

Tile *for a customized look* tips



For our powder room, I wanted some drama with a bold wall covering, but didn't want our wall-mounted faucets installed directly into wallpaper. I love the Bedrosians Makoto 2" penny line, and chose to go without trim here. It creates a scalloped edge that feels playful and fancy at the same time!

You could also use this tile on shower walls with the same detailing going vertically where tile meets sheetrock.

For our son's bathroom, I wanted a lighthearted, masculine tile. The Bedrosians Cloe in black was the solution, and we chose to "soldier stack" it. Not only does this help the entire space feel more grand, the high contrast between the tile and grout enhances the drama!

This tile style could be used in a niche, kitchen backsplash, really anywhere you want a touch of that custom vibe.

I've got a 2-in-1 tip here for you! Use the same tile for a niche, but a smaller version! You see that our shower wall is 4"x4" zellige, and the niche is 2"x2". Yes, I could have used 4"x4" for it all, but I wanted a little something different, more texture, more drama, and didn't want to take away from the gorgeous Battled Armor color.

Also, no tile trim here, either – everything is sharply mitered, and your tile guy must be EXCELLENT to request this of him, especially with zellige.

This may be an unpopular opinion, but I LOVE using schluter edges in place of trim! It brings the modern in to these spaces. Both examples here show schluter as the transition piece between tile and wallpaper. We used black strips on the right, and white for the bottom. This can also be used vertically!
