This award can be achieved by adding \$500 to your endowment all at once or by adding increments each year until you reach the \$500. There is no additional form, once you've added five units, the office will print your award and hold it for the Annual Communication. NOTE: this award is not retroactive so only units added after the 2025 Annual Communication are eligible.

With the adoption of Resolution No. 23, the positions of Senior and Junior Stewards are now added along with those of Marshal, Master of Ceremonies, and Musician, as optional. Form 23 is currently being revised by the By-Laws committee and is anticipated to be released in the March Newsletter. READ PORTIONS APPROPRIATE FOR YOUR LODGE

2025 ANNUAL COMMUNICATION RESULTS

Hold Over Resolution No. 4 – Adopted

This change allows a minimum of Fifty Lodges to call for a special session of Grand Lodge.

Resolution No. 1 – Not Adopted

This Resolution would have capped the profit from Officer Leadership Training at 10%, and any amount exceeding that to be transferred to incentives such as the Vanguard Award Program, or Texas Masonic Charities Foundation.

Resolution No. 2 – Adopted as Written, Amendment was Not Adopted

This Resolution requires the Grand Master to detail the reason for suspending or arresting the Charter of a Lodge.

Resolution No. 3 – Adopted as Amended

This Resolution creates an award to be given to members who contribute an additional \$500 to their existing Lodge Endowment.

Resolution No. 4 – Adopted

This Resolution strikes the phrase “Expiration date to which dues are paid by dues paying Master Masons shall be filled in by the Grand Secretary when the dues cards are prepared,” to make it easier to have permanent dues cards.

Resolution No. 5 – Adopted

A resolution relating to clarifying the process of how the Grand Secretary or Grand Treasurer may be removed from office and replaced.

Resolution No. 6 – Adopted

This Resolution adds the Report of the TMCF to reports that would be printed and available on Day One of the Grand Lodge Session and includes the presentation of that report to the Order of Business on Day One.

Resolution No. 7 – Adopted as Amended

This Resolution requires the Grand Treasurer to provide regular and more detailed financial reports.

Resolution No. 8 – Adopted

This Resolution gives the Grand Master the ability to extend the deadline for election and installation of Lodge officers in the event of a crisis.

Resolution No. 9 – Not Adopted

This Resolution would have deferred the procedures for a Masonic Disciplinary process from those of Title V in cases where any vagueness, doubt, or obvious disagreement arises in any provision, or between various provisions, to the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code and/or the Texas Rules of Civil Procedure, as applicable.

Resolution No. 10 – Not Adopted

This Resolution would have required that any Mason accused of a Masonic Disciplinary Violation to be tried in the Lodge wherein he holds membership regardless of where the alleged Masonic Disciplinary Violation occurred and would hold true for EAs and FCs.

Resolution No. 11 – Adopted

This Resolution requires that guilt in a Masonic Disciplinary Procedure be proved “beyond a reasonable doubt.”

Resolution No. 12 – Withdrawn

This Resolution would have extended the deadline for Statements of Availability up to and including November 15th. It would also limit the Nominations from the floor to the following circumstances: For any office that has no candidates, due to vacancy, death, or withdrawal.

Resolution No. 13 – Adopted

This resolution allows a “Mason laboring under Masonic disciplinary action” to be elected, appointed, and installed in an office, but would still prohibit him from receiving a Demit, a certificate of withdrawal or a certificate of good standing.

Resolution No. 14 – Adopted

This Resolution removes the requirement that the Grand Secretary’s signature be on the back of the dues card to make it easier to be a permanent card.

Resolution No. 15 – Adopted

This Resolution allows for the Regulation White Apron to be made from synthetic lambskin, silk, satin, or cotton, as well as the original real lambskin and have the option for rounded corners. It would also allow for the “All Seeing Eye (aka Eye of Providence)” or any of the symbols of Freemasonry appropriate to be displayed upon the bib or body of the apron.

Resolution No. 16 – Not Adopted

This Resolution would have allowed for the minutes of the Lodge to be made available for historical research with appropriate circumstances and permissions.

Resolution No. 17 – Adopted as Amended

This Resolution gives Lodges the option to, once again, include prescribed traditional Masonic Music within the degrees.

Resolution No. 18 – Withdrawn

This Resolution would have changed the current automatic expulsion as the result of a felony charge where further proceedings are deferred without entering an adjudication of guilt and places the defendant on probation, to allowing for the accused’s Home Lodge the option to suspend until successful completion of the probationary period and then reinstate.

