Privacy

Welfare Way Ltd is committed to protecting your privacy. We will process your data in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998 and the Privacy and Electronic Communications (EC Directive) Regulations 2003.

Are we a Data Processor or Data Controller?

If you are using our services as an individual, you contacted us directly to enquire/purchase our services for your own personal use, we act as a Data Controller as per the GPDR definition.

If you are using our services as part of an organisation, i.e. the organisation purchased the services for their members/staff, then we act as a Data Processor as per the GDPR definition.

How we collect and use the information we receive from you

We collect information about you when you contact us, register with us or place an order for products or services. We also collect information when you voluntarily complete customer surveys, provide feedback and participate in competitions. Website usage information is collected using cookies.

In particular:

- When you place an order on our website, we will ask you to provide certain personal information, for example: your name, email address, address and telephone number. Please note that we require this information to be able to process and fulfil your order or answer any questions.
- If you contact us by email or telephone, the contact details you provide and the details of the communication will be recorded and stored in our Customer Relationship Management (CRM) system.
- If you engage with us online via our website, our cookies (see our Cookie Policy below for further information) and similar technologies will capture your IP address, your location, and record how you use the site to help improve it and improve your user experience, where your browser settings or permission allows for this.
- If you post information online about us, provide feedback or a review, we may keep a record.

Your personal information will then be used by us (including our: employees; subcontractors; and third party processors e.g. email provider, reviews service) to provide you with the services you ordered and from time to time to communicate with you on any matter relating to the provision of the services and to tell you about other services we provide. We will only use your data in ways you would reasonably expect and will not share your personal information with any third party, except where required by law. The legal basis for using your data in this way is 'Legitimate interest' as it is necessary for us to run our business effectively and necessary for you, as the customer, to be able to receive and use the services we provide.

Opt-in marketing

When you sign up to a newsletter, subscription service, download a resource, or enquire about a product, we may ask you to provide certain personal information, including your:

- Name
- Email address
- The organisation you work for

By providing this data and ticking the relevant boxes you are providing your consent for us to process your personal data, and this is the legal basis we are relying on to do so.

Individuals who receive correspondence from us such as newsletters, updates, resources and marketing will always be given clear information about how to 'opt out' of future contact via a simple to use Unsubscribe link. Individuals can also contact us at any time to amend their preferences as to what they receive from us, by emailing contact@welfareway.co.uk

Financial data

When purchasing services from us payment is either made through invoice or securely via a third party payment platform, currently WorldPay and PayPal. No banking or payment details are recorded or retained by us.

How we protect your data

We know how important data security is to all our customers and we will treat your data with the greatest care and take all appropriate steps to protect it, including:

- We secure access to all transactional areas of our websites using 'https' technology.
- Access to your personal data is password-protected
- We regularly monitor our system for possible vulnerabilities and attacks
- Our website and related data is held securely in UK data centres

Access to your information and correction

You have the right to request a copy of the information that we hold about you. If you would like a copy of some or all of your personal information, please email us on contact@welfareway.co.uk. We may make a small charge for this service. We want to make sure that your personal information is accurate and up to date. You may ask us to correct or remove information you think is inaccurate.
