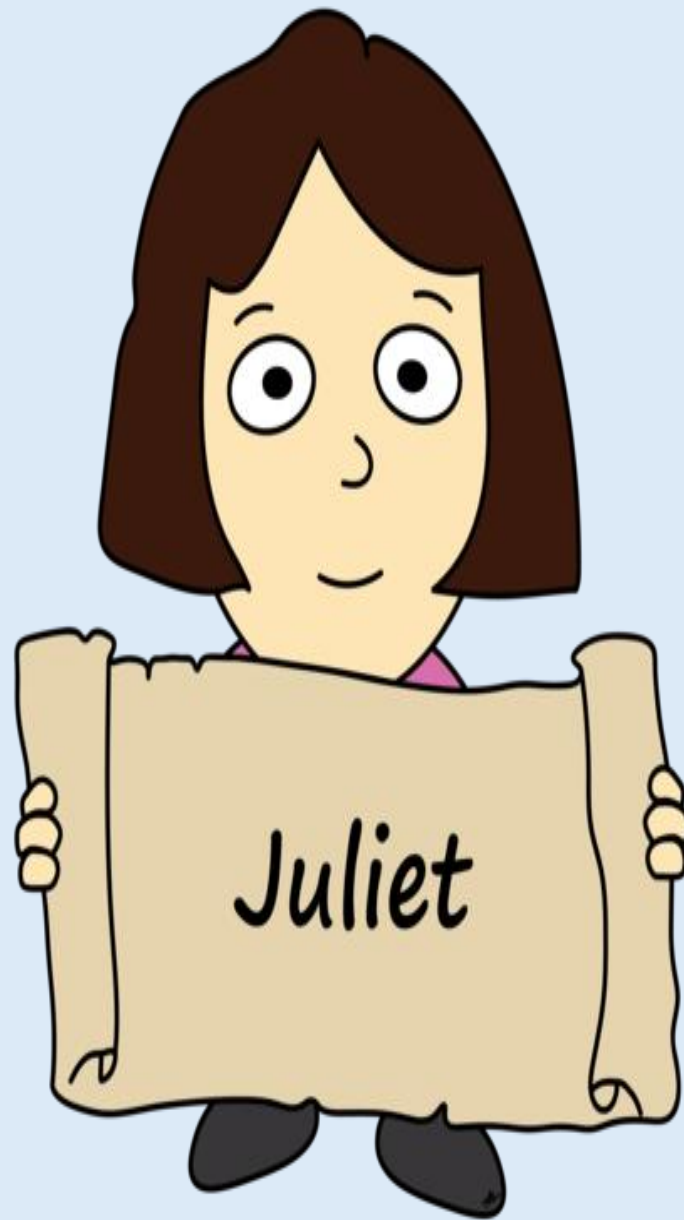


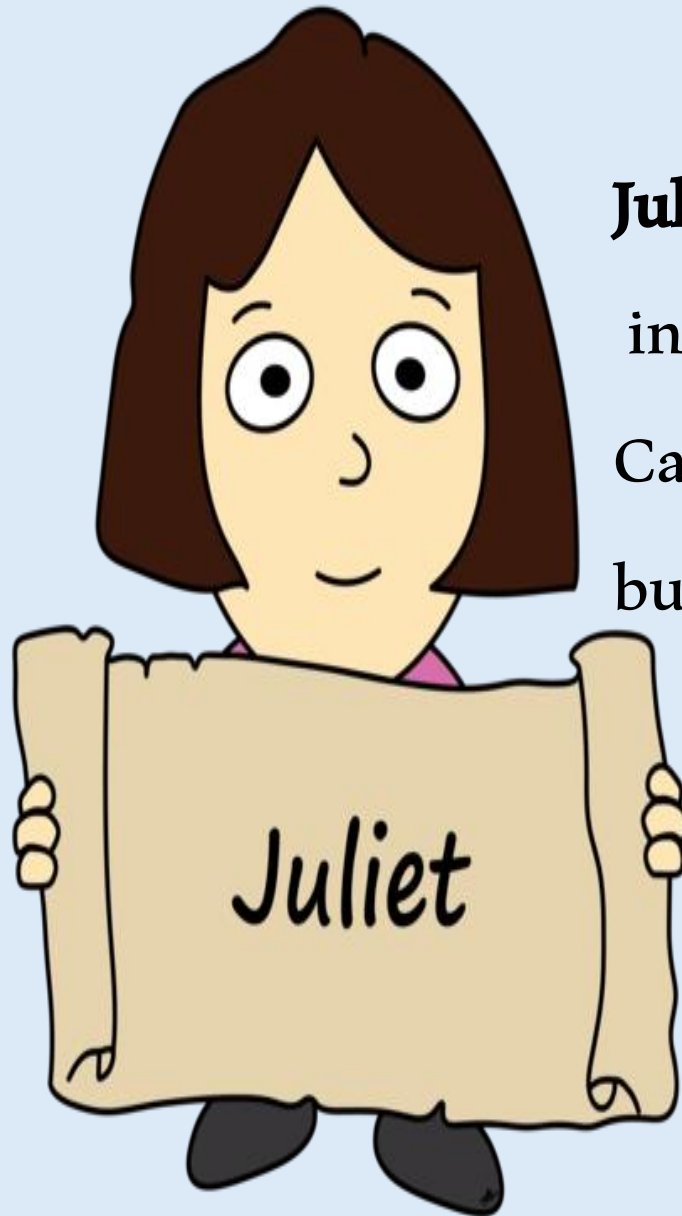




**Romeo** – Romeo is a romantic young man from the Montague family who falls deeply in love with Juliet.



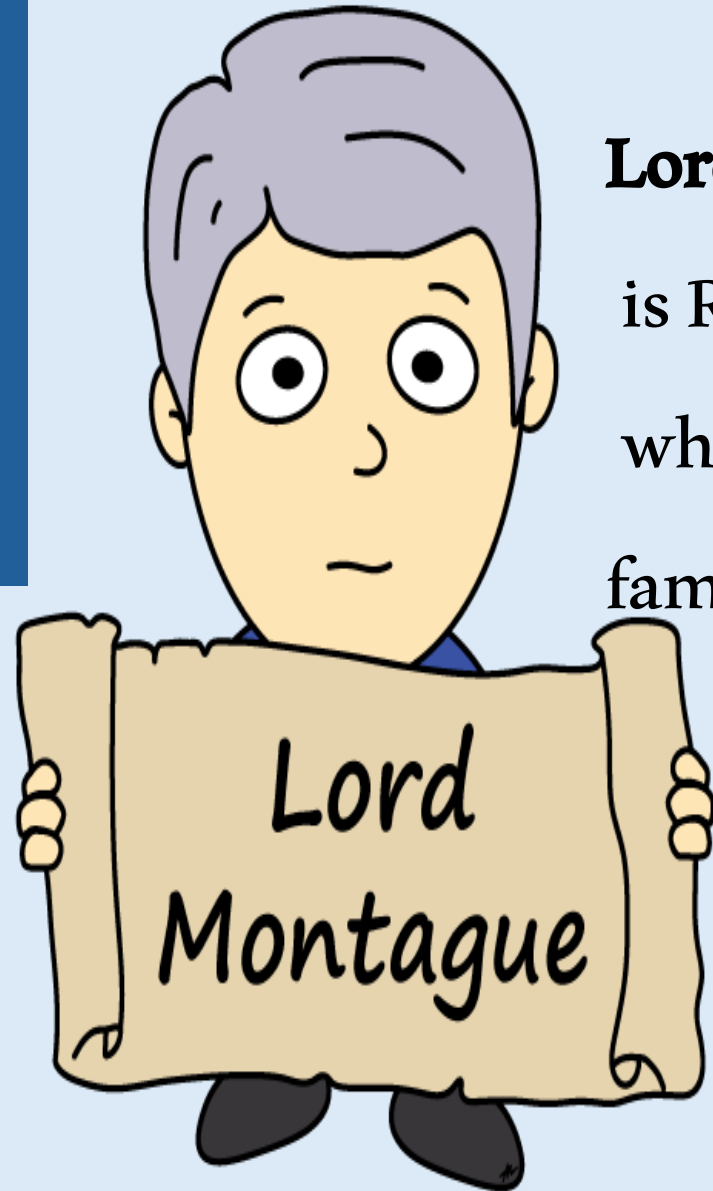




**Juliet** – Juliet is a kind and intelligent young girl from the Capulet family who loves Romeo but is forced to obey her parents.







**Lord Montague** – Lord Montague is Romeo's father and a proud man who is part of the long family fight with the Capulets.

