Message from

Pastor Tony

I became a *Mumford & Sons* fan about a decade ago, so when I saw their newest album *Delta* (released in 2018), it immediately made it into my playlist. The album is quite a departure from their normal sound, and quite a few critics, and fans, have raked them over the coals for the, seemingly, abrupt change of sound. While different, the songs have a rawness to them that can't be ignored. The band is singing from their pain, their struggles, their hardships, from their life; the album is a musical journey. Listeners are drawn into this journey from the very first song, 42. It starts out with beautifully mixed acapella harmony, "*Where do I turn to when there's no choice to make?*" While the song speaks of a relationship broken by drugs, that opening line has been running through my head these last few weeks as I've been thinking and praying about life, present circumstances of the world, and our church.

Where do I turn to when there's no choice to make? Obviously, when I feel stuck, pressured, lost, confused, or uncertain I turn to God. I also, turn to others. I turn to my family, my friends, colleagues, mentors, and the community of faith. I turn to you because we're in this together. Not just as humans sharing the same space and time, but as Christians and as people committed to the same intentional community of faith (Crosslake Presbyterian Church).

This question is a question (*Where do I turn to when there's no choice to make?*) we all need to contemplate over the next few weeks, but with a slight variation: Where do *WE*, turn when there's no choice? Many, if not almost everyone, feels like COVID-19 has left us with *no choice* in life.

As if we have little say in what the future holds or how to do even basic things like shopping for groceries.

And yet, the question remains, "Where do we, as a community of faith, turn when there's no choice?" Where do we find our path, where do we find our way forward, where do we get our strength, how do we continue to be a community of faith in times when things feel both uncertain and completely out of control? How do we move forward when we feel there's no choice for us to make?

First, we turn to God, admitting how we feel. Openly. Honestly. We lift both our deepest questions and our most surface-level questions to God; we let God have all the questions of our hearts.

Second, we can turn to one another. We come together as a community of believers and seek prayer, guidance, and support from others. It doesn't matter if they have experience in what we're struggling with or if they are in the same struggle. All that matters is that they (we) listen and are willing to struggle alongside us.

In that spirit, as CPC contemplates worship this fall in light of COVID-19, I would like to ask you to be in prayer for our worshipping community. It may seem like we have *no choice* (or little choice) about worshipping in the midst of COVID-19, but we do. We get to determine what worship looks like. We get to determine how we are a community, how we remain a community, and what it means for us. Additionally, I'd like to ask you to be in conversation with us, the leadership, about where you feel God calling us as a community; not what you think we "*need*" to do, but where you feel God is calling us as a church. Over the next few weeks, we'll have different ways for you to share your thoughts, including a few brainstorming meetings, so stay tuned for more info on how to share your thoughts.

SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING


