." Salvation is found in Jesus Christ alone; no one and nothing else can save. Jesus' substitutionary death on the cross is sufficient for our justification and reconciliation to God the Father. The gospel has not been preached if Christ's redemption is not declared and if faith in His resurrection is not solicited.
- 5 <u>Soli Deo Gloria</u>, "For the Glory of God Alone." Salvation is of God and has been accomplished by God for His glory alone. As Christians we must magnify Him always and live our lives in His presence, under His authority, and for His glory.



These five important doctrines are the reason for the Protestant Reformation. They are at the heart of the Reformers' call for the church to return to biblical teaching. The Five Solas are just as important today in evaluating a church and its teachings as they were in the sixteenth century.