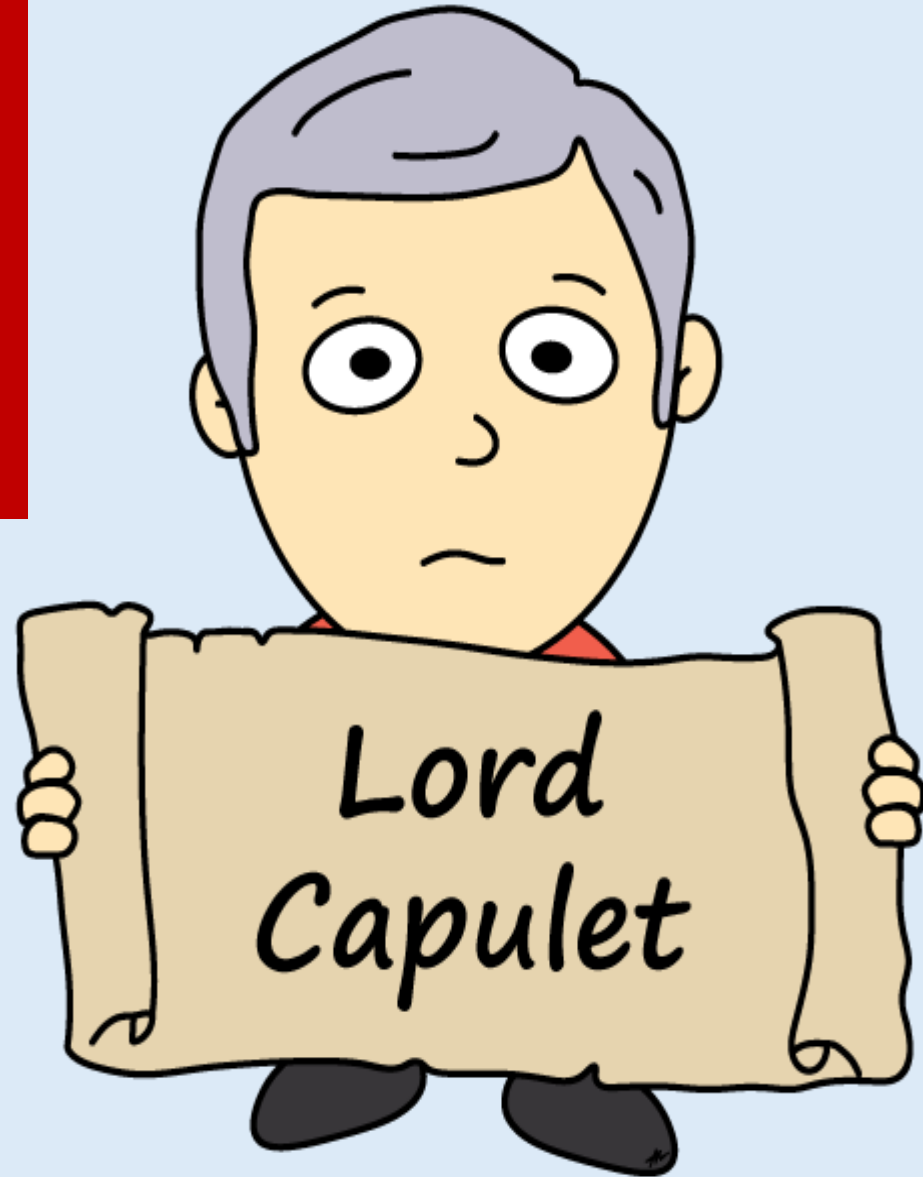


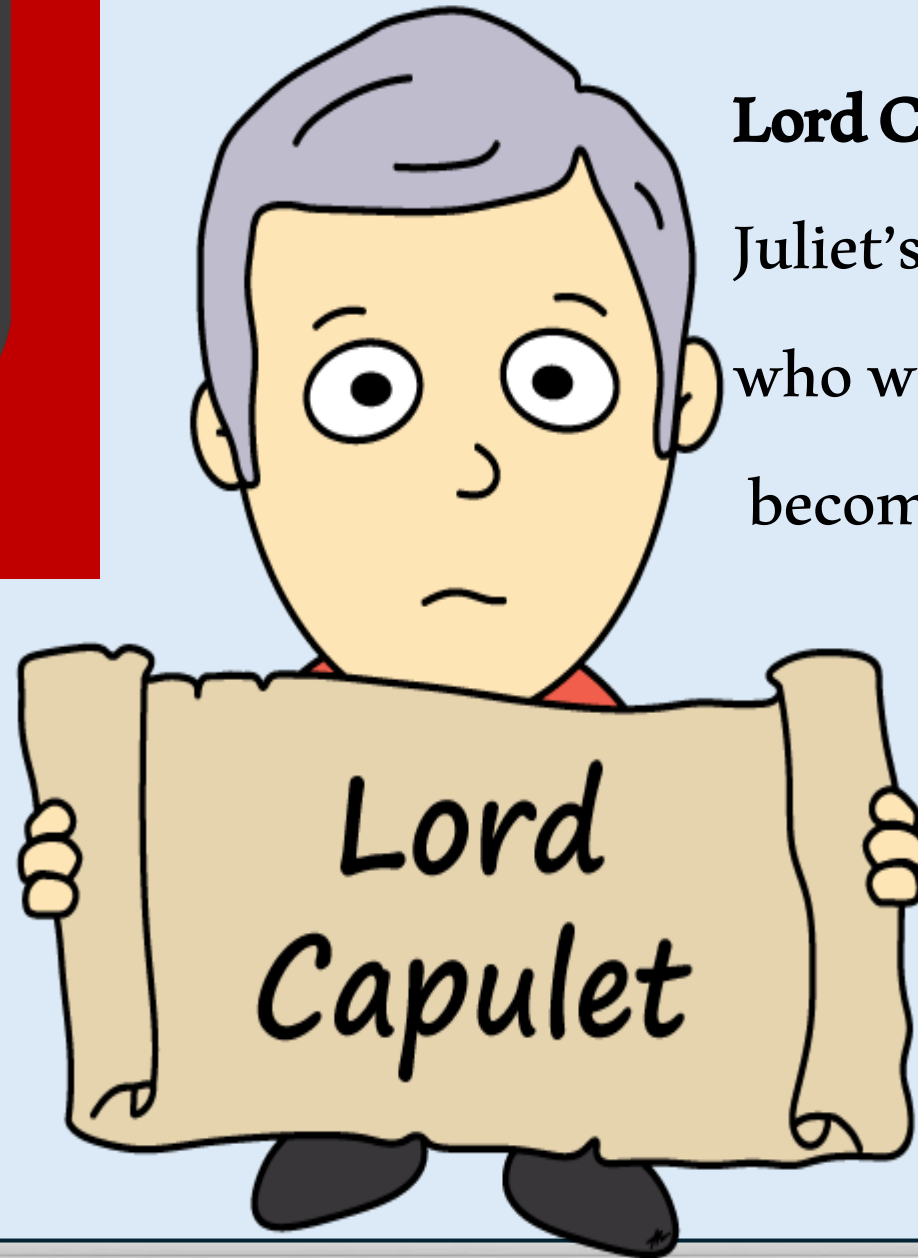




**Lady Montague** – Lady Montague is Romeo’s caring mother who worries about her son and is unhappy about the family conflict.

