ST JOSEPH'S CHURCH – On Monday and Tuesday this coming week we are having a building inspection. The church will be open as usual but some disruption may occur during each day.

WEDNESDAY EXPOSITION – There will be no Exposition or Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament this coming Wednesday.

A word from Your Pastor

Today we celebrate the Feast of St Peter and St Paul (transferred from yesterday). Many of you will have grown up with the image of St Peter as the person you're going to meet when you get to the 'pearly gates' of heaven. You can always tell you're looking at a picture or statue of St Peter as he's holding a set of keys, referring to the moment when Jesus gave him the keys to the Kingdom of Heaven, against which the gates of heaven can never prevail.

With that in mind, here's a story I rediscovered this week as I started to chuck stuff out and begin packing. You may have heard it before; humour me.

A man and his dog were waling along a road lit with beautiful sunlight. He was enjoying the scenery when suddenly it occurred to him that he was dead.
