During our years here, we've shared many great experiences - this year is no exception. In 1995-96, our teachers and friends have truly made it a year to remember.

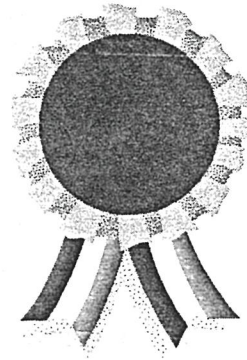




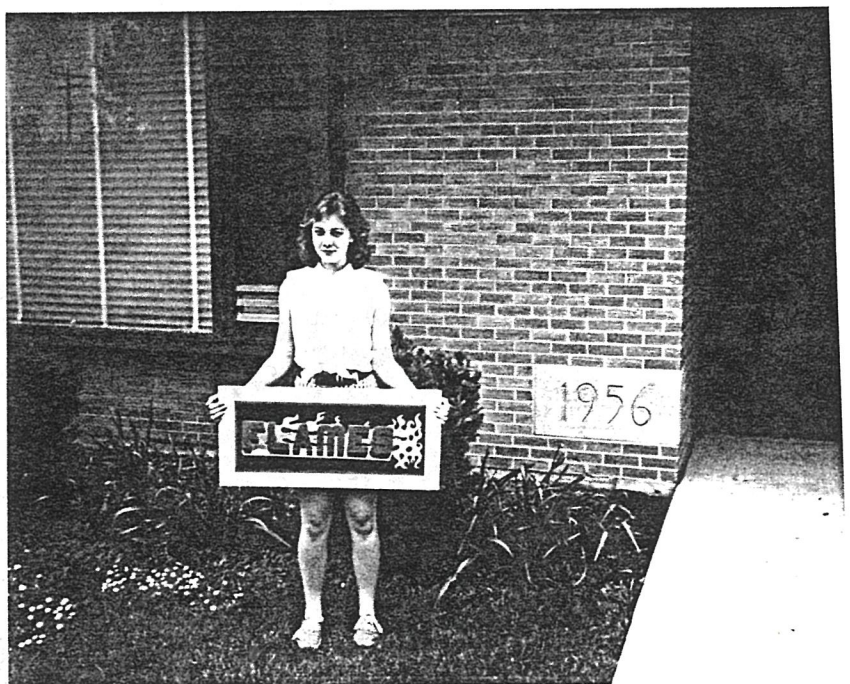

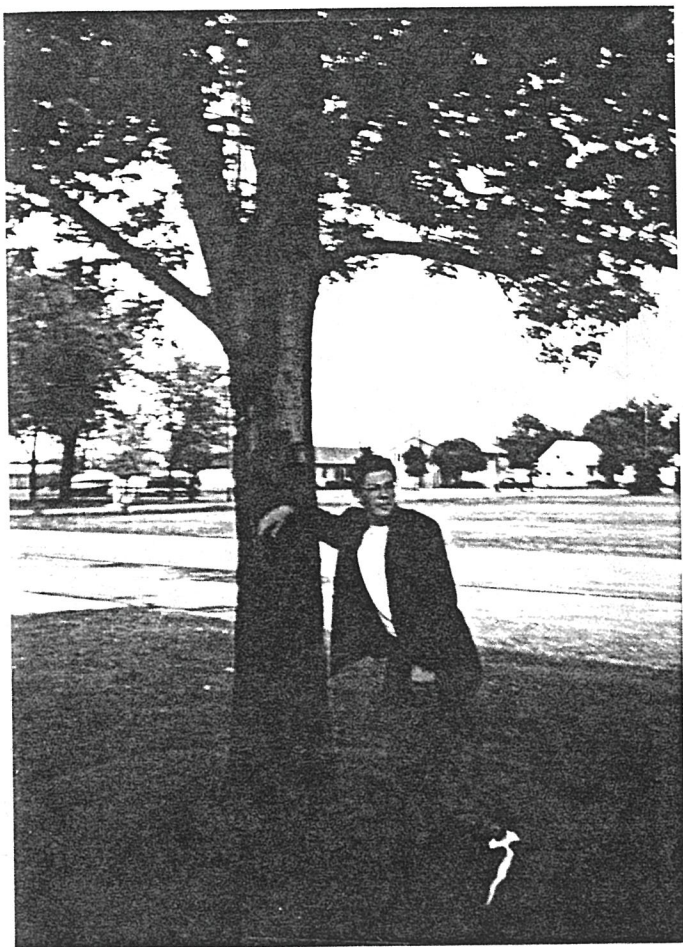