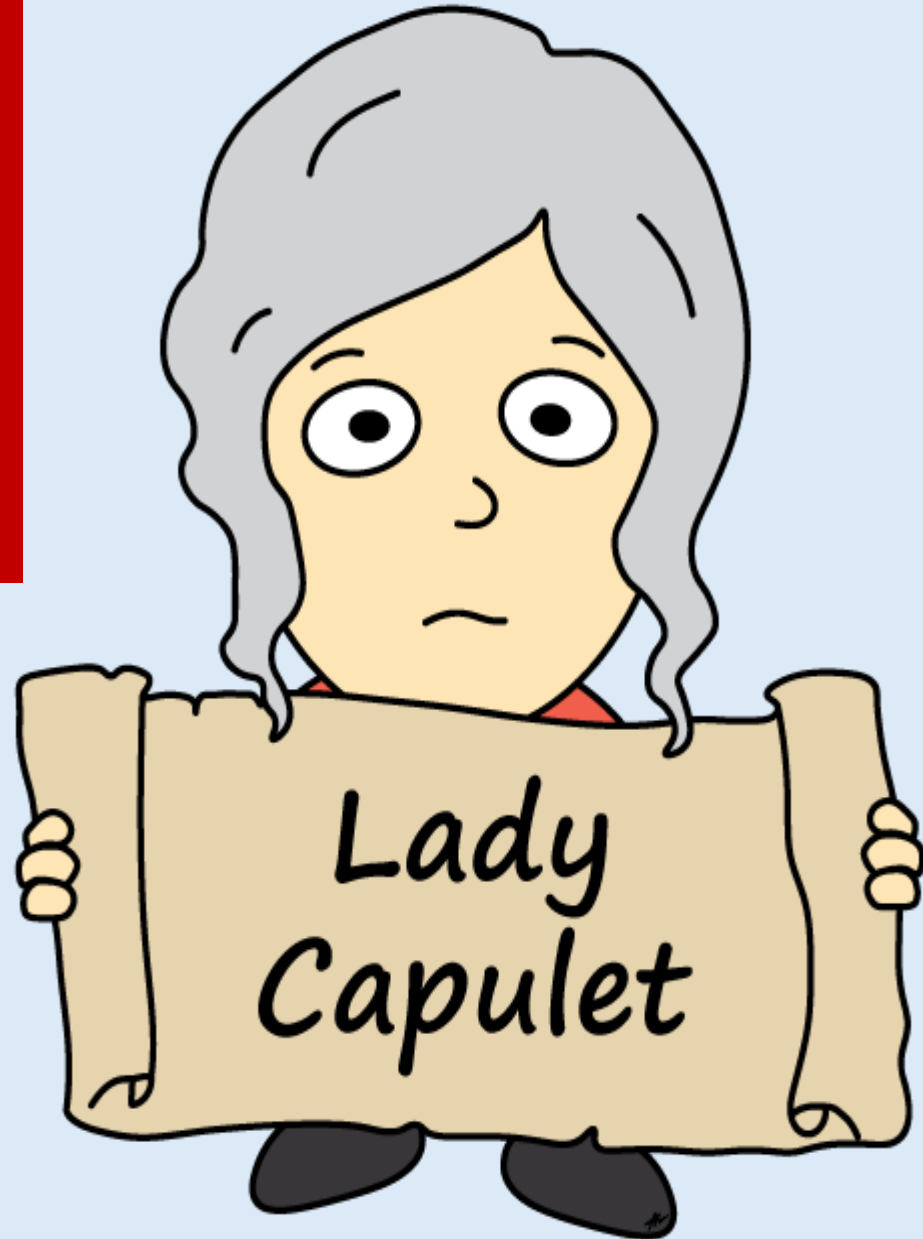


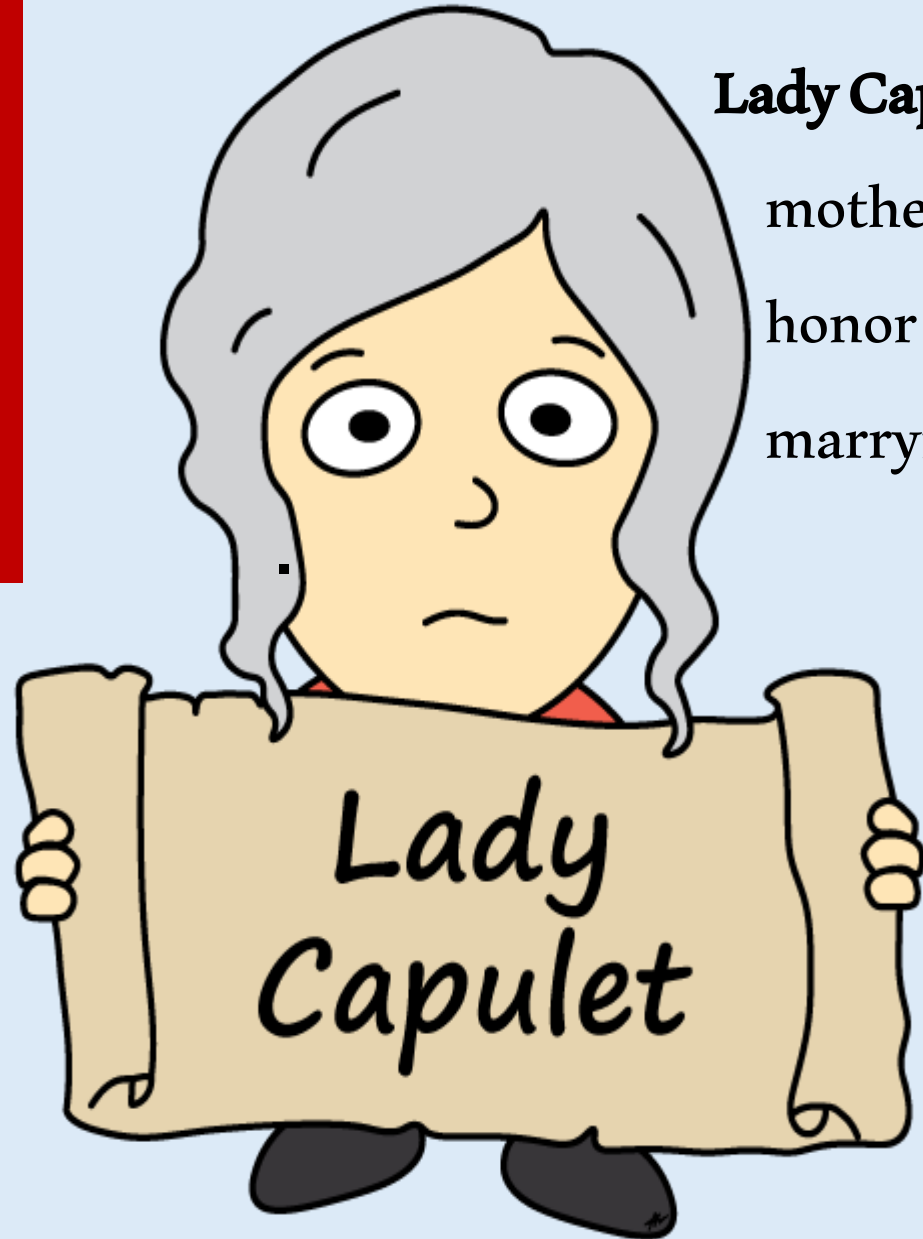




**Lord Capulet** – Lord Capulet is Juliet's strict and powerful father who wants her to marry Paris and becomes angry when she refuses.

