Do you recall ever being advised not to look for your ball if it is headed

toward trouble? Why would anyone give such advice? Should you automatically hit a provisional?

As defined in Rule 18 of the USGA RULES of Golf, a provisional ball (which must be announced as such) is appropriate when you believe your ball may be out of bounds or lost <u>outside a penalty</u> area.

In our concern for maintaining the pace of play, we often decide to hit a provisional ball when an errant shot is headed towards the woods. In most cases on our course, the wooded areas that line our fairways are lateral hazards marked with red stakes.

Consider the following scenario –a player hits a drive on Hole #18 that veers to the right, headed for the woods. The player plays a provisional ball thinking that if the ball is not

found, the provisional would save time and might come into play. Is the provisional appropriate? Only if the player believes the ball is lost outside the hazard (in this case outside the woods). If the trajectory clearly takes the ball into the woods, the ball is in the lateral hazard and the rule for relief is applied and the provisional was not appropriate. But what if you're not 100% sure where it crossed? Estimate the spot to the best of your ability and take the drop for a lateral penalty.

The above scenario was flawed from the beginning since the provisional ball was unnecessary and inappropriate. Let's suppose the area was not a red lateral hazard and the player actually finds her ball barely into the trees. Does she have the option of playing the provisional? Unfortunately NO. If the player opted to take the provisional, she would incur a two stroke

penalty for hitting the wrong ball and would have to correct the situation immediately. Once you find your ball, unless, of course, it is out of bounds, you MUST play it. In some cases where you hit into heavy grasses or brush, you may be better off not looking for your ball!
