FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

Everyone was in the holiday spirit as we gathered on Saturday, December 3rd to play some fun golf and recognize golf achievements of the 2022 season. Kudos to Tournament Co-chairs Patty Moncrief and Marion Nojek for planning a lovely end of year celebration.

Having a quorum present allowed us to squeeze in a quick vote amending our Standing Rules to correct an omission in the language about eagles and holes-in-one. The approved change specifies that eagles and holes-in-one are valid for WGA recognition only when they occur at Lake Windcrest on a playday. Keep in mind, however, members who have agreed to being part of the "hole-in-one" option through the club should apprise themselves of that criteria which is different.

While our official 2022 season ended on Saturday, Deb Yarbrough and Cindy Bailey have volunteered to organize informal golf during our offseason. The signup site has been expanded through the end of January and can be used to sign up for these informal golf gatherings. Thanks Deb and Cindy for taking on these interim golf responsibilities!

You may wonder—If these offseason games are unofficial, how do we handle scores during this time? It's important for players to make sure that all regular rounds of golf (meaning anytime a player plays her own ball from tee through the green) be posted at ghin. Remember if you complete at least 7 holes, you should post a 9 hole score. Similarly, if you have played 14 holes, you should post an 18 hole score. What to do about those holes that were not played? Apply the following rule...on any hole not played, take par plus two strokes for your score.


