At the Last Board Meeting

On May 23rd, 2024: In accordance with Civil Code §4920, notice of the meeting and the agenda was posted on the bulletin board at least four days in advance of the General Session of the Board of Directors held on the above date at the Association clubhouse. And in accordance with State Statute the homeowners present were given an opportunity to address the Board of Directors. The following items were brought up: Vehicles and motorcycles driving at unsafe speeds, and the importance of keeping all dogs on leash when walking on the property for the safety of all dogs.

The HOA BOD committee heads for Architectural, Landscape, Clubhouse, Trash/Recycling, Parking, Lighting, Well & Equipment and Pool/Spa gave verbal reports to the board.

The Board TABLED the appointment of one Director to fill the one vacant seat created by the resignation of Shawn Van Enoo on 03/13/24, and the appointment of one Director to fill the one vacant seat created by the death of Jack Casey in March 2024, until the June board meeting, since there are no candidates at this time.

The Board APPROVED the proposal from Roofing Standards dated 05/16/24 to repair the roof and replace dry rot wood identified for \$3,950.00 to be paid from Reserves G/L #70600 (Common Area).

Management advised the Board that we are still seeking two additional bids for this project: to install an ER Spa Switch as required by the Health Department until the June 2024 meeting, pending 2 additional bids.

The board discussed ideas and plans for the annual HOA 4th of July Celebration. A motion was APPROVED by the board for a budget of \$750.00 for the celebration food and supplies. A motion was also APPROVED for a budget of \$100 for some new American Flags to be used with the older stock of flags around the Lake/ Community for Memorial Day and the 4th of July holidays.

The next meeting of the Board of Directors will be June 27th, 2024.

had a name! —Editor






Don't miss our big SCS 4th of July Party!

Driving & Parking at SCS: A quick reminder about safer driving, and the difference between 'Registering' and 'Safelisting' your car

Safety First! We have had some complaints about vehicles speeding here in South Coast Shores. **As a reminder, the actual speed limit is 15mph.** That is how our speed bumps are calibrated. Please keep in mind there are a lot of older people using the recycle bins out on the streets, and now, new kids living/playing here, so please slow down to avoid any accidents.

All of our streets are two way streets, however, I do see people driving down the middle quite often. (This is also true of pedestrians—walking right down the middle of the street instead of using the sidewalks). This can be very unsafe.

The 'curves' at both ends of West Wind are potential trouble spots when residents drive too fast.

It's a good idea to hug the curb a little in case someone is coming the other way in the middle of the street. Our delivery drivers are usually in a hurry, and we need to be aware of them. If you see them speeding, remind them of our safety concerns as many of our residents already do! The board is looking into some additional speed controlling features, and we would welcome your input.



'Registering' a vehicle is what you do in order to have that car on a list that Patrol Masters keeps allowing you to park it in any legal space at SCS, any time of day or night. The auto is linked to your address for the long term. If you change



your license number or replace the car, you need to let me know or let Patrol Masters know ASAP or you may start getting violations that could lead to a **tow.** It seems to work better if you go thru me for any registration changes you have.

'Safelisting' is a temporary parking permit meant for your guests. You may have 30 days of safelisting in a 6 month period. You could also have your guest park in your

garage, and put your registered car on the street. Safelisting is done directly with Patrol Masters online or by phone. I don't recommend trying to use their app. It seems somewhat unreliable.

Landscape News

With the summer heat coming, it's a good time to review strategies to keep those mosquitos away from you:



1. Dump out any standing water near your home or in your patio. Mosquitos can breed in just 14 days in a minute amount of water in an old flower pot, a rain gutter or bird bath. *This is the most important thing we can do to keep mosquito populations low—keep a close eye on ANY standing water and eliminate!* Don't forget

to clean pet water bowls weekly, and don't let water sit in potted plant saucers.