Resolution No. 19 – Not Adopted

This Resolution would have allowed Lodge’s to receive upon request of the Grand Secretary’s Office a comprehensive report of the Lodge Endowment Membership Fund (EMF – Already Available).

Resolution No. 20 – Adopted

This Resolution requires that a Masonic Disciplinary Procedure be held within a year of the alleged offense, or a date mutually agreed upon.

Resolution No. 21 – Not Adopted, Amendment Not Adopted

This Resolution would have prevented a member from making themselves available to be elected to a Grand Lodge office in the subsequent year of an unsuccessful attempt to be elected.

Resolution No. 22 – Withdrawn as Moot

This Resolution would allow upon successful consolidation Bremond Lodge No. 350 and Pierce Lodge No. 144 to maintain the Pierce No. 144 and the Bremond name.

Resolution No. 23 – Adopted

This Resolution eliminates the requirement to have Senior and Junior Stewards as Lodge officers.

Resolution No. 24 – Tabled Until the Next Grand Annual Communication

This Resolution further defines the process by which a Grand Master may be suspended from office and his status once suspended.

Resolution No. 25 – Adopted

This Resolution allows for “New Business” specifically Resolutions to be dealt with on the First day of the Grand Lodge Session.



2025 GRAND ANNUAL COMMUNICATION ATTENDANCE

This year's Grand Annual Communication was again well attended. Last year we had the most votes present since 2017 and the most total attendees since well before that. This year, 2675 individuals registered, and the final credentials report on Saturday had 1675 Past Masters present and 542 lodges represented creating a near even split between Lodge votes and Past Master votes (Figure 1). These are 6% fewer votes and 11% fewer total attendees than last year, but it was still the most since pre-COVID with the exception of last year.




Figure 3. Attendee Years of Masonic Service




Figure 4. Highest Office of those Attending

Figures 2 and 3 show the attendee age distribution and the attendee years of Masonic service for this year's Grand Annual Communication. Overall, Figures 1, 2, and 3 are similar to what we've been seeing in recent years: a good fraction are older Past Masters balanced by a good portion are younger guys going through the lines. Figure 4 shows a similar result: the majority attending currently hold an office, but many have gone through the lines and are active in other ways.

Figure 2. 2025 Attendee Age Distribution




Figure 5 shows a map of the votes from this year's Grand Annual Communication. This map is fairly similar to the map of our overall membership, which is good as far as representation at Grand Lodge.





Figure 5. Map of the votes at this year's Grand Annual Communication.



Regarding lodge votes, for the 542 lodges that were represented, Figure 6 shows who cast the vote. As you would expect, most of the time it was WM, but we also had 99 Wardens holding lodge clickers and 116 proxies casting votes for the lodge.

Unfortunately, similar to last year, 195 of our lodges (26%) were not represented, even though every WM at their installation promises regular attendance at the Communications of Grand Lodge. 47% of those that didn't show up this year also didn't show up last year, and while you might think that these could just be dead lodges, 67%

of the lodges that didn't show this year have been performing degrees over the past year. They also are not all located at great distances as 72% of them are located within 200 miles of Waco.

Overall, this year's Grand Annual Communication was well-attended and decently represented the Masons of Texas. We again ran out of aprons. Maybe we can get that Grand Secretary of ours to buy some new ones...with long strings.

LODGE SPOTLIGHT:

Anahuac Lodge No. 995 - Wreaths Across America

In April 2024, the Grand Lodge Trustees approved Wreaths Across America as a program for Lodges to participate in. This initiative offers a meaningful way to honor our veterans and showcase Masonry in a positive light to our communities. We're proud to share that Anahuac Lodge No. 995 was the first Lodge to sponsor this program and host a wreath-laying ceremony at a local cemetery. The results were as follows:

392 wreaths sponsored, ensuring every veteran in the cemetery was honored.

250 people attended; an incredible turnout given the town's population of 1,950.

Dispensation was granted by PGM Tommy Chapman to wear aprons during the ceremony, increasing the Lodge's visibility while denoting the Fraternity's respect for veterans. These efforts were featured on the front page of the Baytown Star, Anahuac Progress, and East Chambers Times. The impact of this initiative extended beyond the ceremony itself. Because of the positive visibility, the Lodge received three visitors and is expecting at least one petition. Additionally, as \$5 per wreath goes back to the sponsoring organization, our lodge raised \$2,400! If your Lodge would like to participate in Wreaths Across America Day - Saturday, December 13, 2025, NOW is the time to start planning! Here are some key steps to ensure your success:

1. Choose a cemetery and coordinate with its board to determine the number of veterans interred.
2. Allocate sponsors for all veterans' wreaths at the cemetery.
3. Place orders before the wreath order cut-off date: December 2, 2025.