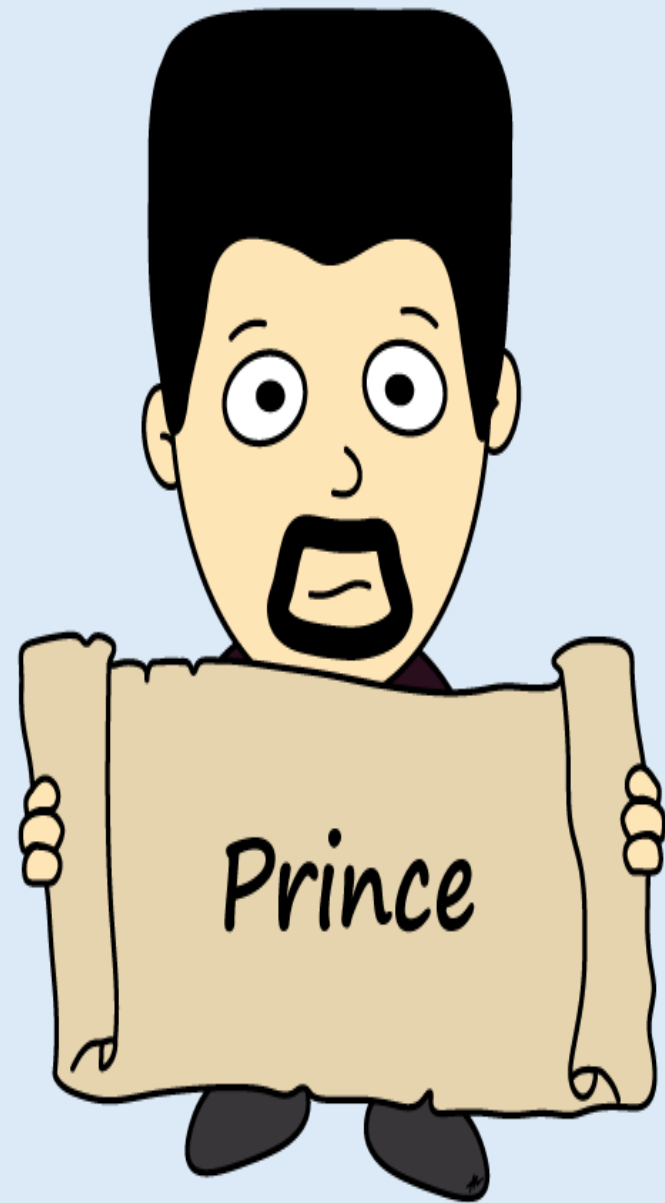


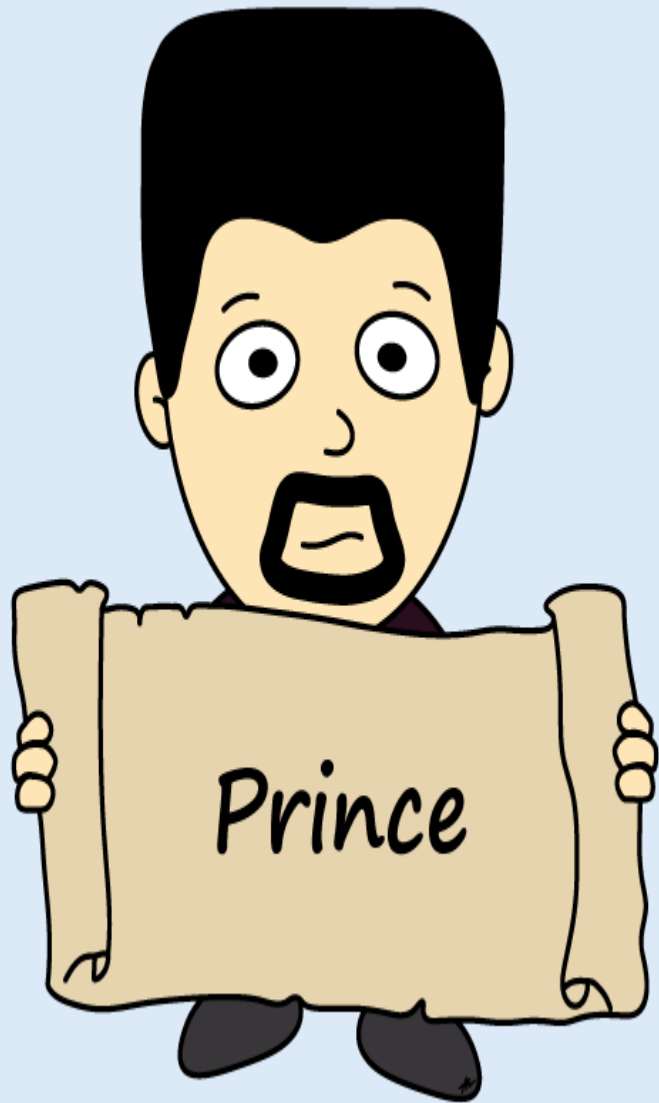




**Lady Capulet** – Lady Capulet is Juliet's mother who cares about family honor and supports the idea of Juliet marrying Paris







**Prince of Verona** – The Prince of Verona is the ruler of the city who tries to stop the fighting and keep peace between the families.

