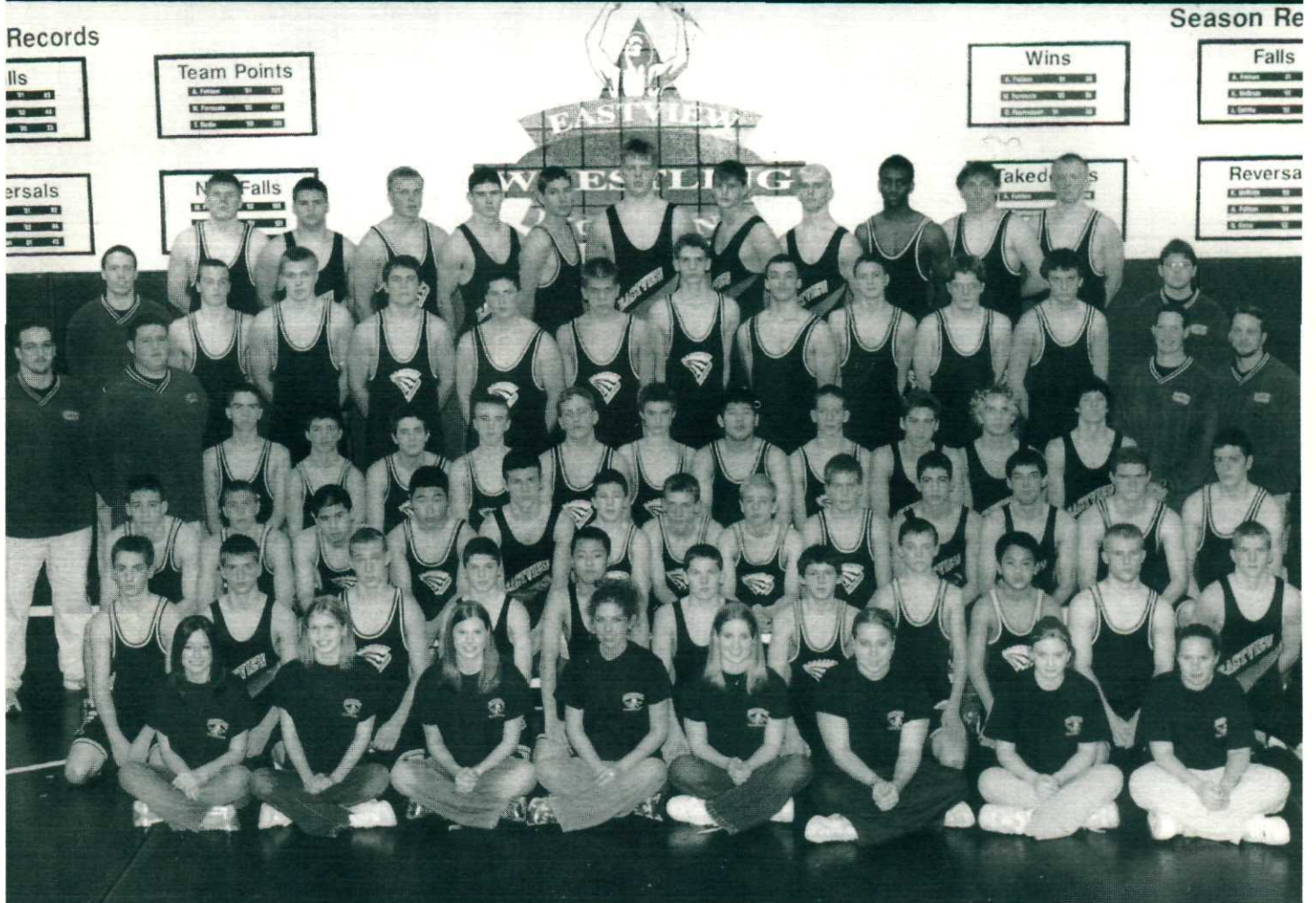

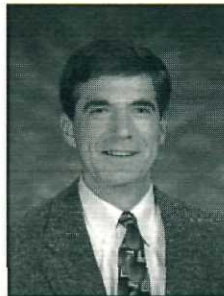
Eastview Athletics

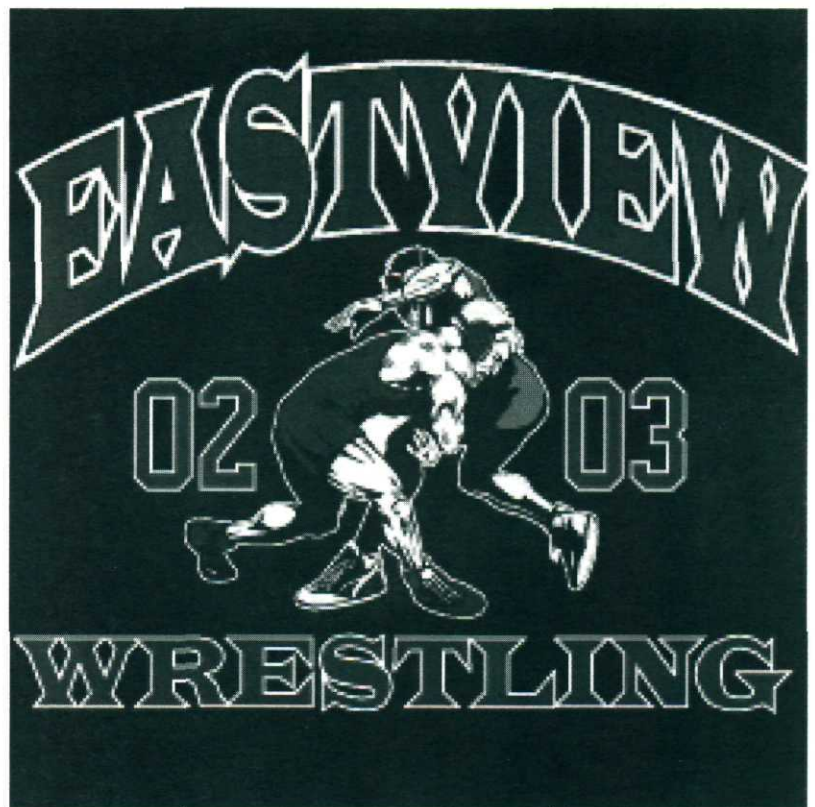
"A thousand mile journey begins with a single step." We are on an honorable and groundbreaking journey this year, but in order to reach our goals, we must focus on each step.

Kurt Habeck, Head Coach

Kurt was a graduate of Augsburg College where he competed in wrestling and was a captain on the NCAA III National Championship Team. Individually, Kurt was a NCAA III All-American and an Academic All-American. He was a varsity

starter all four years as Augsburg placed eighth, third, second, and first nationally.

Todd Frost, Assistant Coach

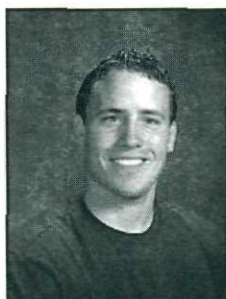
