Each month while researching topics for the rules review, a golf article that addresses

recent questions pops up and provides the best explanation. Following is a timely excerpt from an article by Matt Chivers on *Golf Magic* about playing out of mud.

"You can get some very tough breaks in golf and sometimes, the quality of your round can be determined by how lucky you get.

Luck often levels itself out, but if you suffer from some unfortunate circumstances on the golf course, the rules of golf can sometimes bail you out. If your ball and your situation suit the guidelines of the

rules of golf, then you can occasionally be saved. This is why knowing as many rules as possible is so important. However, the rules can also be a cruel mistress and it is important to also apply them correctly,



such as in the situation pictured where a ball has been found in a large area of thick mud... it is an example of the

rough breaks that you can get on the golf course. The question is: Are you allowed free relief from the mud? **The answer is, unfortunately, no.** This is just very unlucky and you are not allowed to pick and place your ball in a better lie."

The bottom line is—there is no relief from mud...period! It doesn't

matter if your ball is in it or your feet are in it or your ball is in a muddy footprint. The only relief would be to take an unplayable lie for a one **stroke penalty.** What about relief from a muddy tire track made by a golf cart or maintenance vehicle? Unless there is a local rule to the contrary, there is no relief. A related question might be, if I take an unplayable lie, am I permitted to clean my muddy ball? Yes, according to the Rules of Golf, "Before a golfer is about to take relief, a golfer can clean the ball. This includes any situation where you are taking relief: from a hazard, from an unplayable lie, from a plugged lie".

OUR GALS HAVE TRUE GRIT... many definitions of true grit include the words goals, passion and perseverance. One definition states that a person who works really hard to follow through on commitments has "true grit" and that certainly describes the WGA members who stepped up to play in Ladies Challenge Cup this season as well as those who participated in the Mars/Venus Tournament. As fate would have it, we were handed a "Double Whammy".

Our final match of the LCC season was the most difficult versus WCC at the very difficult TPC. The results of that season closer was indeed very disappointing as were the end of season results. Nevertheless, we met our goal of full participation and followed through with our commitment to have our club represented in LCC during this formative year of the LW WGA. Special thanks to Marion Nojek and Pam Almandoz for coordinating and captaining respectively and for mentoring so many of our ladies for whom LCC was a new experience. The final standings for our LCC division are shown below with the division first place winners in gross and net circled.

The MGA brought out their best to compete against us in the Mars/Venus tournament on August 20 and with their best, they "bested" us! The 6,6,6 format was scored similarly to how the Ryder Cup is scored...in fact, our competition was kind of a mini-Ryder Cup with alternate shot, best ball and scramble all in one day. Each six hole segment was only worth one point, so if our girls tied on 5 of 6 holes and lost the 6th, they lost the whole point. The weakest player on their team had an index of 14.8 with the strongest with a +0.3 and the majority of players owning single digit handicaps. While our gentlemen players dominated this event, every one of our teams got on the board. In fact, kudos to the teams who actually split the match with 1.5 points...that's true grit!

The best way to summarize the above competitive outcomes is to borrow from the Chicago Cubs baseball fans who for years and years ended their season with "Wait Until Next year!"

Footnote: That phrase had to be retired in 2016 when the Cubs finally won the World Series breaking the drought of over 100 years between World Series wins.


