The Scout Law

A Scout is:

Trustworthy A Scout tells the truth. He or she keeps his or her promise. Honesty is part of his or her

personal code of conduct. People can depend on him or her.

Loyal A Scout is true to his or her family, Scout leaders, friends, school, and nation.

Helpful A Scout is concerned about other people. He or she does things willingly for others without

pay or reward.

Friendly A Scout is a friend to all. He or she is a brother or sister to other Scouts. He or she seeks to

understand others. He or she respects those with ideas and customs other than his or her

own.

Courteous A Scout is polite to everyone regardless of age or position. He or she knows good manners

and makes it easier for people to get along together.

Kind A Scout understands there is strength in being gentle. He or she treats others as he or she

wants to be treated. He or she does not hurt or kill harmless things without reason.

Obedient A Scout follows the rules of his or her family, school, and ship. He or she obeys the laws of his

community and country. If he or she thinks these rules and laws are unfair, he or she tries to

have them changed in an orderly manner rather than disobey them.

Cheerful A Scout looks for the bright side of things. He or she cheerfully does tasks that come his or

her way. He or she tries to make others happy.

Thrifty A Scout works to pay his or her way and to help others. He or she saves for unforeseen needs.

He or she protects and conserves natural resources. He or she carefully uses time and

property.

Brave A Scout can face danger even if he or she is afraid. He or she has courage to stand for what he

or she thinks is right even if others laugh at or threaten him or her.

Clean A Scout keeps his or her body and mind fit and clean. He or she goes around with those who

believe in living by these same ideals. He or she helps keep his home and community clean.

Reverent A Scout is reverent toward God. He or she is faithful in his religious duties. He or she respects

the beliefs of others.
