As we move through the busy season we should all be conscious of the Rogers Park playing schedule.

Pickleball lessons are on Tuesday and Thursday from 10:00 to 11:30 and open play on all four courts is on Monday and Friday from 10:00 until 11:30.

Tennis lessons are on Wednesday from 9:00 until 11:00. Tennis round robin play is Wednesday at 6:00PM to 7:30 PM and Tennis open play is Tuesday and Thursday from 8:30 until 10:00. If during tennis lessons or tennis open play, only one court is being used pickleball players may use the other side. However, these times are designated for tennis and if tennis players do show up we **must vacate the court immediately** during this designated tennis time.

All other times are on a first come first play basis. However, if pickleball players are on the court and other pickleball families or tennis players are waiting you must relinquish the court after playing for one hour. There is a white board on the front gate please sign in when you begin your play with the start time during these other times.

Get a group of 4 or 5 players together and head over to the courts in the afternoon or early evening. The courts tend to be not used after 12:00 each day and you will have them all to yourselves.

It's very important with limited resources that we work cooperatively with other Bolton residents as well as vacationers. Particularly if we want to have a positive long term relationship with the town to build more courts.