Most Popular: Emily McSweeny

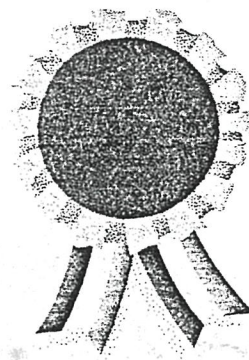

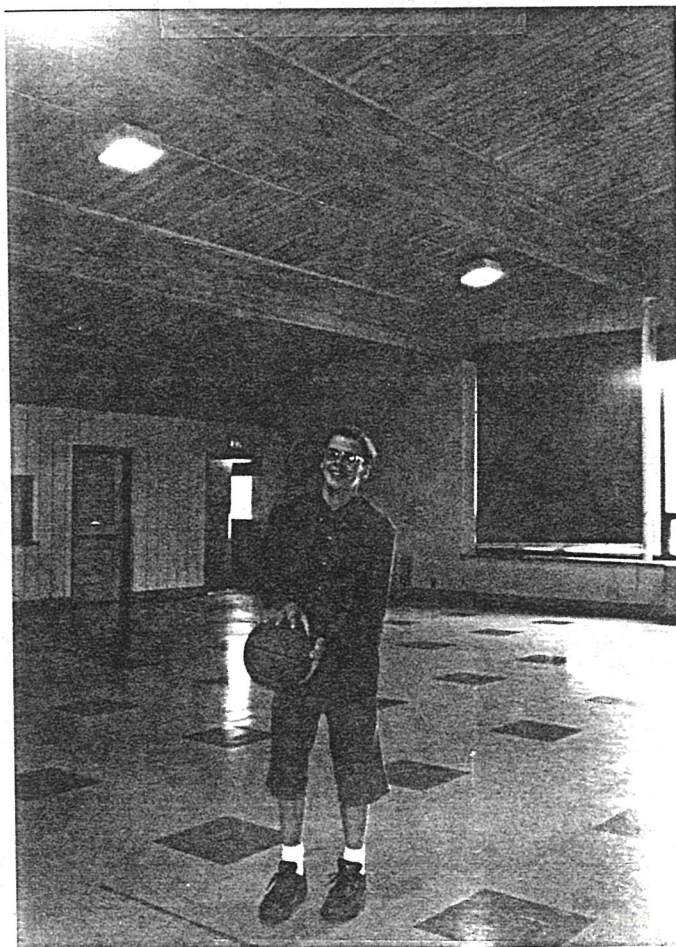
### Best Dressed: Wayne Schmidt

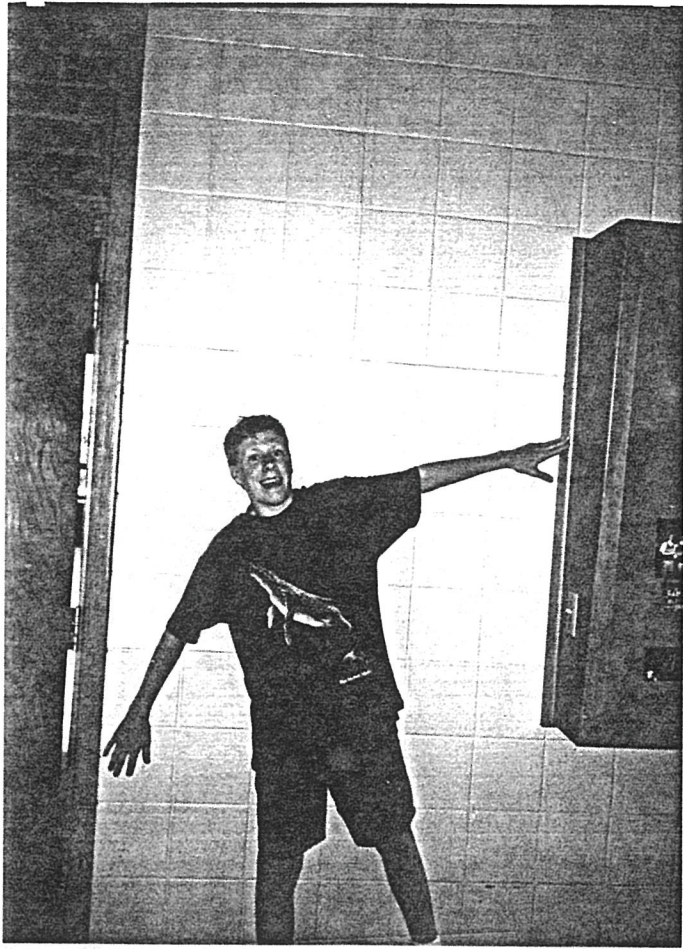


### Best Athlete: Craig Forsey

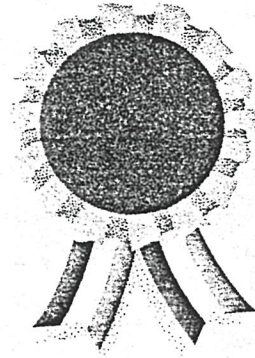

