1. Name: The name of the Corporation is:  
O.P.E.N Global Village, Original Peoples' Education Network, Inc.

2. Purpose: The purpose for which the corporation is organized is:

Exclusively for educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as now enacted or hereafter amended, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that also qualify as Section 501(c)(3) exempt organizations. To this end, the corporation shall provide support for projects which foster a collaborative exchange of ideas between communities to enhance and put into practice educational curriculum and teaching methods which contribute to the use of Local Wisdom and Indigenous Ways of Knowing by educators who bear the privilege and responsibility of cultivating the intellectual development of the children who are the next generation and only hope for the sustainability of human society. All academic subject areas are suitable for curriculum content; however the corporation shall favor projects which integrate mathematics, science and written language instruction into subject areas which address a current need of the local community. Projects will work to incorporate the use of local languages into the curriculum and teaching methods used and thus preserve the local culture and thought patterns which have been imbedded in the language by the past seven generations.

All funds, whether income or principal, and whether acquired by gift or contribution or otherwise, shall be devoted to said purposes.

3. Character of Affairs: The character of affairs of the corporation will be:

In a 1998 statement on the essence of the Sufficiency Economics model, King Bhumibol said: "Sufficiency is moderation. If one is moderate in one's desires, one will have less craving. If one has less craving, one will take less advantage of others. If all nations hold to this concept, without being extreme or insatiable in one's desires, the world will be a happier place". All activities and undertakings of the corporation shall be in harmony with these words.


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
