

Put It in NEUTRAL

As we approach the New Year, *designers offer a clean slate.*

Few things are more soothing than Rose Uniacke's deceptively simple interiors. The London-based interior designer/antiques dealer's muted palette and masterful mix of textures are enough to turn the most diehard maximalist into a KonMari devotee. Ceramics are a perfect way to embrace the look at home, with NYC-based Freeforms and KleinReid offering ample options, from '70s Ursula Scheid stoneware to contemporary Eva Zeisel porcelain. Or consider master carpenter Aspen Golann's recent objets—like a bleached maple, black tampico, and brass household brush—that are the perfect marriage of form and function. On the fashion front, The Row and Marisa Witkin placed a premium on luxe materials, using artful embroidery and knitting techniques to add interest to monochrome looks. Prefer art of the non-wearable sort? Denmark-based Rune Elmegaard turns out sleek furniture and abstract paintings, while stick artist Patrick Dougherty creates whimsical sculptures using saplings that push the boundaries of how we experience nature.—NAOMI ROUGEAU
