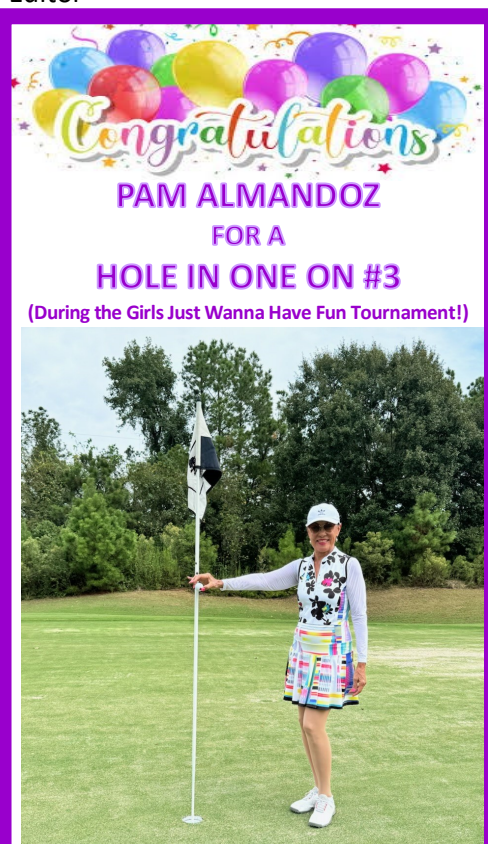

Attention to the Rules of Golf in our newsletter has been on the back burner of late since our focus has been on the fun aspects of the game. But, recently one of our members who is relatively new to golf commented how she really wants to learn the rules. So, we are back with our section on reviewing the rules. Many of the rules to be covered, while well known by the seasoned golfer, are meaningful for the newcomers to the game and even regular players who are still building on their knowledge of the rules. Below is a rule that is not commonly known and is relevant this time of year. The topic is pitch marks so defining a pitch mark is basic to the discussion. A pitch mark is a small dent or indentation made by a golf ball when it lands. Following rain or heavy watering around the greens, pitch marks on the fringe area around the green may occur with frequency. The question arises, can pitch marks be repaired if I am planning to putt from off the green? **The rule does not allow for a player to repair a pitch mark on the fringe that is in her line of play.** Pitch marks on the green, however, not only may be repaired, but players are encouraged to repair pitch marks wherever they may be on the green, even if they did not cause them. Pitch marks are important to repair quickly because they can cause the green to become bubbly and take weeks to repair, whereas a pitch mark that's repaired right away can be fully fixed within 24 hours. The final two Ladies Challenge Cup matches were held in September, only days apart due to the need for re-scheduling. Our last home contest against Woodlands Country Club was held on Monday, September 9th with our final match of the season at Falcon Point on September 19th. Team Captain Shirley Robertson had extremely limited resources for the final match, having to recruit “deep bench” players. Home course advantage is no misnomer...our strength has always been net competition and our net performances at home are the strongest. We held our own against the Woodlands Country Club in net, winning net 50.5 to 39.5 while succumbing to the strength of the Country Club in gross, with WCC dominating with a score of 61.5 to 28.5. Our final match at Falcon Point was true to the name....a challenge! As mentioned above, seasoned participants were limited. In addition, the course was very difficult resulting in losses in both gross and net...with Falcon Point winning gross 50.5 to 39.5 and net 51.5 to 38.5. Worthy of note... Shirley Robertson earned 12.5 gross points and 11 net points for her team entirely on her own...an amazing performance. Below are the scoreboards from both matches and the season record for Lake Windcrest showing the ultimate gross and net season winners as well. Still ahead, LCC President’s Cup and ProAm Events on October 23rd and 30th respectively. Please step up if Shirley reaches out to you to play.

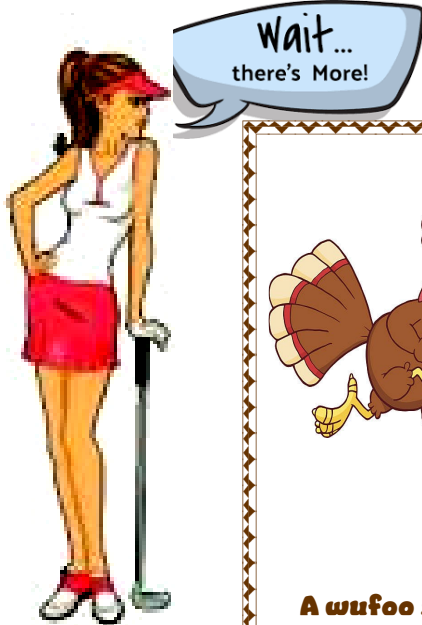
TOURNAMENT TIMETABLE
