

Two-Day Niagara Wine Tour

A slow, elevated journey through vineyards, escarpment wineries, and iconic estates

This 2-day itinerary is designed for balance — blending boutique charm, signature Niagara experiences, and relaxed pacing across two distinct days.

STOP 1 — 13th Street Winery (Late Morning Start)

The journey begins in a relaxed, creative pocket of Niagara.

13th Street Winery blends wine, art, and food into a single countryside experience. Sculptures are scattered across the property, the bakery draws a steady local crowd, and the tasting room feels casual and expressive. It's a welcoming introduction to the region — less formal, more exploratory.

Try: Gamay or sparkling wine

Don't miss: The bakery stop (butter tarts are a local favourite)

Why start here: Light, creative, and easygoing — perfect opening pace

STOP 2 — Trius Winery (Early Afternoon)

From creative countryside to structured winemaking excellence.

Trius is one of Canada's most awarded wineries, known for its underground cellar and refined sparkling wines. Tastings here are guided and intentional, highlighting technique, aging, and precision. The architecture and cellar spaces give the experience a more immersive, crafted feel.

Try: Trius Brut or Pinot Noir

Why here: A benchmark Niagara estate showcasing world-class winemaking

STOP 3 — Peller Estates Winery (Late Afternoon / Evening)

The signature experience of the day.

Peller Estates is immersive, theatrical, and deeply tied to Niagara's identity. Guests move through curated tasting rooms and underground cellars, culminating in the iconic 10Below Icewine lounge — a sub-zero tasting environment unlike anything else in the region.

As evening approaches, the experience slows into something atmospheric and memorable.

Try: Icewine flight (essential Niagara experience)

Optional: Patio glass or tasting pairing experience

Why end here: Niagara's most iconic and immersive wine experience

DAY 2 — Escarpment Views & Refined Estate Wines

Scenic vineyards → elegant estates → relaxed closing stop

STOP 1 — Featherstone Estate Winery (Late Morning Start)

Day 2 begins with calm, open vineyard energy along the escarpment.

Featherstone is quiet, grounded, and focused on cool-climate wines that reflect the land itself. Tastings are unhurried and personal, with a strong sense of place. It's a reset after the more immersive experiences of Day 1.

Try: Riesling or Cabernet Franc

Why start here: A clean, scenic re-entry into wine country at a slower pace

STOP 2 — Two Sisters Vineyards (Early Afternoon)

The route shifts into elegance and structure.

Two Sisters is one of Niagara's most refined estates, blending Old World architecture with modern winemaking. The vineyard stretches toward a restaurant terrace where tastings naturally transition into food and extended dining. Everything here feels intentional and composed.

Try: Cabernet Franc or reserve red blends

Optional: Lunch at Kitchen76

Why here: A polished, food-forward estate experience

STOP 3 — Jackson-Triggs Niagara Estate (Sunset Finish)

The final stop is relaxed, open, and scenic.

Jackson-Triggs offers wide vineyard views, seasonal events, and a casual tasting atmosphere. The amphitheatre and outdoor spaces make it an easy place to slow down and end the journey without structure or rush.

This is your wind-down moment — glass in hand, overlooking the vineyards.

Try: A late-day red or sparkling wine

Why end here: A relaxed, scenic conclusion to two days of wine country