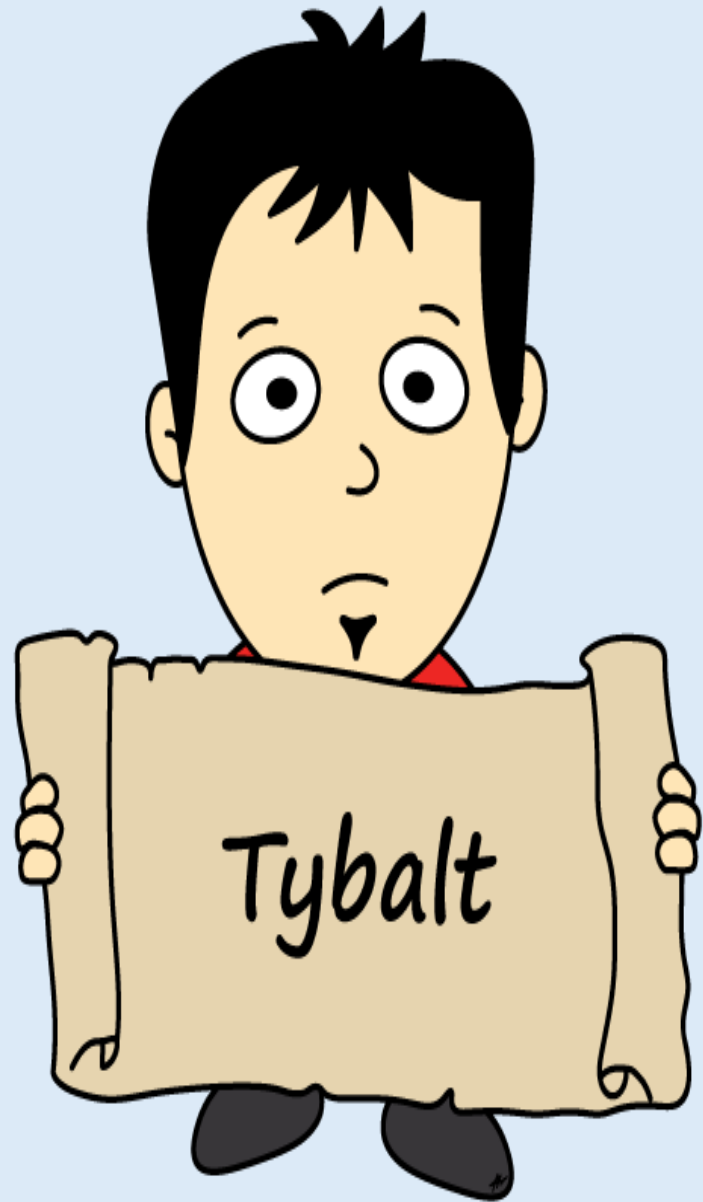


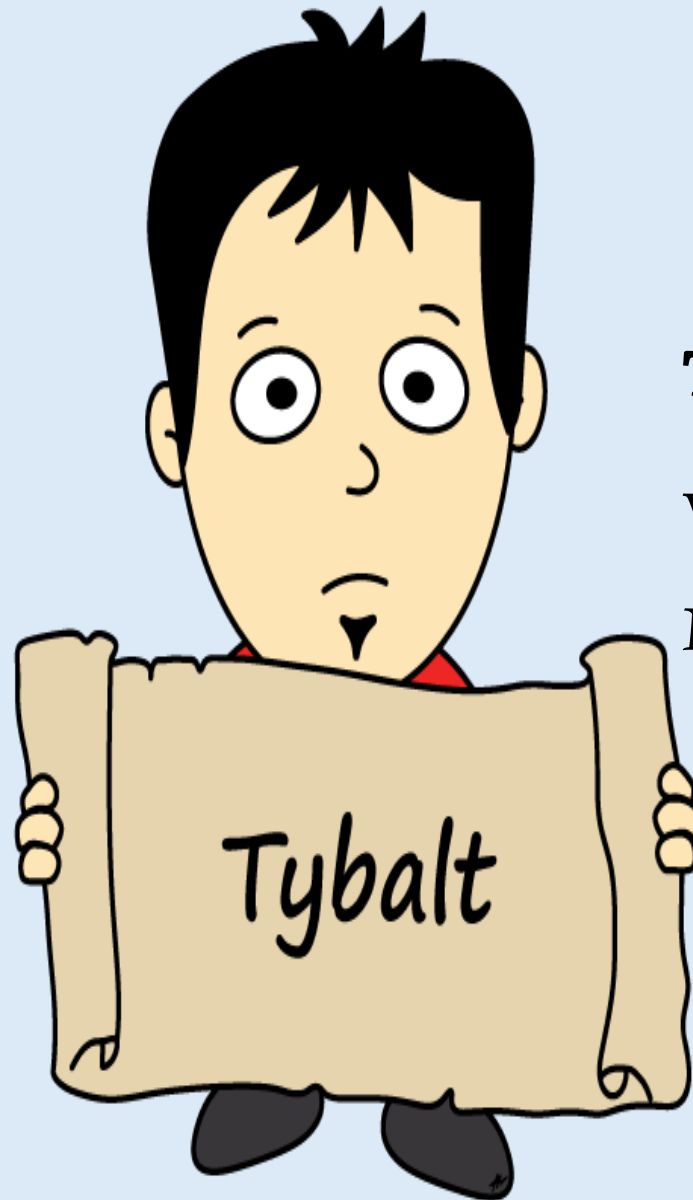




**Paris** – Paris is a rich and polite young nobleman who wants to marry Juliet and believes he would be a good husband for her.



