For the 3rd time since I have been handling the MVS Scholarship applications, our Lodge has been fortunate to have another student reach the Elks National Foundation level. This year, Madeline Gassman received a \$4,000 award from the Elks National Foundation and will receive \$1,000 for the next 4 years. There were 14 recipients from the State of Maryland to receive this scholarship award.

Each year, I submit six applications to the District for further viewing. The District receives applications from other Lodges and submits their choices to the State. The State reviews and rates all of the applications received from the other Districts and then submits their choices to the Elks National Foundation for final viewing. It is a very competitive process and difficult to reach the final level. The Elks National Foundation awards 500 four-year scholarships to the highest-rated applicants in each year's competition. These awards range from \$1,000 per year to \$7,500 per year.

Secretary's Notes


