New this year - FallamaFest is the location for the ALSA 2025 Rocky Mountain Regional Show!

ALSA Regional Show Information

- The Regional Show is ALSA only and is completely optional. Exhibitors can participate in FallamaFest, or both the Regional Show and FallamaFest.
- The Regional Show is separate from FallamaFest, but will run concurrently
- The Regional Show requires a separate entry form, however, payment can be combined with your FallamaFest payment.
- See the 23rd Edition of the ALSA Handbook for additional information.
- Double ALSA points will be awarded for placings earning points.
- All Grands and Reserves count towards the animal awards, regardless of class numbers
- All Youth points are double for the yearly Youth Top Ten awards.

ILR/ALSA and Class Information

- This is an ILR-SD and ALSA Sanctioned Show
- Double Points Halter Show!
- Sanctioned classes will follow the 23rd Edition of the ALSA Handbook, with the exception of the rules governing youth showing intact males, which will follow ILR, since it is more restrictive.
- Youth age: Youth age is determined as of 1/1/2025. Sub-Junior is under 7 years old, Junior is 7-11 years old, Intermediate is 12-14 years old, Senior is 15-19 years old.
- Junior Youth may not show an intact male that is 18 months or older (per ILR-SD rules).
- All llamas and alpacas participating in sanctioned classes must be registered with the ILR to be shown. Name must match the registration certificate. No pending ILR registrations.
- Please provide a copy of the ILR registration and ALSA registration with entry form.
- All llamas and alpacas must be at least 5 months old to be shown.
- All llamas and alpacas must be checked in before the show starts on Saturday at 8am and must stay for the entire show.
- Nursing Ilama and alpaca mothers may not be accompanied in the show ring with their crias.

- Exhibitors must be the registered owner of the llama, or a signed Permission to Show Form must be received
- ILR Registered alpacas may show in the ILR-SD Performance classes. Alpacas not registered with the ILR may compete in the Open Alpaca classes.
- Class numbers ending in 'N' are non-sanctioned classes.
- **Returning again this year** Dancing with the FallamaStars is a free, fun class open to anyone! Bring your llama or alpaca and join us for a musical, fun class, and prepare to laugh!
- New this year FallamaFest Quest for Adults! Complete the tasks in the Quest for points and prizes. Quest tasks will be handed out on each day for completion by the end of the day.
- To participate in the Argentine Championship classes, the llama must be at least 50% Argentine.
- Classes may be combined, at the discretion of show management or judges.
- Once the show starts, llamas may not be moved from one class to another, except at the discretion of the judges.
- The show will be double halter for both ILR and ALSA, so double fees will apply for both show associations (see registration sheet).
- Performance Package (non-youth), includes PR/Pack/Obstacle
- The Complete Package (non-youth) includes Halter/Performance/Showmanship/Fleece
- Produce of Dam, Get of Sire, Argentine Championship, and Open Llama/Alpaca classes are not included in any package.
- For the Youth or Adult Special Needs Obstacle classes, the exhibitor may be assisted on the course, but the animal may not be assisted by anyone other than the exhibitor. Special needs is defined by the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).
- There will be four Best In Show awards One Best In Show Male and Female per judge.
- Llamas and alpacas coming into Colorado from another state need to have a CVI (Certificate of Veterinarian Inspection) issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days of entry to the state, and treated for scabies with an Ivermectin-like product within 21 days prior to entry to the state.
- Entries due by 9/12/2025, with a late fee of \$25 for entries after that date. No entries accepted after 9/22/2025.

Youth Information

- **Returning again this year for Youth!** FallamaFest Quest! Complete the tasks in the Quest for points and prizes. Quest tasks will be handed out on each day for completion by the end of the day.
- Returning again this year for Youth! Youth All Around Champion! The All Around Champion will be awarded to the top youth from Showmanship/Performance/Youth Judging/FallamaFest Quest.
- **Discounted clinic prices for Youth!** (see registration sheet)
- Youth package includes Performance/Showmanship/Youth Judging/FallamaFest Quest
- Use of a llama/alpaca by more than one youth is strongly discouraged. It may be allowed, at the discretion of the Show Superintendent, as long as the animal is shared by no more than two youth and those youth are not competing in the same age division.
- Youth may show in either Youth Performance or Novice, Advanced, or Masters, but not in both unless a different llama is used.

Facility Information

- The show will be using the Indoor Arena and Large Animal Barn.
- Stalls can be used for tack or animals. Bring your own bedding. Stalls are 10'x10' with rubber mats.

- Wash racks are available onsite. All wash racks are located outside, and have cold water only.
- Power and water are available in the stall area, you may need extension cords for power.
- Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning out their stalls at the end of the show, and participants must receive stall clean-out approval from Show Management before leaving the show
- Displays in front of your stalls are encouraged bring your own tables, etc.
- Pet Policy Please keep all pets on a leash and clean up after your pets.
- No sale of animals or other goods permitted on grounds, unless prior approval is received from show management. Promotion of your animals is encouraged.

General Show Information

- Camping is available at the Fairgrounds, Friday through Sunday (must leave by Sunday, end of day). Each spot is 30Amp electric and water nearby. Spots must be reserved and paid for in advance through the registration form. Fee includes 2 nights (Friday/Saturday). There are also several hotels nearby.
- We'll have food trucks at the event, and there are several restaurants close by.
- We'll have one clinic this year, on Friday, Sep 26, 2025.
- We'll be having a free pizza party on Friday. Please sign up on the registration form so that we can be sure to have enough pizza for everyone! Bring your own drinks for the pizza party.

- For the public participation event on Saturday, please bring an animal to share with the public. We want to share our love of these animals with the public! We'll also have a small obstacle course set up.
