

CREEPING TO THE CRIB – having spent Advent 'Creeping to the Crib', we now pick up another custom. Now the Crib has been blessed, you are welcome/encouraged to take home a couple of pieces of straw that can be stuck together to form a cross. We do this in much the same way as we take home palms on Palm Sunday. As with the palms, bring the straw back in the run-up to Lent and it will be burnt and made into the ashes for use on Ash Wednesday. Remember, because the Crib straw has been blessed it can't just be chucked in the bin!

ST JOSEPH'S SCHOOL PONTEFRACT - Parents whose children will be 5 years of age between September 1st 2019 and August 31st 2020 and wish their child to be considered for a place at St Joseph's school Pontefract, are asked to obtain an application form from the school office (entrance off Love Lane). The completed form and any relevant documents should be returned to school by15th January 2019. Please note failure to provide any necessary additional documents (including baptismal certificates for Catholic applications) by the closing date will delay the correct categorisation of the application.

ST. JOSEPH'S NURSERY PONTEFRACT - Places are still available for the autumn term for any child who was 3 years old by 31st August 2018. Please call in or contact school (01977 701493) for more details. Applications, for an April start, are now also being

taken for children who will be aged three years by March 31st 2019. Parents are asked to obtain an application form from the school office (entrance off Love Lane). The completed form and any relevant documentation should be returned to school by 3.00pm Friday 18th January 2019. Please note failure to provide any necessary additional documents by the closing date will delay the correct categorisation of the application.

It should be noted that an offer of a place in the nursery does not guarantee a place in school, for which a separate application must be made.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION ST ANNE'S CATHEDRAL TUESDAY 5TH FEBRUARY 2019 —The Confirmation liturgy will commence at 7pm on Tuesday 5th February. It will be the responsibility of individual families to make their way to the Cathedral of St Anne on Great George Street in Leeds. Please allow plenty of time to get there (during rush hour) and to park. You need to be seated in the Cathedral no later than 6.45pm.

CONFIRMATION INFORMATION — When candidates sign their name on the register this weekend, they will be given a small piece of card which should be filled out and handed back to Fr Simon at the Confirmation rehearsal (see item below). This should include the name of the Sponsor. This person MUST be a

practising Catholic over the age of 16. It cannot be parents. Also, if you haven't already, candidates need to choose a Confirmation name (which must be the name of a saint which they have researched – the Bishop has a habit of asking questions!!). This too goes on the card. These cards will be used during the ceremony in February.

CONFIRMATION CLASSES FOR CHILDREN IN NON-CATHOLIC SCHOOLS OR YR7 AND ABOVE – Most of the children will be learning what they need to know as part of the Catholic school curriculum in Yr6. For those children not in either of our primary schools, or who have moved up to St Wilfrid's, there are 2 sessions which you must attend. They will be held in St Michael's hall on Saturday 12th and 19th January for 45 minutes commencing at 4pm.

CONFIRMATION REHEARSAL — Obviously, we are not able to rehearse in the Cathedral, so we will have a mini-rehearsal in St Joseph's church at 4pm on Saturday 2^{nd} February in which Fr Simon will pretend to be a Bishop! At least one parent needs to attend this rehearsal so that Fr Simon can brief parents about arrangements for Tuesday 5^{th} February in the Cathedral.

FIRST CONFESSION/FIRST HOLY COMMUNION – The new sessions start at the end of this month. There will be a parents' meeting for both courses on Thursday 17th January at 7pm in St Joseph's church. Please bring along completed forms (for First Confession) and completed Safeguarding forms (for First Holy Communion).

A Word From Your Pastor

This weekend we celebrate the arrival of the Wise Men to the Crib. I think Fr Bernard has a joke about this, but check that it's the one suitable for young ears before you ask him!! Anyway, they present their gifts as we know, but perhaps we could look at two of the many gifts that are presented in this scene for us, namely Mary and Joseph. I came across this lovely reflection from St Josemaria Escriva which I shall share with you concerning these two pivotal figures in our spiritual lives.

"Going into the house they saw the child with Mary, his Mother." Our Lady is always by her Son. The Magi are not received by a king on a high throne, but by a child in the arms of his Mother. Let us ask the Mother of God, who is our Mother (and we celebrated the Feast of her Motherhood on 1st January), to prepare for us the way that leads to the fullness of love. Cor Mariae dulcissimum, iter para tutum: "Most Sweet Heart of Mary, prepare a safe way!" Her sweet heart knows the surest path for finding Christ.

The three kings had their star. We have Mary, Star of the Sea, Star of the East. We say to her today: Holy Mary, Star of the Sea, Morning Star, help your children. Our zeal for souls must know no frontiers, for no one is excluded from Christ's love. The three kings were the first among the gentiles to be called. But once the redemption had been accomplished, "there is neither male nor female" — there is no discrimination of any type — "for you are all one in Christ Jesus."

We Christians cannot exclude anyone; we cannot segregate or classify souls. "Many will come from the East and West." All find a place in Christ's heart. His arms, as we admire him again in the manger, are those of a child; but they are the same arms that will be extended on the cross drawing all people to himself.

And a last thought for that just man, our father and protector St Joseph, who apparently has a very minor role in the Epiphany — as usual. I can imagine him recollected in prayer, lovingly protecting the Son of God made man who has been entrusted to his paternal care. With the marvelous refinement of one who does not live for himself, the holy patriarch spends himself in silent prayer and effective service.

We (are called to practice) a life of prayer and concern for apostolate. Who could be a better teacher for us than St Joseph? If you want my advice, which I have never tired of repeating these many years, *Ite ad Ioseph*: "Go to Joseph." He will show us definite ways, both human and divine, to approach Jesus. And soon you will dare, as he did, "to take up in his arms, kiss, clothe and look after" this child God who has been born unto us. As an homage of their veneration, the Magi offered gold, frankincense and myrrh to Jesus. Joseph gave his whole youthful and loving heart." *Fr. Simon*
