Archbishop Roche to head liturgy congregation

Pope Francis has appointed the former Bishop of Leeds to lead the Holy See's department for liturgy, making him the top-ranked English priest in the Curia and is likely to see him named a Cardinal.

Before moving to Rome, Archbishop Roche was Bishop of Leeds from 2004-2012 and served as General Secretary of the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales from 1996-2001. He was ordained as a priest for the Diocese of Leeds in 1975. (Extract from "The Tablet")

- **Choirs** When we are able to sing again at Mass, let us raise the Roof of our Churches, and maybe even consider joining the Choirs.
- **Exposition** Exposition before weekday Masses will also resume as well as devotional Prayers before Mass, as the Post Mass prayers have continued.

GUIDELINES FOR VISITING OUR CHURCHES.

ST JOSEPH'S - Entrance and Exit is by the door at the end of the footbridge next to the school.

ST MICHAEL'S - Entrance and Exit is through the main doors at the front.

When arriving and leaving Church please adhere to **Social Distancing Rules** and "Keep 2 metres apart from others". If you have to queue to get in or out, then please ensure that you keep 2 metres apart from whoever is in front of you. Also please maintain your distance when following someone who may not be able to walk quite as fast as you.

Everyone coming to church must wear a face covering unless they are children under the age of 11 or exempt from doing so for medical reasons. Please ensure that you have a face-covering/mask with you and put it on before entering church.


Alcohol Hand Gel will be available and must be used to sanitise hands on entry and exit.
