On Oct. 30, 1982 the city of Philadelphia, Pa. celebrated the signing of the William Penn Treaty, with the Indians of this area three hundred years ago; and one of the few treaties ever honored. This reenactment took place at Penn's Landing which brought together Chiefs, Medicine Men and women and other tribal officials on the east coast. A total of fifty-four of these tribes were represented. The Tri-Centennial Committee sponsored the money for the construction of an Indian Village as it was three hundred years ago. Thousands of people attended this week long affair.

It now appears that the ties of the Tuscarora people north and south are now in the process of getting back together as one nation.

Indeed it was a historical event that these four great men were able to come together in union.

Among the many chiefs who attended were the three chiefs of the Tuscarora of Lewiston, New York and the Chief of the Tuscarora Tribe of North Carolina. This is the first time the chiefs of all the Tuscarora people have ever gotten together and met since the year 1712. On this occasion Chiefs Patterson, Mt. Pleasant and Stuart were formally introduced to Chief Leon Locklear, Drowning Creek Reservation, Maxton, NC.

A brief meeting was held with invitations given on both sides. Mrs. Reatha Locklear, the wife of Chief Leon Locklear, presented to Mrs. Mt. Pleasant a gift that was made on the Drowning Creek Res-

**Plains Indians visit Fairgrove**

A lecture and dance program was given at Fairgrove School on December 2 by Chief Red Dawn and Blue Eagle. The two gentlemen are Sioux Indians from the western part of the United States. The program was sponsored by the Robeson County Indian Education Act. Both men were fully attired in traditional Indian dress and spoke briefly about the significant meaning each part of the dress has. Chief Red Dawn showed how different Indians can be identified by the type of clothing they wear. He explained this by showing Indian models. He spoke, too, on Indian names and explained how Indians were given names from their ancestors, for doing good deeds, etc.

Blue Eagle performed three dances, the third of which was the famous Indian Hoop Dance. He studied for this dance with Tony Whitecloud who is sixty-five years old, and danced with six hoops and showed much skill and agility as he danced.

The performance was regarded by the audience as captivating, interesting, and very informative. Mr. Larece Hunt, principal, introduced the gentlemen at the beginning of the program and thanked them for sharing their skill and knowledge with the school at the end of the program.
