Court Usage Update

The Bolton Pickleball Club has implemented a "WIN"/"LOST" two box Paddle Up format for use on the Rogers park courts. When only two players are waiting to play, we're having "winners stay and split", with the two waiting players join for the next game.

When there are four or players waiting, we're using "Four Up/Four Down" format. Now all four players come off the court and place their paddles in the appropriate WIN/LOST boxes. The "UP NEXT" sign gets moved to the adjacent box. This format should ensure that players have minimum waiting times between games. It also helps mix up players. With the influx of visiting players mixing with Bolton Pickleball Club players, this

simplified format seems to be working fairly well.

Communication with the Town of Bolton

The relationship between our club and the town continues to grow. Several of the board members had a meeting with the Supervisor and the Town Planner to discuss the current status of pickleball in the town and the various possibilities for the future.

The re-surfacing and re-striping of the courts in Rogers Park is behind schedule with the estimated start currently targeted at mid-August. When this happens, the courts will be potentially out of service for several weeks. A plan has been discussed, with the implementation being planned, for the basketball courts in Veterans Park to be set-up (striping, side-bumpers, etc.) to make fully playable courts. The completion timing is targeted to be done before the Rogers courts are out of service.

The town is applying for two grants, one to support new courts in Veterans Park and one to support new courts at the Town Recreation Park. Both of these grants will be submitted by the town to the state in the next several weeks. Our club was asked to provide documents in support of each of these grants, and of course we did. We were told that this type of support from local organizations (that are supported by a broad membership) carries a good degree of weight in the state's evaluation process.

As mentioned, the courts that are part of the total revamp at Veterans Park currently are not funded. The town is hoping to get the grant mentioned above approved, complete the balance of the funding plan, and start implementation to support a Summer of '25 completion. This target is contingent on many milestones being met in a timely fashion, many of which, the town has limited control over.

Our discussion also touched on a pickleball facility being constructed at the Town Recreation Park. The Town Recreation Park is the located off the first road on the right past the town highway garage. Many thoughts were expressed, all of which are blue sky and unfunded at this point but quite exciting. The town is in the process of having a consultant develop a scoping study to build an appropriate facility to house pickleball courts that can be used 12 months of the year. Many ideas were discussed but while these discussions are fun, the realism is that a project of this magnitude is 4 to 5 years away, with many hurdles to be cleared.

Our relationship with the town is a positive one, on both sides. As we move forward with our pickleball community, continuing and enhancing this relationship is very beneficial.
