








"T.O.Y.S. Visit - Mr. Underwood Comes to Call"



Mr. Devantier was nice enough to bring us in milk products to try - cheese and ice cream. All of us enjoyed his T.O.Y.S. visit!






"U.B. Math Mentor Pays a T.O.Y.S. Visit" - by Michael Fuerch




The highlight of his visit was the "ancient war-club" he brought in to show us. We thank him for the time he spent with our class and the lesson he prepared on Native Americans in our area.



Mrs. McQuillen seemed excited to visit Holy Ghost and see her program working. We thank her for taking the time to visit us and for developing such a great program!




Survey - "Would You be Interested in Taking Computer Classes at Holy Ghost" - by Amy Masterman & Jeanette Schmidt

We have made some new friends this year. Through our Scholastic News, we each have a pen pal from St. John's Elementary School in Lawrence, Kansas!




"The Christmas Luncheon" by Bethany Potter

"The Life of Principal Forsey" by Jeanette Schmidt






Top 5 Things About Pizza That Students Would Like To See Improve:

grades 5 - 8, who put in a great deal of time and planning.




"Fuerch's Factoids" by Michael Fuerch
