

Range Safety Brief

- All participants have read and signed liability waiver.
- All participants understand that firearms are inherently dangerous, capable of causing serious bodily harm or death.
- Safety is paramount while on the range
- Follow the Basic Firearm and Range Safety Rules:
 - o Treat Every Firearm as if it were loaded, even if you know it is not.
 - Never Point your firearm at anything you do not intend to shoot
 - o Keep your finger straight and off the trigger until the ready to fire
 - Keep your firearm pointed downrange at all times
 - o Know your target, what is behind it, next to it and in front of it
- Terms and Commands
 - Down Range designated when someone is moving towards the targets in the firing area of the range.
 - At no time will firearms be handled when the command downrange is given and people are down range.
 - Firing Line The yard line on the range that is currently in use.
 - At no time should you bend down to pick anything up, without being given approval from the instructor. If you drop it, let it fall and wait.
 - Firearms <u>SHALL</u> not be handled when behind the firing line.
 - Stand-By is a preparatory command. It means do nothing but be ready to react.
 - o Threat / Beep The command given to shoot the number of rounds or sequence given.
 - STOP STOP STOP Time has elapsed, or the drill is complete. Take your finger off the trigger and wait for instructions.
 - Holster Look down at your holster, with your support hand, move and clothing or debris that may hinder the smooth transition of placing the firearm in the holster.
 - Training Time Out Raise your support hand in the air and shout Training Time Out, to signal to the instructor and others that clarity in the instruction needs to be given.

Range Safety Brief

- CEASE FIRE When this command is given, EVERYONE repeats the command, and immediately stops firing. Do not Holster or transition. Wait for further instruction.
 ANYONE can call cease fire, at <u>ANYTIME</u>, when they observe an unsafe act, or a situation that could cause a serious injury or death
- SMOKE If <u>ANYONE</u> sees smoke, or evidence of a fire, they will shout <u>SMOKE</u> to signal the instructor of the hazard.
- CODE RED In the event that someone suffers a gunshot wound, CODE RED will be used.
 Follow the commands of the instructor.
- Horseplay will not be tolerated
