

# Rules and Principles

Rules focus on actions: Principles deal with motives. Rules make decisions for you: Principles make you think for yourself. Rules are rigid; Principles are flexible. Rules refer to the "what;" Principles tell of the "why." Rules work in limited contexts; Principles are universal. Rules set minimum behavior; Principles give you a way of life. Rules focus on control; Principles highlight character. Rules ultimately produce hypocrisy; Principles encourage consistency. Rules ultimately create dependency; Principles develop trust. Rules perpetuate immaturity; Principles develop maturity. Rules bring bondage; Principles bring liberty.

It is necessary to have rules to protect the immature. While establishing reasonable rules for children, let us be teaching them principles so they can grow beyond our temporary control. Laws can only "baby sit" until the child matures and becomes a person of faith, accepting the responsibility for their own conduct (Galatians 3:23-4:7). Mature people can only develop their full potential living by principles.

God's ultimate intention is for mature sons and daughters!

Therefore teach principles!
