FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

We are at the gateway to the best part of the golf year as we begin the month of May. In spite of temporary inconveniences resulting from the recent aerification of the course, wonderful golf awaits us in May.

Our WGA has bloomed as has the foliage around us. Our membership now stands at 29 members—very respectable for a start-up organization.

Our second quarterly general meeting was held on April 26th. The primary order of business was to report on the state of our organization. While attendance at the meeting was disappointing, those present did benefit from a direct question and answer period with our GM

Troy Muller.

Troy reported that club membership is on target relative to budget. Currently the membership sits at approximately 375 members in all categories, with a cap of 500 members down the road. He also said that the plan to replace carts this season has been pushed back to next year. The range fee will continue to be mandatory at the start of each golf season. And speaking of the range, the pro shop personnel are monitoring the range to assure that only members are utilizing the facility.

Following Troy's discussion, we continued with the regular order of business. The minutes of our February meeting (which all of you received via email) were approved and the Treasurer's report was presented. We have decided that our WGA, a

not for profit group, will have a minimal amount of income and therefore does not need to register as a 501c organization, saving us the \$250 fee the IRS required. We are awaiting a check from Invite (formerly ClubCorp) central office for a check in the amount of the dues collected from WGA members. This will allow us to set up a WGA checking account from which we will pay the club for the credits posted to winners. Members who won a game during the months of February and March have already been credited \$5 in the pro shop for each win. Winners from April can expect their credits to be posted in the near future.

Our BYOB nine hole couples events will continue with the next one scheduled for May 15th at 3:30 pm. In the future we will schedule these events every other month and encourage our couples to support the club and sign up for the club's couples games planned for the alternate months.

Our next tournament is just around the corner...less than 2 weeks away! This one is one you don't want to miss! Let's enjoy golf!



Our membership includes many who are brand new to the game, some who have played casually without much attention to rules, and those who are experienced and more than casually knowledgeable

about the rules. Therefore, the goal of this column will be to provide a rules review which will be tailored to the needs of each group.

Basics for the Beginner:

- 14 club maximum (which includes the putter); you are penalized one stroke for every hole you play if you are over the number of clubs allowed.
- When teeing off, your ball must be between the two tee markers, but you can stand outside of them. You may tee your ball up to two clublengths behind the markers, but not an inch in front.
- You may not clean your ball until you reach the green; the only exception is when you are taking relief.

Golf Etiquette for Everyone:

- Never talk during another player's swing.
- Do not yell out following a shot (unless you are yelling "fore"). Even if boisterous behavior doesn't bother your playing partners, there are other people on the course who may be within earshot.
- Be aware of your shadow on the putting green.
 Don't stand in a place that causes your shadow to be cast across another player or that player's putting line.
- Never walk through a playing partner's putting line. Your footprints might alter the path of a partner's putt. Step over the putting line, or walk around (behind) the partner's ball. When a playing partner is swinging or putting, try to stand out of his or her line of vision, and remain quiet during the other golfer's swing.

A "Did You Know" for veteran & new players:

Sand and loose soil are only classed as loose impediments on the green. This means that if you're on the fringe wanting to putt and, for example, there is sand from a greenside bunker on your line, you may wipe away the sand or loose soil from the putting green only but can't touch any that is lying on the fringe. The only time you would be allowed to brush away sand on your line on the fringe is if it arrived there after your ball had come to rest, perhaps as a result of another player's bunker shot spraying sand all over your line before you get to play.
