

There is always a wealth of material to choose from in writing this column each month. The challenge is to

choose topics which are relevant to our members...that includes review for established golfers and instruction for players new to the game.

To begin this discussion, the topic is instructional for both the seasoned golfer and the newcomer...moving a ball marker on the green which interferes with the line of another player's putt.

It is not uncommon to see players try to skip a step. In other words, seeing a ball on the green which has yet to be marked, recognizing it will be in another player's line and using the putter head to mark the ball and at the same time setting the distance to place the ball and the marker. Skipping steps such as noted above, is awkward and can result in clumsy handling of the putter and fumbling the ball. In addition, an important component to moving the spot of the ball is omitted. This same component is frequently omitted even when the marker is already down...too many golfers fail to use a fixed object from off the green to line up the putter head when moving the marker. Without that fixed object (such as a tree or post) to re-set the angle of the putter head, the ball could be

replaced in the wrong place and that would constitute a general penalty of two strokes. Therefore, including the step of aligning the clubhead with a stationary object OFF the green is a required step in the process of moving the marker out of the way of another's putt line.

The previous discussion addressed moving a marker already placed on the green, but there are a number of important issues that are simply related to marking your ball, period. The recommended procedure for marking a ball on the green is to mark it directly behind the ball. (To place the marker anywhere else, such as in front or to the side, to designate where the ball was, even though this is legal is not recommended.



Marking in front of the ball may alter the green in some way and is discouraged. When a player chooses

to putt her golf ball with the ball marker still in her line and hits the marker, the deflected golf ball must be played from where it ends up on the putting surface. If the ball being marked is accidentally moved no penalty is assessed. To move a marker, it should be placed one or more full clubhead lengths to one side.

Take note, however, if a player drops

her marker on the golf ball and moves it, the penalty is one stroke (all the more reason not to skip steps). However, there is no penalty if a marker is knocked away accidentally by such forces as the wind, an opponent or even an animal. The player that marks her ball and then fumbles it as she tries to pick it up suffers no penalty. But the player that even by accident kicks her ball when making a movement to lift it is penalized, since under the rules this was not caused by an attempt to lift the ball.

It is a one-stroke penalty to mark a ball by placing the marker more than an inch behind the ball. Finally, If a player fails to employ a marker and instead decides to use a certain blemish or distinguishable spot on the green as a reference point, then a one-stroke penalty is the result of such action. Players may elect to use the toe of one of their own golf clubs or other objects as a marker without penalty. Who would have thought there would be so many rules about a marker on the green!



Below is the latest information available on club standings in our division. However, it is necessary to note that Augusta Pines has completed four matches, while all of the other clubs in Division Two (including us)

have only completed three of the four. The best way to compare our performance is to look at the performance of the other clubs who have completed three matches to date.

Our final LCC match is scheduled against Woodlands Country Club on August 5th at home and August 12th at the TPC. Good luck to all who have stepped up to represent Lake Windcrest in this very challenging final match.














C & D level players) and a pro. With the blessings of our GM Troy Muller who provided the team shirts for the two days, our Pro, Brett Williams, joined the ladies to
