

## **Teaching Methodology**

Two different approaches to teaching Tajweed:

- i. Noorani Qaida then move onto the Mushaf
- ii. Start with the Quran and learn the rules as they appear

In this course both approaches are combined.

- No specific Noorani Qaida or Tajweed book
- Use the customized notes
- Uthmani Script
- Indo/Pak Script examples used to highlight different writing styles

#### Course Structure

Learning Tajweed can be broken down into 2 parts:

#### 20% Theoretical

#### 80% Practical

- Listening to and reading the examples
- Repeating after the teacher
- Practicing the rules
- Implementing the rules \*

- \* Try to implement one rule at a time so as not to overwhelm oneself.



Recite with Tajweed

#### Speeds of Recitation

in Arabic. مَرَاتِبُ الْقِرَاءَة



reading the Quran in a slow speed and following all the rules of Tajweed. This is the best form of recitation as it allows us to ponder and reflect on the meaning. reading the Quran in a speed that is between Tahqeeq and Had'r.

reading the Quran in a fast speed while observing all the rules of Tajweed. All the rules must be followed, and care must be taken to not shorten any words or letters.



Tarteel ترتيل – reading the Quran with Tajweed & in a slow harmonious manner.

#### What is Tajweed

According to Al-Mawrid Arabic-English dictionary, the word Tajweed means:

- Intonation
- Reciting
- Recital
- Modulation

The word can also be translated "betterment", "proficiency", "enhancement" or "to make something better"

In the context of Quran recitation, Tajweed means to recite that Quran the way it was revealed and the way it was meant to be recited. This means:

- Pronouncing each letter properly (from its point of articulation)
- Giving each letter of the Quran its proper rights and dues
- Shortening or lengthening the letters as required
- Observing all the rules used in Quran recitation



#### Why Learn Tajweed

And recite the Quran (aloud) in a slow, (pleasant tone and) style. (Surah Al-Muzzammil, verse 4) [Hilali]

Tarteel ترتيل - reading the Quran with Tajweed & in a slow harmonious manner.

Those to whom We have given the Book recite it with its true recital. (Surah Al-Baqarah, verse 121) [Sahih International]

#### Types of Mistakes

A mistake in our Quran Recitation is called Lahn (Lahn) in Arabic. The word Lahn means "a grammatical mistake in the rules of a language".


Types of Mistakes in Quran Recitation

Clear Mistakes

اللَّحْنُ الجَلِي

these are the obvious mistakes that are made during recitation. They may or may not change the meaning of the words. These types of mistakes are forbidden.

Hidden Mistakes



these are mistakes or errors that do not change the meaning of the words; however, these affect the beautification of the recitation. These types of mistakes are disliked.





#### Clear Mistakes

There are several types of clear mistakes. A few examples of clear mistakes are:

- 1) Changing any letter to another letter (similar sound or non-similar sound) such as interchanging letters. For example, changing the word ٱلْحَمْدُ to the word
- 2) Changing a vowel sign to a different vowel sign, e.g. changing the word أَنْعَمْتُ to the word
- 3) Changing a Sukoon to a vowel sign, e.g. changing the word تَجْرِى to the word
- 4) Changing a Vowel sign to a Sukoon, e.g. changing the word لَهُبٍ to the word لَهُبٍ
- أَعْبُدُو to the word أَعْبُدُ to the word أَعْبُدُ Adding an extra letter, either to a word or on its own e.g. changing the word
- 6) Deleting a letter, either from a word or any deleting a standalone letter (like ع). For example, changing the word إِنَّا to the word إِنَّا
- 7) Adding or deleting a Shaddah e.g. changing the word إِيَّاكَ to the word

#### **Hidden Mistakes**

Lahn Khafee or the hidden mistakes occur in the application of the Tajweed rules and although the meaning of the words do not change, these affect the beautification of the Quran recitation. Some examples of Lahn Khafee are given below:

- Not observing the rules of <u>Ghunnah</u>
- Not observing the rules of <u>Qalqalah</u>
- Stretching the Madd too much or shortening it
- Over rolling the letter Ra or not following the rules for the correct pronunciation of the letter Ra
- Not pronouncing the <u>Dhammah</u> and/or <u>Kasrah</u> sounds clearly
- Not reading the letter Laam <u>heavy or light</u> according to the rules