Coach Fornicoia enjoys teaching and coaching, and his hobbies include reading, rollerblading, and mountain biking.

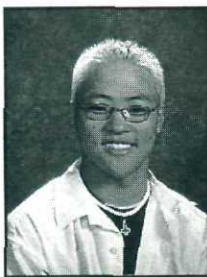
9th Grade State Tournament.

is expected to wrestle at 145 lbs. this season.



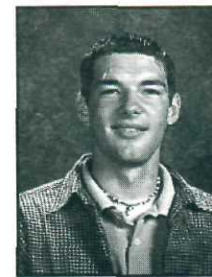
Pat Dea

Kevin Eich

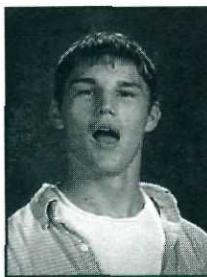

Nate, a senior, broke into the varsity line-up midway through the season and finished earning 3rd place honors at sections. Nate earned 20 wins last season and is expected to

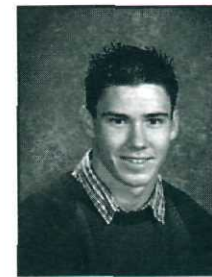
wrestle at 189 lbs. this season.

expected to wrestle at 160 lbs. this season.

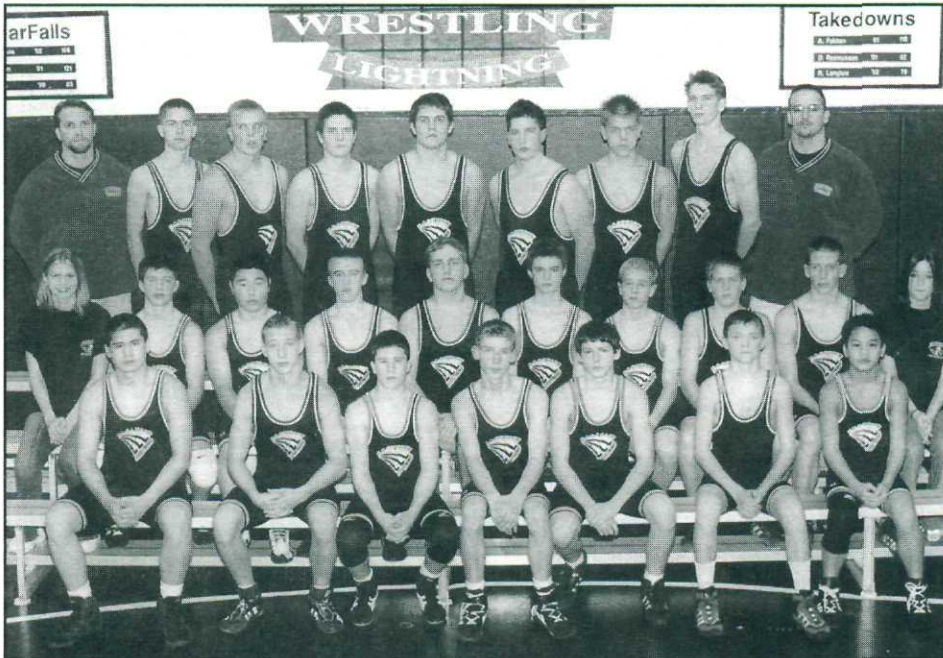


Chris Shuck
