Membership numbers are on the rise as more women golfers at the club learn about us. Recently, the WGA By-Laws and Standing Rules were distributed to the membership. All members are encouraged to read these documents; the By-Laws address our governance, whereas, the Standing Rules focus on our competitive activities.

The Standing Rules spell out how our weekly games are to be organized and winners rewarded. Every play day will have a winner who will receive Pro Shop credit for her win. In addition, an optional \$2 cash buy-in for the game is offered and the winner will always share the cash with the player with the lowest putts....so, no such thing as a "gimme" putt on play days— as noted in the Standing Rules, "All putts must be holed out."

Finally, to our new members who don't have a GHIN # yet.... WE WANT YOU TO COME OUT EVEN IF YOU ARE NOT IN THE GAME SO YOU CAN GET THE **5 SCORES NEEDED TO ESTABLISH YOUR** HANDICAP.

and the putting green.

Each month you will find a section that deals with the Rules of Golf. Many of these rules will be well known by the more experienced golfer, but for many of our new members who

are also new to golf, these basic rules should be helpful.
Since in all of our weekly games the cash pot is
shared with the player with the low putts, it would
seem appropriate to start with a few rules about putting

- Once all players are on or just off the green, it is customary to play honors, meaning, the player farthest out from the hole putts first.
- As a courtesy, a player should mark her ball once on the green, placing the marker directly behind the ball.
- 3) Damage from ball marks, animal marks, etc. on the putting green may be repaired.
- 4) Once the ball is on the green, all strokes following are considered putts, even if your ball goes off the green. Any club may be used to hit the ball back onto the green, but it is still a putt.
- A player may use a putter from off the green.
   However, pitch marks in the line of a putt, may not be repaired. Pitch marks are common around

the fringe of the green when the ground is soft. They look like scuff marks.
