FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK

Happy May Day, Cinco de Mayo and welcome to the start of the Texas Summer! As Texas residents, we all know that we don't have to wait for the summer solstice in June to start reaching those very hot days. Therefore, a reminder to be aware of the need to stay hydrated is not premature.

Although we are already three months into our 3rd season, we are still in the process of perfecting our organizational documents. Typically circumstances that arise are often the signal that our By-Laws and Standing Rules are in need of revision. Currently our By-Laws outline the duties of all of the elected WGA Executive Board Members. In addition, the process for replacement by appointment by the President when an office is vacated is included for most. What is not included is a process for the replacement of the President when the position is vacated during a term.

There are other practices that should be officially accepted and included in either the By-Laws or the Standing Rules. Both of these documents require a vote by the membership to adopt any changes. It is the responsibility of your Board to identify, formulate language, and present proposed changes. Recently, the membership approved recommended changes in the standing rules...but, our work was not done. When there are Inconsistencies in our practices, structured rules and procedures bring consistency to the operation of the organization. Therefore, you will soon be asked once again to vote on changes in the By-Laws and Standing Rules.

However, there may be some differences of opinion about some of the Standing Rules being presented. Among the topics where opinions may differ are giving putts and ordering by handicap for both low net and stableford. All changes will be presented as single May, 2024 Volume 3, Issue 4

items for approval rather than voting on all collectively. A rationale for the Board's endorsement of the change will also be included. This ballot will be distributed electronically within the next two weeks. Watch for it and respond...this is <u>your</u> WGA.

Let's hope our flowers flourish and our course dries out so we can enjoy some gardening and golf!



Ladies Challenge Cup Update


Our LCC players faced two challenges at home in April against Elkins Lake and Walden on Lake Conroe respectively. However, the second match against Walden was postponed due to rain and re-scheduled for May 8th.

The match against Elkins Lake yielded a double victory in both gross and net. The results are shown on the adjacent scoreboard.

As you can see, our Lake Windcrest team squeaked out a victory with 45.5 over Elkins Lake 44.5 in gross points and dominated in net 49.5 to 40.5.

In addition to the rescheduled match on May 8th against Walden on Lake Conroe, an away match versus Bentwater is scheduled for Friday, May 17.

Be sure to respond promptly when LCC coordinator Donna Moore puts out a call for players so Team Captain Shirley Robertson can determine the most efficient pairings.





Lake Windcrest was well represented at the most recent Interclub event held at Willow Creek on Thursday, April 25. The maximum number that each club is permitted to bring is 11 which is the number of players who participated at Willow Creek.

It is possible, however, that additional players over the 11 may be permitted if there are open spots where a club doesn't fill its quota. Therefore, since signups are taken in order of receipt, a person coming in as number 12 could still possibly be included. Therefore, don't be discouraged if you are put on the "wait list" — you might still get to play.

Individual prizes are awarded in every flight and the top four scores from each club's "delegation" are used to determine a club's point standing (see adjacent chart). In spite of a course with water on almost all holes and a multitude of bunkers, we were fortunate to have a 1st place winner in Charmelle Vondrak who earned 37 stableford points! Congratulations Charmelle!

Once again, a question from one of our own WGA members has prompted addressing the question of how balls that land in penalty areas are treated. Specifically, the question raised was, if you land in penalty area and you feel you could play the ball (which is now one of two options), do you get relief based on the embedded ball rule? The answer in an emphatic NO. As referenced before, you have two options...if you are in a penalty area, you may either play the ball as it lies or take your one stroke penalty and move two club-lengths from the edge of the penalty area, no closer to the hole. There are only those two options...no other rules apply. If you opt to play the ball as it lies, you may remove loose impediments that might affect your stroke, but you may not hold back bushes or small tree limbs to improve your lie. Sometimes that means backing into some prickly vegetation and restrictive swing situations. That's when you ask yourself which is likely the best choice...penalty stroke or playing it as it lies?
