


## News from the House

Change is inevitable, operating at a loss cannot continue long term. I am happy to state that this year thus far the loss has been trimmed over 60 percent over the past few years, but it is not enough. The Board of Directors expect accountability for the Lodge's resources.

We are an Elks Lodge, not a restaurant and not a country club. The kitchen struggles with consistency and time. No one wants to wait an hour for food or receive a meal that is prepared poorly. Therefore, effective January each Friday there will be dinner special that will be the main offering. A limited pub menu will also be available on Friday nights. This pub menu will be a trimmed down version of the current menu. Other times when the kitchen is open, we will be offering the new pub menu.

What we hope is that by limiting offerings, the kitchen can keep up with the orders and prepare food consistently and in a timely fashion. Our food costs will be lowered, payroll lowered, and consistency improved.

Change is hard, no one wants their favorite item removed, but we must push forward and take the necessary steps to preserve our Lodge for all the good we do in our community.