This program is an incredible way to honor our nation's heroes, strengthen bonds within the community, and increase the visibility of your Lodge. 
The 2025 Matching Grants Cycle will open January 1st, 2025. In preparation for accepting grants from you and the Foundation submitting payments to your lodge, we need your help.

1. Any appointed member of your lodge can apply for grants from the Foundation for your lodge. Only 1 grant per category will be accepted (1 Scholarship, 1 Community Grant, and 1 Teacher Honorarium - Total of 3).
2. Once approved, payments will be sent via email to the secretaries of record only according to Grandview. The original requester, if different than the secretary, will not receive these instructions. Please ensure your secretary's email addresses and cellular numbers are up to date in Grandview by October 15th to prevent any delays. As of today, there are approximately 40 lodges with missing secretary information.
3. Lastly, there will be improvements in the Google forms application process including confirmation of submission and status. Likewise, additional links will be provided to you for bank routing or mailing instructions via Melio. Bank transfers are processed quicker and cheaper than physical checks via USPS, we hope you will consider that option.

Your prompt attention to accurate information is appreciated. We are hopeful this pre-work will be speed processing of your requests in 2025.

SECRETARY INSTRUCTIONS

The following information is intended primarily for the Secretary but may be meaningful to many of your members.

Lodge Suspense System:

Suspense Dates – Lodge Secretaries should create a suspense system (a reminder system) to alert the Lodge that certain documents are due. This list is offered as a “starter kit” for your consideration:

- a. January – The Worshipful Master should appoint a Committee on Members in Arrears (Article 319a).
- b. May 31 – W. B. and Brandon Carrell Award nominations may be submitted to the Grand Lodge Committee on Public Education for evaluation and recommendation to the Grand Lodge Trustees (Article 14b).
- c. Mid-June – Look for the Annual Returns Format from GL. (Downloaded from the Grand View System after June 24th. Notify the GS staff if you need the returns mailed as a printout).
- d. June 23 – Lodge elections must be completed at the last stated meeting prior to midnight of June 23 (Art. 292). Notify us of the new Lodge Officers immediately so they can be printed in the Directory of Constituent Lodges (do not wait for installation). Submission will be available on the Grand View System from May 24 through midnight June 23.
- e. June 23 – Endowed Membership checks must be in the Office of the Grand Secretary by June 23 to start earning interest in order to receive returns by the next year (Art. 318a). Changes to the amount of endowments must be voted on at the same meeting as the Lodge elections, and notification to the Grand Lodge must be before June 24th. Endowed Membership applications received at the Grand Lodge on or after June 24 must be for the amount that the Lodge reported.
- f. July 15 – Statements of Availability due GS Office. (6a).
- g. July 31 – Lodge installations must be performed from June 24 to prior to midnight July 31 (Art. 298).
- h. August 15 – Annual Returns Report due to Grand Lodge (Art. 493).
- i. August 15 – Resolutions due in GS Office (Art. 172).
- j. September 15 – Lodge Minimum Audit Report 71 is due to the GS Office NLT September 15 (Art. 284).
- k. September 15 – Vanguard Applications are due to the DDGM NLT September 15 and to the Grand Secretary NLT September 30 (refer to Vanguard Application Instructions).
- l. October 1 – Lodge By-Laws that must be reviewed by the GL Committee on By-Laws due the GS Office NLT October 1 (Art. 219).
- m. Nov 15 – Form 990-N, Electronic Notice (e-Postcard), must be filed with the IRS by Lodges that have gross receipts of \$50,000 or less or do not meet the requirements for filing the IRS 990 or IRS 990EZ. (Lodges must file the appropriate Form 990 no later than the 15th day of the fifth month following the close of the organization’s fiscal year.)
- n. Dec. 28 – Proxy Certificates are due the GS Office NLT December 28 (Art. 4). You should always appoint a Proxy (in case of an emergency) but he would not vote if any of the top three officers were available. Remember, each brother can have no more than four votes. Therefore, a sitting Worshipful Master cannot be a proxy for another Lodge.