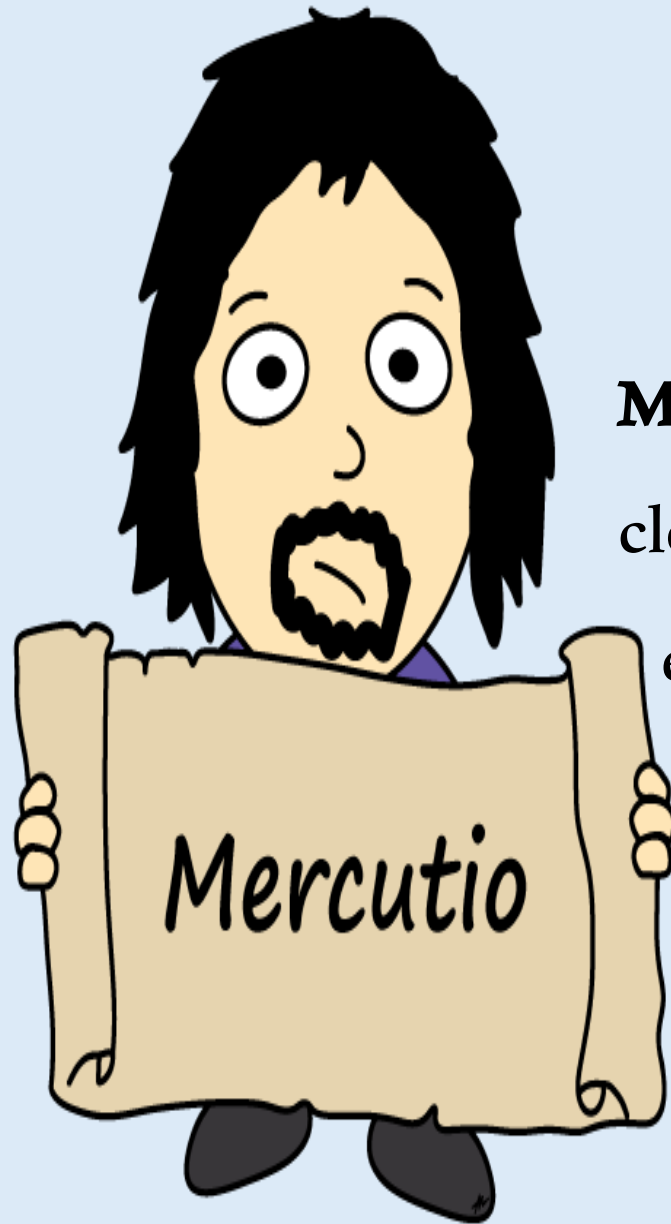




**Tybalt** – Tybalt is Juliet's cousin who is aggressive and hates the Montague family.

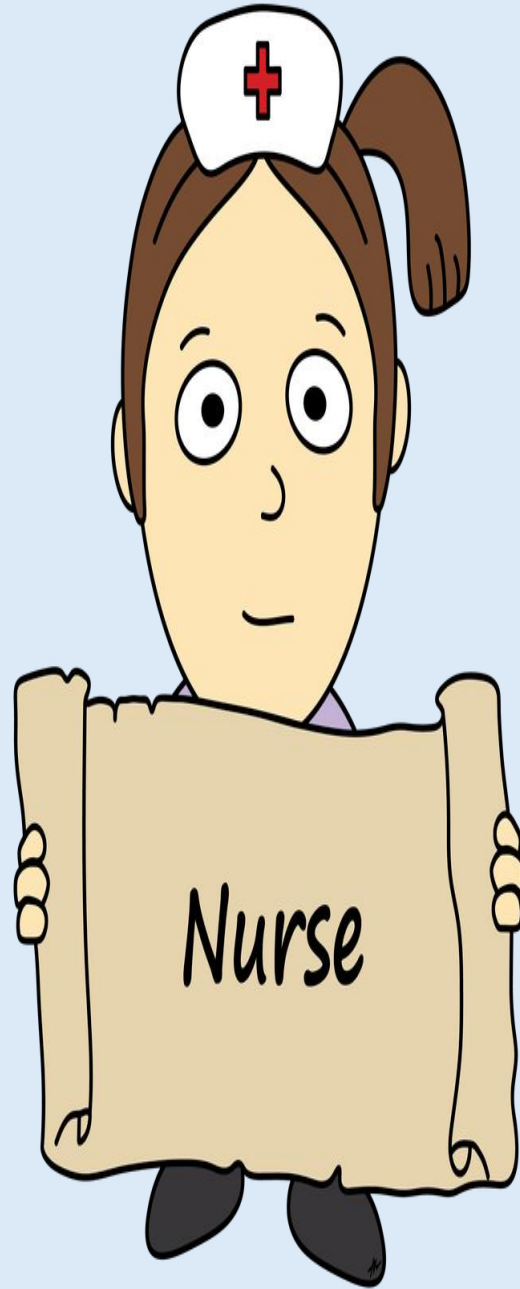


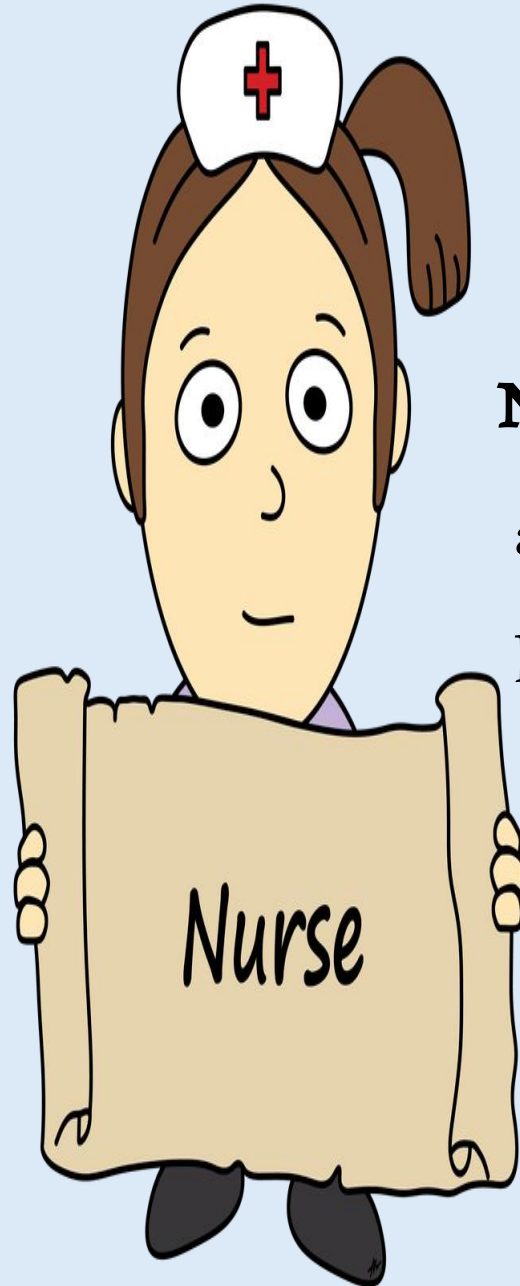




**Mercutio** – Mercutio is Romeo's close friend who is funny, clever, and enjoys making jokes, but can also be hot-tempered.







**Nurse** – The Nurse looks after Juliet and supports her love for Romeo like a second mother.



# Act I

Verona c.1400– 2 big families, the Montagues and Capulets are fighting on the streets. The Prince of Verona tells them to chill out, or he'll kill them. They all chill out.



Meanwhile, Lord and Lady Capulet are throwing a party to celebrate their daughter, Juliet's engagement to someone called Paris. Romeo Montague and his friends Benvolio and Mercutio hear about the Capulet's party and decide to go wearing disguises. Romeo wants to meet his girlfriend Rosaline.

# Act I

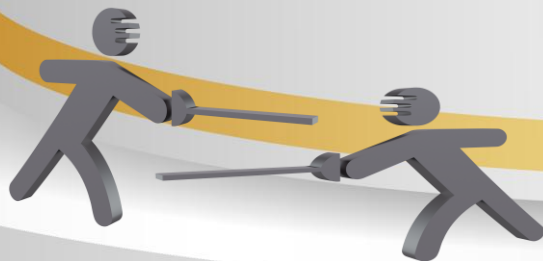

## Act II

In Act II of "Romeo and Juliet," the story continues with the romance between Romeo and Juliet. After the party, Romeo sneaks into the Capulet's garden to see Juliet. They share a famous conversation on Juliet's balcony, where they promise to love each other forever. Juliet suggests they get married. Romeo is excited and agrees to find a way to marry her.

He visits Friar Laurence, who is surprised but helps them because he hopes their marriage will end the family feud.



