VOLUNTEERS ARE ALWAYS WELCOME TO ENSURE WE CAN CONTINUE WITH MASSES AT OUR CHURCHES.

Under current regulations we are obliged to ensure that at least 2 Stewards are on duty whenever our churches are open. With Tuesday Mass now available and Sunday Masses being introduced next week the burden on our great team of Volunteers grows. If you can help to provide this important service to our parish, then please let us know the days/times you would be available and whether you can be available at St Joseph's, St Michael's or both churches by emailing the Parish office at:

There is some formal paperwork we will need to go through with you before you can officially 'sign up' but we will respond to your email with those details.

ST JOSEPH'S CHURCH

In the middle of 2019, we engaged an Architect to do a "Quinqennial Survey" of St Joseph's Church and Presbytery. The results of that survey highlighted a number of areas that required attention with the guttering and down pipes around the building and retaining wall on Crab Hill high on the priority list along with the introduction of an Accessible Toilet. Tenders were invited to establish the costs and to support submissions through the approval process required due to the Church's Grade 2* Listed Building Status. But, with the onset of the pandemic, progress was not quite at the pace of normal times. However, with the support of the Finance and Property Departments of the Diocesan Curia, we are now reaching the final stages of the approval process for this initial phase of the works.

With the help of the teams at Hinsley Hall, a number of options are being looked at to seek grants to help with the cost of the works. This initiative is beginning to prove successful and we are very grateful indeed for a significant grant of £35,660 which has been awarded by Historic England via the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales. A further grant of £3,500 has also been secured from the Allchurches Trust and we are continuing to look at other possible sources of funding.

These grants will make a significant contribution to the overall cost of completing the work recommended by the Architects which will ensure the preservation of our Church.



CAFOD – HARVEST APPEAL 2020

GUIDELINES FOR VISITING OUR CHURCHES.

Everyone coming to church, whether for Mass, or other Sacraments must wear a face covering unless they are children under the age of 11 or exempt from doing so for medical reasons. Please ensure that you have a face-covering/mask with you and put it on before entering church. You should also socially distance from people outside your household whilst inside the Church building.

There will be Stewards present in church during the time it is open who will help and guide visitors. Please follow any advice and guidance they give.

There will be no Toilet facilities available at either church.

You are asked to leave Church promptly at the end of Mass under the guidance of the Stewards.

Alcohol Hand Gel will be available and must be used to sanitise hands on entry and exit.

ST JOSEPH'S

Entrance and Exit is by the door at the end of the footbridge next to the school.

Seating is identified by a label with a Letter and Number (e.g. A1). Each Bench where 2 seats are marked can accommodate 2 Individuals from different Households 1 metre apart, or a group of Adults and Children from the same Household. Benches with only 1 seat marked can only be occupied by 1 Individual.

The 1M+ rule will apply with the requirement to wear Face Coverings, subject to the official exceptions.

The Benches, or parts of them which are not to be used will have "DO NOT SIT HERE" signs on them.

Communion will be brought by the Priest to each bench.

You are to stay in your seat at the end of Mass until a Steward advises that you can leave the church.

All the current requirements including the wearing of Face Coverings and use of Hand Cleansing on entry and exit will remain in place.

At times when our school is open, please take care when approaching church and ensure social distancing requirements are maintained.

There will be no Toilet facilities available.

ST MICHAEL'S

Entrance and Exit is through the main doors at the front.

The benches are separated at 2 metres, but the seating is labelled at 1M. The 1M+ rule will therefore apply with the requirement to wear Face Coverings, subject to the official exceptions.

Visitors are asked to follow the guidance of the Stewards when going to their seat.

Communion will be brought to everyone in their place.

Visitors are to remain in their seat at the end of Mass until a Steward advises that they can leave church.

Toilets are not to be used.