Almost unanimously, the class has picked Jeffrey Kroening. Every day he has entertained us with his jokes, silly dances, weird noises, and funny expressions.



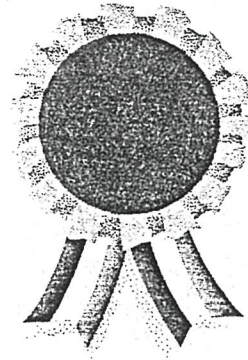
Teacher's Pet: Kathy Schildhauer

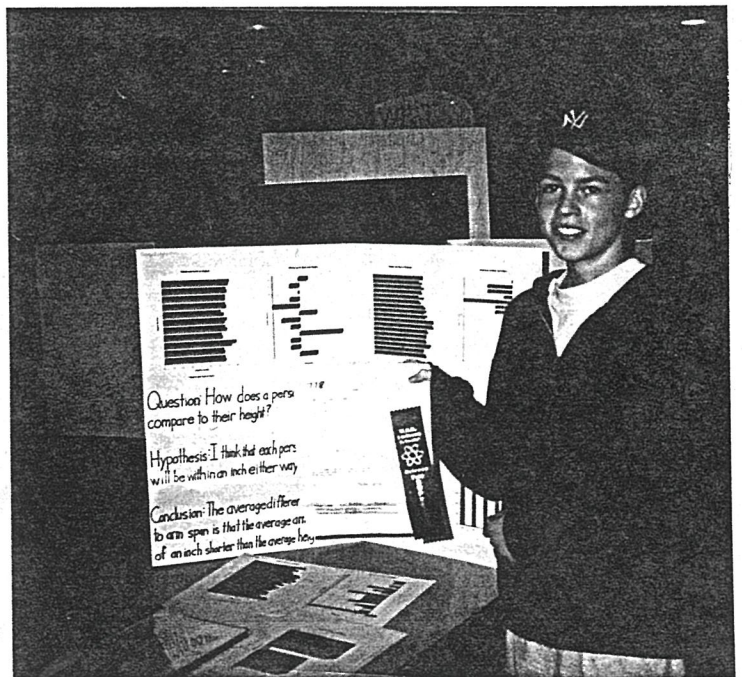


Most Likely To Succeed: Lynette Klettke
