Message from

Pastor Tony

I had a pastor's page written. It was ready to go so that the newsletter would arrive before February did. Then, life changed in a flash, as it's prone to. My article no longer seemed to fit. A lot no longer seemed to fit after finding out about Mary Lu. Life took a sharp right turn, and left us scrambling.

When I received the news from Mary Lu's family, I had just arrived at my continuing education workshop in Wisconsin; I had finished rolling in my luggage when I called the family for an update. The news hit me hard; as I'm sure it did for everyone! As people read the email update that Mary Lu would be returning home to be placed on hospice, I got a flood of emails from people offering their help, their time, and their support for the family. I got a few phone calls too from people offering their support and prayers.

In one of the conversations, the person asked, "what about worship on Sunday? Should we do anything differently? What do we do?"

My immediate response was "we worship!" Do the same worship. Keep the order of worship the same. Keep the *Call to Worship*, *Prayer of Confession*, *Declaration of Forgiveness*, the hymns, the scripture readings, offering and everything. Keep all of it. Keep it all in and do it all the same as we do any week.



Worship wasn't the same because I was concerned about showing favoritism. It wasn't the same because I didn't want to recognize the harsh truth. It wasn't the same because I didn't know what else to do; there are numerous prayers, poems, petitions, and platitudes that could have been offered. It wasn't because I was gone; church is the people not the pastor.

Worship was kept the same because comfort can be found in routine and ritual. I firmly believe that!

Its why basketball players have the same warm-up when they are getting ready for a free throw. And why musicians and athletes practice. They don't practice to simply get better. They practice so that when the time comes, when the pressure's on, or when life takes a *sharp right turn* routine and the mind overrides the emotion. Practice, ritual, and routine become the rails of a train track. Guiding the overwhelmed when they are uncertain of what to do next.

This is the same reason we say the *Lord's Prayer* each week, why part the *Forgiveness of Sin* is always the same, and why the *Benediction* is always the same. When the chips are down, when life takes an abrupt turn and we are at a loss, the routine of worship can kick in.

If you're feeling lost in your struggles you just might recall, "in Jesus Christ we are forgiven". When you can't find words for your prayer, maybe the *Lord's Prayer* will come to mind.

More than simply being able to recall words when we're suddenly at a loss for them, worship provides us with a means of remembering two important elements of discipleship. The first being that God is ever present. God is always with us. Worship is a reminder of God's continual presence in the world. Through the good times and the tough times, God is with us.

Second, and maybe slightly more important, worship reminds us to come together; to be a community. It reminds us that faith is not just a personal set of beliefs, it's *communal*. Worship is coming together to share in our common struggles, to lift up those who are hurting, to be there for one another, to laugh together, to cry together, sing together, pray together, carry one another's burdens, and to support the faith of friend when they are having problems carrying it alone.

When we don't know what to do, let's come together to be in the presence of God and of one another; to be a community (God is a community — Father, Son, and Holy Spirit — and we created in God's image, so are most human when we are in a community). It won't always be easy! We won't always be pleased with what's happening in life, or with God, but we will be together as a community. And maybe, in community the words and actions of our sisters and brothers in Christ, will carry our faith we are struggling to carry it alone!
