Alternate Routes to the Bottineau County Fairgrounds:

Coming from the West: go north on Ohmer Street, east on 3rd Street, north on Main Street

Coming from the East: go north on Railroad Ave (Truck Route), a short left onto 2nd Street, north on Main Street

The band *Too Old to Stand* who you enjoyed last year will be playing Saturday night 9:00pm at the A-frame Bar & Grill, Lake Metigoshe, 13 miles NE of Bottineau

Campgrounds & Restrooms:

Base Camp Check-in @ **Bottineau County Fairgrounds**, located on the north end of Main Street, Bottineau

- Enter the southern-most gate (Gate 1) to access the Fairgrounds – look for flags
- Complimentary tent camping, and 15 RV spots with electric (30, 50 AMP), water and sewer
- Restrooms available 24/7; separate men's and women's with 7 stalls and 1 shower each
- Drinking water sources available
- Information Center on site
- Fairgrounds will be secured August 3-10, 2019

Tommy Turtle RV Park; *1001 10th Street E*

- First come, first serve for 13 RV spots
- \$20/night includes electric, water hook-ups, shower and dump station
- Free Wifi within Welcome Center

Hotel Lodging:

Showers:

- CaNDak mobile shower house spot located near the Fairgrounds' restrooms
- Fairgrounds restrooms have 1 shower stall in each the men's and women's
- High School locker rooms located south of the Fairgrounds, across the street – look for flags and signs

- Men's locker room (Door #17) with 18 shower heads, 3 urinals, 1 stall
- Women's locker room (Door #16) with 14 shower heads, 3 stalls
- Lockers available to put personal items in (bring your own lock)
- Security camera outside of locker rooms (nearby bike rack and fence to lock bikes)
- WiFi password will be written on the white boards
- Ice machine and drinking water supply available

Meals:

On the Fairgrounds, meals will be served in the 1st Lutheran Church Stand, located west of the restrooms, provided by the Turtle Mountain Kiwanis

Internet:

Available in the 1st Lutheran Church Stand, and the Fairgrounds Exhibit Hall, which is available shelter in case of bad weather

Enroute Points of Interest:

Historic Site on Hwy 14; monument with plaque to show the original site of the Turtle Mountain Lutheran Church, congregation organized in 1890 and log church built in 1892, moved to its current location in 1897, *Turtle Mountain Church* sign seen farther up Hwy 14

Beginning of Scenic Byway Hwy 43; a deer and turtle rebar statue welcomes you to the Turtle Mountains, pull out available to stop for pictures, Belcourt artist Bennett Brien brought to life a turtle representing the Turtle Mountains, while the deer represents the most recognized animal in the plateau

Twisted Oaks Equestrian Campground; Short, packed-gravel road to vaulted toilets, camping, shared trails, and equestrian corrals

Mystical Horizons; Scenic Byway Hwy 43, 21st century Stonehenge, an equinox and solstice structure, pillars and elongated stones to view the sun, great views of the prairie that expand into Canada

Strawberry Lake Recreation Area; camping, boat ramp, beach, fishing dock, wildlife viewing and shared trails, vaulted toilets but they are much farther inside the campgrounds

Annie's House and Hiking Trails; Bottineau Winter Park on Scenic Byway Hwy 43, Annie's House is named for Ann Nicole Nelson who was the only North Dakotan (Stanley, ND) to perish in the 9/11 attack on the World Trade Center. Ann was working as a bond trader on the 104th floor of the WTC when the towers collapsed. Her unfinished "bucket list" inspired many on a collaborative effort to build Annie's House which provides an array of life-changing opportunities to veterans with disabilities.

Thunder Mountain Speedway; home track of legendary #2strong Robbie Conway (Westhope, ND), Bombers, Enduro, IMCA Sportmod and Hobby Stock classes, race night Friday, August 2nd at 7:00pm, 5 miles north of Bottineau

Things to Do:

Bottineau County Historical Museum; west across from the Fairgrounds, open 11:00-4:00

Horseshoe Pit at the Veterans Memorial Building; west across from the Fairgrounds, open daylight hours

Bottineau Country Club Golf Course; \$15 9-holes, 4 miles NE of Bottineau, great views, cart rental \$7.50/person, 2 sets of clubs available @ no charge

Swimming Pool; south of the Fairgrounds across the street, free admission on Saturday, August 3rd

Statues/Monuments: Tommy Turtle (Park) Statue, Pierre Bottineau Statue @ Bottineau County Courthouse, Four Chaplains Monument @ St. Mark's Catholic Church

Frisbee Golf at Forestry Park; free, bring your own equipment

Downtown Shopping; souvenirs, coffee shops, ice cream novelties, clothing & shoes, home deco, jewelry, floral & gifts, bakery

Lake Metigoshe State Park; \$7 vehicle entry, canoe & kayak rental \$8/hour (allow 3 hours includes drive time), home of ND's first National Recreation Trail and many more, 14 miles NE of Bottineau

VFW Park @ Lake Metigoshe; basketball and pickle ball courts, open to the public, bring your own equipment

International Peace Garden; 30 miles NE of Bottineau, need passport or birth certificate with Driver's License

High Ropes Course at Camp Metigoshe; minimum 8 people-max 16, \$20, 4-hour session from 2:00p-6:00p, reservation required 701-263-4788
