Fellow Toastmasters.



We just celebrated the first anniversary of our journey with Pathways. Our members have made remarkable progress during this first year. So far District 62 has achieved over 80 Pathways education awards, including the very first path completed in our district (Presentation Mastery by Jeffrey A. Martin). That path is the first of many, many more to come as we continue our transition to the Pathways learning experience.

Some of you may be still completing awards in the Traditional education program and even working towards your DTM before starting on Pathways. That is wonderful. Remember that awards in the Traditional program can only be earned until June 30, 2020.

If you still need to serve a year as a district officer for your DTM, there is just one more Toastmasters year available to do that for the Traditional program, the 2019-2020 year that starts on July 1st. Send an email soon to DecNominations@62toast.com so our district leaders know about your interest.

And if you are needing to be a club sponsor, mentor or coach, send an email to cgd@62toast.com and Faith Cooper, our Club Growth Director, will work to find the perfect spot for you.

Both district officer service and being a sponsor/mentor/coach are requirements for Pathways DTMs as well. If you have completed these in the Traditional program but not applied them toward your Advanced Leader Silver (ALS) you can use them for a Pathways DTM.

With a little planning, finishing that DTM is possible. I also recommend that you select a path in Pathways so that you can help your fellow club members who have started on their paths and be a part of this new program.

Appointed positions are Area Director, Administration Manager, Finance Manager, Public Relations Manager and Audit Chair, Alignment Committee Chair and District Leadership Committee Chair. Audit, Alignment and District Leadership Committee Chairs are not necessarily part of the District Executive Committee.

Nominations of candidates for the elected positions 2018 are due bv December 15. DecNominations@62toast.com. Requirements for each position and Nomination forms are available at https://62toast.com/nomination-forms Candidates are welcome to self-nominate. This will be the last opportunity to complete your district leadership requirement for a DTM in the old system. Greetings from your Club Growth Director, Faith Cooper

I joined Toastmaster 5 years ago to work on my communication skills and to increase my scores on my annual reviews. I discovered that I learned many other transferable skills that you do not learn in college. Two years ago, I took on the role of area director. That year, I contacted several members that had the same goal of starting a club, Mint to Speak. It excites me to equip others and watch them soar.

This year I trained for my first half Iron Man. Although I could have found a plan and trained for it on my own, I choose to hire a coach. My coach made me much stronger by evaluating the areas I needed to focus on and critiqued my skills along the way. I needed to put in the work, but the plan to reach my goal was laid out and adjusted when needed. I had support and did not do it alone. My coach answered questions and showed me new drills to improve my skills. She was also there cheering loudly.



Just like coaches helps athletes reach their personal goals, club coaches help clubs reach the goals they have as well. They have the gift of listening and help put the steps in place to help a club reach their goals and cheer them on. They have experiences from their home club that might be different than the club they are coaching. If your club has fewer than 12 members, you are eligible to have up to 2 club coaches to reach your goals.

Based on the October 2018 renewals, more clubs are eligible for coaches and several clubs are already asking for coaches. Summary for the completion of the Fall District Council Meeting

We successfully completed our first ever full Fall Virtual District Council Meeting on Tuesday evening, October 23. A quorum was achieved which enabled the District to conduct required business. We successfully used Election Runner to collect the votes via an electronic ballot. The proposed District budget for the 2018-2019 fiscal year was approved as a key matter of business at the meeting. Special thanks to our District 62 Administration Manager, Cindy Pavella, DTM, PID, PRA for her detailed preparations for the meeting including the investigation of the best options for conducting the electronic vote. The lessons learned from this council meeting will be taken into consideration in planning and execution for the Fall 2019 Virtual District Council meeting.



Role Opportunities

Club Coach Chair. - The club coach chair would be responsible for locating qualified coaches; matching the right coach club partnership; and providing ongoing training for the club coaches.

Club Sponsor/Club Mentor Chair - They would be responsible building and supporting teams to support new clubs and programs. Supporting the teams includes training and other resources.

Club Extension Chair - Supports the Club Growth Director with processes of opening new clubs

Retention Chair - This member has a passion for seeking to support clubs and programs in retaining members and coming up with solutions.

Corporate Liaison - This member works with both existing corporate programs and new programs to build and keep the relationship with the corporations strong.

Book Store Manager — As a service to the members of District 62, the district operates a non-profit bookstore at all major training events and the annual spring conference. To continue to operate our bookstore, we need a dedicated and organized District 62 Toastmaster to become our new Bookstore Manager, effective beginning with the January TLI events. Key responsibilities include managing and tracking the inventory and setting up and operating the bookstore at TLIs and the annual spring conference. Audit Committee Members - In accordance with District by-laws, the District Director shall appoint an Audit Committee consisting of at least three individual members who are not members of the District Executive Committee to conduct both a Mid-Year and Year-End Audit. Mary Lawrence has been appointed as Chairperson of the Audit Committee for 2018-2019. Our District Director, Helen Dotson, DTM, is looking for qualified committee members from each Division to join this important required committee. District 62 Toastmasters interested in serving on this committee and having a firsthand look at the District 62 finances should email District Director Dotson at DD@62toast.com. The Mid-Year Audit is required to be completed and submitted to Toastmasters International World Headquarters by no later than February 15, 2019. Results of the Mid-Year Audit are reviewed at the Annual Business Meeting.

Spring Conference Volunteers - The District 62 2019 Spring Conference will be held the weekend of April 26 through 28, 2019 in Lansing, Michigan. The target location is the Kellogg Hotel & Conference Center at Michigan State University in East Lansing. The Spring District Council Business Meeting, also called the Annual Business Meeting, will be held on Saturday, April 27, 2019. Our conference co-chairs Anna Donahue (area18@62toast.com) and Laura St Louis (W.Div.Dir@62toast.com) are working diligently with our Program Quality Director, Spencer Van Roekel, DTM, in the initial planning for the Spring Conference.