- **2. Keep mosquitoes outside.** Have good screens on all windows to keep mosquitos from slipping into the house. And keep them in good repair.
- **3. Use mosquito repellent.** The most effective chemical repellents contain DEET, picaridin, PMD, or IR3535 insecticide, which are all considered safe when used as directed. The Environmental Working Group lists picaridin and IR3535 as its top choices for repelling mosquitoes. Just watch out for skin irritation and avoid spraying chemicals around the eyes or mouth. Experts say to concentrate the repellant on your ankles, feet, lower legs and wrists—thin-skinned spots mosquitoes love to bite.
- **4. Wear light-colored clothing, when outdoors.** Apparently from research, deep colors—like black, deep blue and red—stand out so they attract bugs. Thicker fabrics and looser fits offer more protection that thin clothing that fits tightly.
- **5. Stay indoors during dusk and dawn.** While mosquitoes can bite at any time of day, it's wise to limit your exposure during their prime feeding times. If you can't avoid being outdoors at these times of day, be sure to take some other precautions.

Pet Owners: Please keep your dogs on leash when walking them at SCS. Big or small, it's safest for your dog, other dogs and other residents, and a rule in our neighborhood and the city of Santa Ana.



FYI: Some very good reasons to keep your garage doors shut...

We are seeing so many garage doors left up, either open all the way or sometimes just a few inches lately that we would like to warn you about some problems that could happen with that (besides letting in unwanted people). Skunks and feral cats have been spotted on our property based on reports received lately.

In one instance a male feral cat got into a garage during the day, a couple of months ago, and sprayed the whole area, which was a difficult stinky mess to clean up. And, the smell is not totally gone, even yet!

Skunks can do the same thing in your garage, and DO roam the property during the day and can get inside if

access is allowed. The homeowner that had a skunk in their garage was very lucky that the animal was able to be carefully shooed out by neighbors



without spraying that awful smell (We think it was a baby skunk that time).

Several residents have reported the skunk spray smell that came in their house in the middle of the night and kept them awake the rest of the night—because of how strong that smell is! So you sure don't want that smell inside your garage.

Also, of course, rodents are always happy to start a nice new home inside your garage, too, if they can find their way inside.

So, please be careful who you 'let in'.



Updated information about the Trash Bins stickers in our SCS garage courts

It has come to the HOA's attention that has been some misunderstanding about much can be put into our trash bins. This has happened because our super-nice Republic trash pickup guy has been kind enough to overlook a couple of very overfilled bins, and accept them with stuff piled over the top, lids up, and kindly not send in a violation for SCS. This has given the wrong impression to some residents, who now think that 'overfilling' is acceptable.



'Overfilling' will not be allowed anymore and if it occurs the HOA will get a violation/fine. To make this clear Republic Services is now in the process of applying stickers that show the top limit for trash inside the bin (nothing sticking out beyond the top edge of bin), and requires us to keep the lids 'close-able' at all times. And closed when not in use.

Overfilled bins indicate to our trash vendor that we need more pickups per week, and we need to avoid the extra cost of that to keep HOA dues as low as possible. We believe our capacity for trash is adequate now, if residents recycle with both Food & Yard Waste (Organic) and Recycle bins that we are required by the state to use (located on the perimeter streets). Breaking down larger pieces of trash can help make our bins more efficient and save space, too. And, it is unsafe for our pickup guy when bins are overfilled at the weekly dump time.

Bin lids need to be able to close to keep out rodents, which have been seen inside the trash bins (although no food waste should be inside trash bins now with our Food & Yard Waste bins in service).

If your trash bin is full, feel free to redistribute to a nearby bin (if there is room) which will help us keep costs down and create no 'overfills'. And, maybe you can hold back on some trash for the following week's pickup, and not take too much space in the bin in one week—which causes all the overfill issues, it seems.

And, please note: our trash needs were never calculated to accommodate construction debris from a remodel project. Our R&Rs require vendors to take their trash/debris items away and NOT use our trash bins, at all, actually.