Meanwhile, Juliet waits for news from Romeo. The Nurse, her messenger, eventually arrives and tells her that the wedding is set for the next day. They are both happy and look forward to their secret marriage. Act II ends with a sense of hope and love, but also hints at the trouble that may come from their families' hatred.

The act shows how strong love can be, even in difficult situations.

## Act III

In Act III of "Romeo and Juliet," the story takes a dramatic turn. Romeo is now secretly married to Juliet, but tension between the Montagues and Capulets remains high. One day, Mercutio, Romeo's friend, and Tybalt, Juliet's cousin, meet. They argue, and Mercutio is killed by Tybalt.

Romeo, upset and angry, seeks revenge and fights Tybalt. In the end, Romeo kills Tybalt.

## Act III

This act brings serious consequences. The Prince of Verona punishes Romeo by banishing him from the city, which means he cannot see Juliet. Juliet is heartbroken when she learns of Tybalt's death and Romeo's banishment. The Nurse tries to comfort her but also advises her to forget Romeo and marry Paris, a man her parents want her to marry. Juliet refuses to accept this idea and feels desperate. She longs for Romeo and wishes to be with him again. The act ends with a sense of sadness and confusion, as both characters face the challenges of their love. Their hopes for a happy future seem impossible because of their families' hatred and the tragic events that have unfolded.

