## Exciting Updates and Growth – Your Participation Matters!

As the lodge year wraps up and we move into the next, we are excited to share key updates that not only have helped strengthen our lodge's financial health but also created more opportunities for everyone to enjoy and participate! We need your participation to make the lodge exceptional.

One of the biggest changes over the past two years was upgrading our payment processing system to Square. This step helped lower credit card fees and overall costs, and streamline transactions to offset some of the rising costs while also making it easier and more efficient. We established a contract with a new linen service and a few other service providers (e.g. snow removal) to ensure quality service while reducing overall contract costs. The change to Square and the linens are saving several thousand dollars a year alone.

Another win was renegotiating our nearly 30-year-old billboard contract to increase revenue potential by over 300%! The move focused on minimizing the lodge's obligations while increasing the much-needed revenue to support the lodge, our community activities, and ongoing facility maintenance and improvements. The lodge will now be paid a fair market rate for rental of our grounds that house the billboard. Look for the new billboard on 140 in the coming months, and know that each time it displays an ad, we are making more money than we have in years. A big nod to James Jaderborg for negotiating the option for the lodge to run ads for free in any unsold slots, which will help to promote our lodge and events.

The lodge needs a lot of love these days, and we are not talking about just the "small stuff." Our aging lodge needs some bigger repairs, including roof repairs, heating system replacements, cooling system upgrades, refrigeration updates for our kitchen walkins and freezers and more. These are large items and they are critical to our lodge operations, and sooner or later, they will have to be addressed. These are critical investments to ensure our Lodge remains a comfortable and thriving place for you and future generations. We need every member's support to keep us moving forward.

Our lodge is one of the best in the district, and not just by the size or the amount we give to ENF, but by active and committed members supporting lodge and community activities. As Brendan mentioned it's a challenging time for the lodge financially. The Board and many members are working hard to overcome those challenges. Our expenses simply outpace our revenue, and that can't continue.

#### Some of the ways you can help are:

- 1. Visit the Lodge! Come up at least once a week and join your fellow members for a beverage, a snack and some laughs. Tuesday Bingo is a blast, half price wine Wednesdays draw a great crowd, Thursday evenings are packed and you can't go wrong on Friday and Saturday!
- 2. Attend Events! If you see an event coming up, join in! The more involved our members, the more enjoyable they are and the more successful they are.
- 3. **Bring a Friend!** We each have many friends that we enjoy spending time. Bring them to the lodge and offer an application. That way, next time you want to have a cigar night or book club meeting, your friends can join you at our amazing lodge facility!
- 4. **Volunteer Your Time!** This doesn't mean you have to serve on the Board or something more active (though, the lodge needs new leaders and ideas, always). Even volunteering an hour or two to help with something you enjoy makes a difference. Do you like to paint? Help the team freshening up the foyer. Are you a tech person? Help the group that works on the lodge computers. Love to talk to others? Help the outreach group contact our members. Every effort makes a difference.

### Grant Committee Report Lodge Year

April 1, 2024 - March 31, 2025

Our Lodge had a successful year supporting the local community by disseminating \$12,000 in grants to several organizations.

- Beacon Grant (\$4,000) supported Live, Hope, Laugh and our annual Christmas Town Event.
- Gratitude Grant (\$4,000) supported the Westminster Rescue Mission to purchase an electric pallet jack that will allow staff to move more food with less human effort and increase safety.
- Spotlight Grant (\$2,000) for Carroll County Veteran's Independence Project (CCVIP). We sponsored a veteran's family of six by shopping and wrapping gifts for each member and purchased essential need items for the CCVIP closet, which will support the local veteran community.
- First State Grant (\$1,000) supported local veterans by purchasing 59 wreaths that were laid on graves during Wreaths Across America, which is a nationwide, coordinated wreath-laying ceremony.
- Second State Grant (\$1,000) supported the Westminster YMCA Fresh Mart food pantry by shopping and delivering the items to the YMCA.

The Lodge's grants are received in part as a result of the donations our members make to The Elks National Foundation (ENF). Please consider a donation to ENF so we can continue to see these funds returned to the lodge and support our local community.
