

Questions, questions, questions! It is probable that almost all, if not all, questions raised in the game of golf are rules questions. That being said, being able to answer a rules question can be very complicated. A good example occurred recently in the PGA Championship Tournament. Even the most savvy rules players may have found that situation a challenge to resolve.

Many wondered why the PGA player, Will Zalatoris, had to play his ball off the cart path. Without being there, the viewer didn't have the necessary perspective. While there were a number of options available to Zalatoris, the bottom-line was,

he could have taken "free relief" from the cart path but it must be the closest point of relief, no closer to the hole and that point of relief put him pretty much back where he was when he took a one stroke penalty for an unplayable lie. Taking the closest point of relief isn't always an improvement as was the case in this situation.

Referencing "free relief" above takes us into yet another area where many players, even the most experienced, have questions. Free relief is allowed when the ball is in the general area and there is interference by an abnormal course condition (all man-made obstacles such as drains, cart paths, electrical boxes, etc.). One easy way to remember how many club-lengths of relief a player is entitled to taking is "if it is free relief, it is one club-length, if you pay for it (with a penalty stroke), it is two club-lengths.

Finally, another question that frequently arises is— why are some penalties one stroke and others two strokes? General penalties are always two stroke penalties...so what is a general penalty? A general penalty (which is a loss of hole in match play or a two-stroke penalty in stroke play) is usually applied for a breach of most rules. For example, player A on the green hits player B's ball also on the green, incurs a two stroke penalty because hitting another player's ball when both are on the green is an infraction of the rules. One stroke penalties are usually the result of "errant execution". Player A hits her ball into a wooded area marked with red stakes—that would be errant execution of her shot and allows Player A to take lateral relief, no closer to the hole for a penalty of one stroke (by the way two club-lengths because it is costing her a penalty stroke). It is always a good practice when a rules question arises, to verify the remedy with your fellow players or in competitive situations when agreement can't be reached, seek the answer from the golf professional.



Ladies Challenge Cup



For many of our WGA members, Ladies Challenge Cup is a competition which they hear about but know little about. It is the only competitive opportunity we have outside of our club at this time. The match play format is still unfamiliar to quite a few of our new members although our most recent tournament, The Round Robin, included match play. Ladies Challenge Cup is match play, hole by hole competition for a point per hole in both gross and net, and involves 10 Golf Clubs. The competition is divided into two divisions. The Club with the most gross points the previous season heads Division I and the Club with the second highest number of gross points heads Division II. Based on their place in the final gross point standings, the remaining clubs are divided between the two Divisions—we are in Division 1.

Each division is comprised of five teams and therefore, each team will have a bye during the course of the season. It happens that our bye was in Round 2, so actually the last issue announced Falcon Point as our second round competitor...that was incorrect....actually, our match against Falcon Point was our match for Round 3. The challenge in Challenge Cup was certainly a major factor in our Round 3 away match at Falcon Point. While we won both gross and net by slim margins at home, our performance away at Falcon Point was disappointing...very difficult course for our players. What you see below are the final results after Round 2 and that does not reflect true standings because only three teams of the five have completed matches against two other clubs. As evidenced below, Woodlands CC and Lake Windcrest each have had a bye, WCC in Round 1 and LW in Round 2.

Our statistics for Round 3 will not show up until Round 3 is completed by the other clubs in our Division. Our team coordinator, Marion Nojek is seeking players for our 4th round which begins with an away match against Augusta Pines on June 24. Players must play to a 25 handicap in order to be eligible. Good luck to all who will be representing us at Augusta Pines! Play well and most of all have fun!
