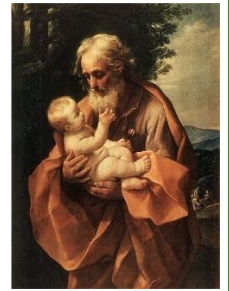

### **Spiritual Communion**

There are times when people are unable to receive the Body and Blood of Christ, through illness or due to their personal disposition. A deep spiritual communion is possible even when we do not share together the Sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ.
