With around 2,000 professional and amateur productions world-wide, Peter is one of the UK's most popular playwrights. To date, he has written thirteen comedies, a psychological thriller and a one act comedy. Eleven of these have been published and are available for performance through the play catalogue of Josef Weinberger Plays.

The 'Inspector Pratt' trilogy - spoofs of the Agatha Christie genre of whodunnits - have been described as "deliciously wicked" and "hilarious and very clever". Collectively, 'Murdered to Death', 'Secondary Cause of Death' and 'Death by Fatal Murder' have had over 1,300 professional and amateur tours/productions in the UK and overseas.

THE EASTON GARDEN PLAYERS

Easton Garden Players (formerly the Southwood Players) was established in 2009 and born out of a desire to raise funds for local charities, specifically the local MS Society and the Itchen Valley Churches.

Now Lavinia has hung up her coat and the venue has moved from Southwood to Wincroft, the company believes it's time for change and we're delighted to introduce ourselves as the Easton Garden Players in 2025.

Naomi Ellis - *Mildred*. Naomi has had small roles with the Southwood Players previously, often involving sherry, and men that wouldn't do what she wanted! So when the part of Mildred came up, Naomi was the natural choice. She's honoured to be joining the Easton Garden Players after a few gap years.

Maddy Woosnam - *Dorothy*. After a run as certifiable Susannah in Bedroom Farce last year, Maddy is thrilled to have been given the challenge of playing dowdy, downtrodden and 'rather plain' Dorothy. But is there more to Dorothy than her fashion sense suggests?

Hilary Castle - *Bunting*. This is Hilary's first involvement with the Easton Garden Players. His extensive experience in theatres and studios from Drury Lane to Hollywood has rarely included acting. Catherine Kennedy - Elizabeth Hartley-Trumpington. Catherine is delighted to be returning for her second garden appearance, playing the sharp-tongued Elizabeth - but what secrets are hiding behind the cruel wit and 'enormous assets'?

Iain Macleod - *Pierre Marceau*. Iain is enchanté to be swapping his scalpel for a paintbrush and feels right at home as dashing Frenchman Pierre who likes to always be 'in the company of beautiful women.' See if you can spot which part of France his accent comes from...