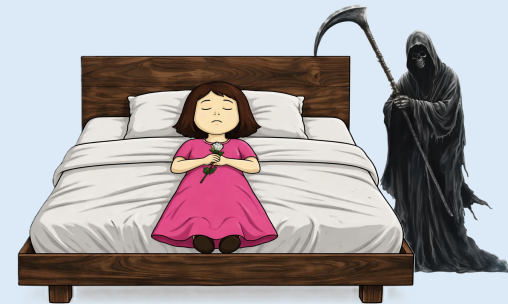
## Act IV

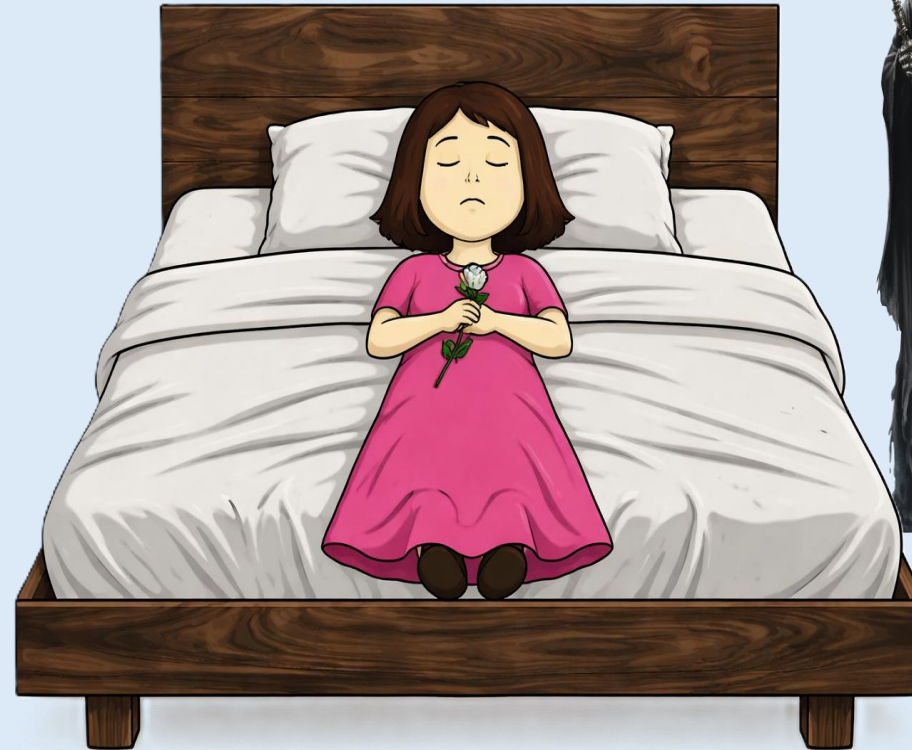


## Act IV

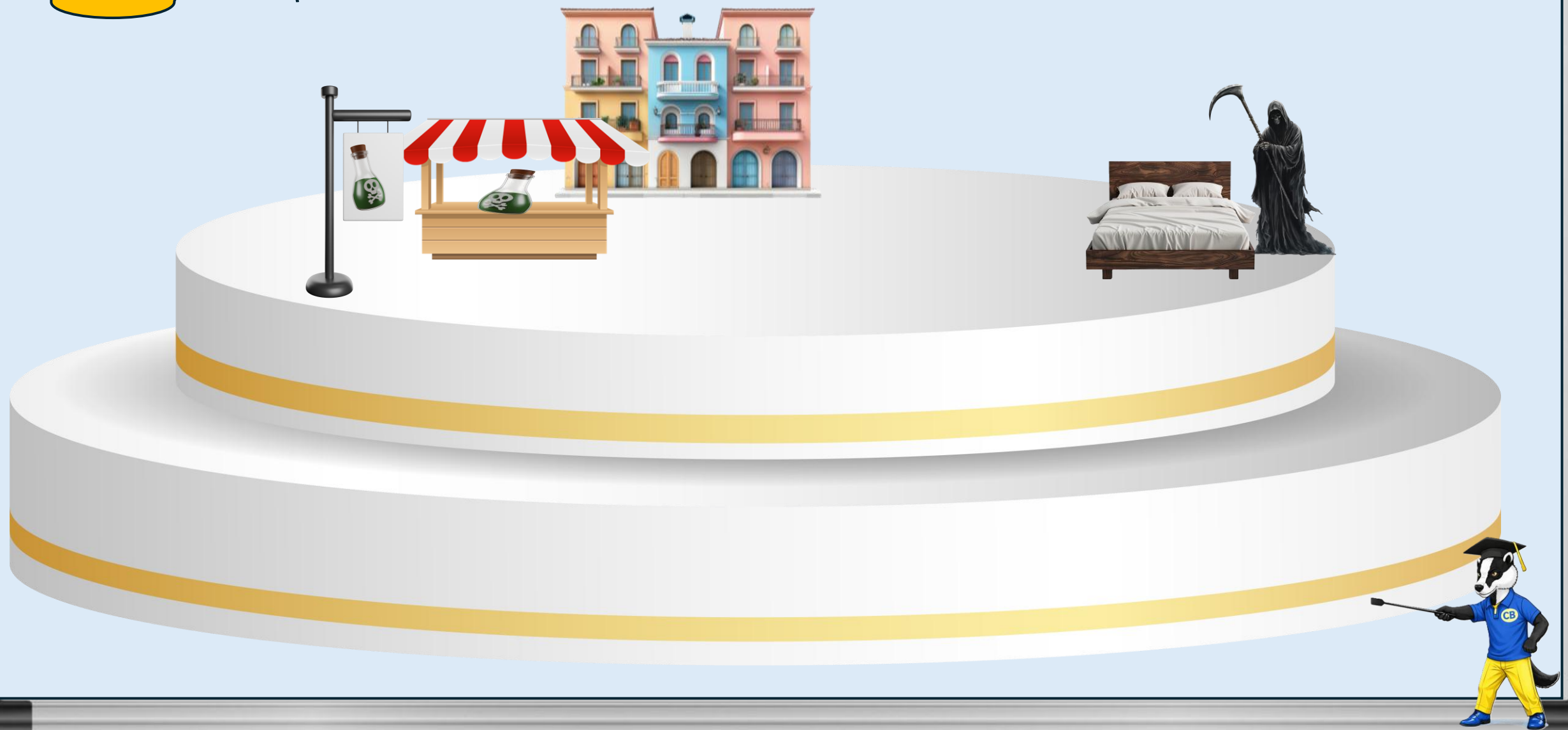
