NEW ARCHBISHOP OF SOUTHWARK – Many of you will remember the young Fr John Wilson who was assistant to Fr Lister many moons ago. He was the Diocesan administrator before Bishop Stock arrived and served very briefly in St Austin's, Wakefield before being made an auxiliary bishop to Cardinal Nichols in Westminster. Pope Francis has appointed him as Archbishop of Southwark and he will take up the post in July. We are delighted that the Holy Father has appointed him to Southwark and as we offer him our congratulations we know that he has more than enough of the attributes and skills which are necessary for the task in hand. HEALTH & SAFETY

We have recently had a visit from the Diocese Health & Safety Officer. We await his report but there are a couple of issues which we need to bring to parishioner's attention.

- ST JOSEPH'S GALLERY The Diocese Health & Safety Officer identified the risk posed by the low height at the front of the gallery at St Joseph's. We are looking at solutions to make the gallery safer but, in the meantime, please take care when seated in that area and keep children away from the front.
- ST JOSEPH'S PEWS Our pews are 'getting old'. We are making plans to have them repaired but some kneelers are not secured properly to the pew. Kneelers should be put up when not in use. Please take care, particularly in the section of pews at the front on the right-hand side which are particularly unsteady.
- 11.30am Mass we have a group of parishioners to help marshal the procession at Holy Communion. The aisles in St Joseph's are very narrow and can be problematic for people with mobility issues so please cooperate with the marshals to ensure that the procession moves as smoothly as possible.

A word from Your Pastor

Remember, the prime image of the Sacred Heart is the Crucifix that hangs by our altars; this is the complete image of Divine Love. But we also have the image of Jesus alive and dressed in a red cloak, with His Heart exposed at His chest, aflame and surrounded by the crown of thorns. In some images (statue or picture) His Heart is sometimes held in His hand. It was the tradition in many households, especially in Ireland, to display a picture or small statue of the Sacred Heart with a red lamp burning in front of it. When abroad on the continent, you may also come across a street niche sheltering the statue. The devotion was universally spread and accepted through the revelations and specific instructions of Our Lord to Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647–1690), a nun in her convent in the depths of rural France. It may be held that this particular devotion came just at the right moment – France had been devastated by nearly a century of religious and civil wars, and religion at the time is described as being a cold, joyless, formulaic affair. Religious and civil troubles were never far from the people of Ireland. They are not far from us today/

The object of devotion to the Sacred Heart is, properly speaking, the physical Heart of Jesus which is worthy of adoration, because it is part of His sacred humanity, hypostatically united to the Word that existed before time began. ("Hypostatic Union" is a theological term describing the 2 natures of humanity and divinity united in the one person of Jesus.) However, the ultimate object of this devotion is the love of Jesus, the symbol of which is His Heart. Pope Paul VI said: "Beneath the symbolic image of the Heart, we contemplate and venerate our Divine Redeemer's immense charity and generous love" This is the real meaning of the devotion to the Sacred Heart by which the Church asks us to honour the Heart of Jesus as the visible representation of His invisible love. His divine love becomes sensible, comprehensible and tangible to us by means of the manifestations of His human love. It is always the humanity of Jesus which reveals His divinity to us, and just as we know the Son of God through His sacred humanity, so do we know His divine love through the human love of Jesus. Likewise, imitating the Sacred Heart, we make ourselves known as sharers in that divine mystery by our acts of love towards one another, particularly those who make themselves 'hard to love'. We also make ourselves known as 'pilgrims on the way to heaven' by our expressions of religious devotion, particularly our attendance at Mass. Let us pray that our hearts may become more like the Sacred Heart of Jesus, day by day.

"O Jesus, a soldier opened your side with his lance,

so that, through the gaping wound,

we might know the charity of your Heart, which loved us unto death,

and that we might enter into your unutterable love through the same channel by which it came to us. Approach, then, O my soul, the Heart of Christ,

that magnanimous Heart, that hidden Heart, that Heart which thinks of all things and knows all things; that loving Heart, all on fire with love.

Make me understand, O Lord, that the door of your Heart was forced open by the vehemence of your love. Allow me to enter into the secret of that love which was hidden from all eternity, but is now revealed by the wound in your Heart"
