<u>Dust</u>

Dust is a general term for particles of any substance that become suspended in the air.

Sometimes the particles are so small they are not visible to the naked eye.

Dust can be breathed in to the lungs ("respirable dust") where it can cause damage to the lung tissue. It can also irritate eyes, skin and the digestive tract.

Dangers of dust

- Any dust can be dangerous if its particles are small enough to stay suspended in the air.
- Certain dusts cause serious health problems even at low levels e.g. some wood dusts may cause cancer – the HSE's EH40 document gives exposure limits for general and specific dusts.
- Dusts can form explosive mixtures in air, e.g. flour. So it is important to prevent dust building up and to control ignition sources such as electrical equipment.

Health impacts of dust

- Uncontrolled levels of dust can cause the following
- Occupational asthma (OA)
- Pulmonary fibrosis
- Lung cancer
- Mesothelioma (often associated with exposure to asbestos fibres)
- COPD (Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease)
- Dermatitis and other allergic skin conditions
- Eye damage/irritation.

Ways of controlling dust

- The Workplace (Health Safety and Welfare) Regulations require effective and suitable ventilation of the workplace.
- Good ventilation can remove dust this may be either general room/space ventilation system or a local exhaust ventilation (LEV) targeted at problem areas/processes.
- The effective design and maintenance of any ventilation system is crucial.
- Supervision of work operations can promote safe working practice. November 2020 Dust Ways of controlling dust (cont.)
- Workers must always follow safety instructions on dust management.
- Airborne sampling may be used to identify worker exposure to dust.

Plumber jailed after illegal gas work costs elderly woman over £1000

A plumber has been jailed for 16 months after carrying out illegal gas work that cost an elderly woman over £1000.

Christopher Roland Shaw, also known as Chris Parker and trading as SOS Express Plumbing, attended the woman's home in Leeds, in October 2019, where he was hired to carry out gas work. Mr Shaw had been assisting the woman with general plumbing needs for a number of years and told her he fitted the water heater in her bathroom.

As a result of this, the woman believed Mr Shaw was able to work on gas appliances. At the request of the woman, who was 81 at the time, Mr Shaw then removed an existing gas boiler and installed a new combination boiler at a total cost of £1157.

An investigation by the Health and Safety Executive (HSE) found Mr Shaw was not registered with the Gas Safety Register (GSR), a legal requirement whilst carrying out gas work. Mr Shaw's work at the woman's home was subsequently investigated by GSR, which identified several issues. Read the full article <u>here</u>.



Exeter Farmer fined after teenage worker injured on dumper.

A farmer has been fined £8k after a teenage worker suffered serious head injuries when a sixtonne dumper he was driving overturned.



An investigation by the Health & Safety Executive (HSE) found that Richard Palfrey did not ask the two young workers their ages or make any enquiries into their training or experience in operating dumpers. Read the full article <u>here</u>.

Company and director fined after HSE inspectors find unusable toilet

A company and its director have been fined after they failed to provide suitable welfare facilities at a construction site in Belsize Park, North London.

A Health and Safety Executive (HSE) inspection of the site on 29 November 2021 found the welfare facilities did not comply with the minimum requirements as set out in Schedule 2 of the Construction (Design and Management) Regulations 2015; the toilet provided was not flushable and was in a room without a door or window coverings.
