HEALTH & SAFETY

We have recently had a visit from the Diocese Health & Safety Officer. We await his report but there are a couple of issues which we need to bring to parishioner's attention.

- ST JOSEPH'S GALLERY The Diocese Health & Safety Officer identified the risk posed by the low height at the front of the gallery at St Joseph's. We are looking at solutions to make the gallery safer but, in the meantime, please take care when seated in that area and keep children away from the front.
- ST JOSEPH'S PEWS Our pews are 'getting old'. We are making plans to have them repaired but some kneelers are not secured properly to the pew. Kneelers should be put up when not in use. Please take care, particularly in the section of pews at the front on the right-hand side which are particularly unsteady.
- 11.30am Mass we have a group of parishioners to help marshal the procession at Holy Communion. The aisles in St Joseph's are very narrow and can be problematic for people with mobility issues so please cooperate with the marshals to ensure that the procession moves as smoothly as possible.

A word from Your Pastor

During the last week we celebrated the feasts of three martyrs for the Faith from this country. Clearly from 'another time' some Catholics may suggest that they are 'of their day' and as such have little to say to us today other than the importance of being faithful to Christ and His Church. That's a catch-all phrase for martyrs of every age and it's also a good way of consigning them to that realm that is 'out of sight, out of mind' and utterly useless.

On Thursday, we celebrated the feast of the first known martyr in this country, St Alban. He was beheaded by the Romans in the town that now bears his name around 287AD. He had disguised himself as a priest who was on the run from the Romans (they saw this new religion and its priests as a major threat to their 'gods') and, caught in the priest's place, he took the punishment due to a priest. As is often the case, the locals recognized both the stunning witness of the man *and* the power of a sacramental priesthood that was clearly worth such a sacrifice, and so kept his memory alive until such time as a shrine could be erected. To this day, there are priests and people around the world risking their lives to bring the sacraments to God's children. Alban's martyrdom reminds us of the importance of the sacraments in our lives and it's one of the reasons why it gets my goat when modern Catholics don't take this seriously or even think it matters. O, for another St Alban today!

Yesterday, we celebrated the joint feast of St John Fisher and St Thomas More. Put to death by another deluded powerhouse, Thomas More teaches us of the necessity of being loyal to our conscience, no matter how impressive the force that stands against us. It is a modern affectation to write off his witness because of the ample evidence that he approved of the burning of heretics. To our modern sensibilities, this is barbaric and, in the light of the Gospel, there is no excuse for it. At the time, More's conscience was so formed that it 'allowed' him to permit this (despite evidence of his reluctance). On the other hand, that same conscience was so formed that he gave himself up to death when he knew his King to be committing a grave sin on behalf of the whole realm. Saints aren't perfect; neither are our politicians (despite the faux moralizing of the media that insists that they must have no past sins and be squeaky clean in a way that neither the media nor the public are). However, our politicians can learn from Thomas More to speak the Truth (capital 'T'), no matter what the cost to self. O, for another Thomas More today!

John Fisher was the only bishop that did not capitulate before the civil authorities of his day; every other bishop sold his soul (and their Church communities) to keep things cosy for themselves. For Fisher, it was more important than life itself that the very nature of the Church and Her sacraments remained inviolate (especially the Priesthood and the Mass). We could do with a bishop like him today: a prophet that refuses to collude with the 'Empire', no matter how seemingly 'kind' the Empire appears to be with regards the Church. Sadly, many of our bishops are trapped into the ways of the Empire in this country since their predecessors signed us up to the Education Act in 1945 (for attractive reasons at the time). As a result many good Heads and teachers are badly directed or restricted as to what they can say and do in their classroom and this is only going to get worse. If you sell out to Empire you are obliged to keep said Empire 'sweet' if it want to keep the 'perks'. O, for another John Fisher today!

Wait! We **do** have another Alban, More and Fisher today. Potentially, they're you and me, primed and ready to act by the virtue of the sacraments that we have received. On this feast of Corpus Christi, which was so central to the Faith-in-action of these Christians of the past and many Christians of today, let us ask these holy martyrs to pray for us that we may develop a deep trust in the power of Christ working through the sacraments, so that when we are called to act in the name of Christ — and we will be - we may do so without hesitation. O, holy martyrs of England, pray for us. **Fr Simon**
