## TEAM 2004: THE LONG MARCH!

**Congratulations** to each of the wrestlers for your successful completion of **The Long March!** The season was filled with many highlights for each team and the wrestling program as a whole. At last year's banquet, we celebrated the Lightning's most successful season. With the loss of eight varsity starters off of last years team, the coaches and wrestlers were aware of the challenges ahead. Team 2004 responded to those challenges with several off-season training programs including participating in another sport, wrestling free-style, strength training in Super Group, and traveling to Nebraska for a team camp. Add that to the many sacrifices, hard work, and courageous efforts during the season, the successes we had this year is something that each wrestler and parent should be very proud of.

Reflecting on this past seasons brings back many **positive memories**. Commitment Night allowed each wrestler to come together, build relationships, set goals, and begin making a commitment to the upcoming season. That night also recognized leaders for the upcoming season with the announcement of three additional captains to go along with the one chosen last spring. Below is a recap of the 2003-2004 season.

The **Freshman team** had a very good season filled with many highlights.

- ◆ Twenty freshman wrestlers worked very hard and improved tremendously as a team.
- ◆ Eight dual meet victories including a 4<sup>th</sup> place finish in the Eastview Tournament.
- ◆ A great Individual Region tournament placing 2<sup>nd</sup> as a team.
- ◆ Qualified 5 individuals to the 9<sup>th</sup> grade State Tournament with one state place winner.
- ◆ Earned 134 match wins, 702 team points, 88 falls, and 180 takedowns.

The **Junior varsity team**

- ◆ Earned 18 dual meet wins and a 2<sup>nd</sup> place finish in the Lake Conference.
- ◆ Earned 1<sup>st</sup> place honors at Faribault and 2<sup>nd</sup> place honors at Coon Rapids and Stillwater Tournaments.
- ◆ Earned two dual meet wins against varsity teams in Brookings, South Dakota.
- ◆ Earned a team record 341 match wins, 1816 team points, 192 falls, and 476 takedowns.
- ◆ Provided the depth needed to fulfill each of the varsity teams needs.

The **Varsity team**

- ◆ Earned Gold Team recognition with a team GPA of 3.60.
- ◆ Earning 13 hard fought victories while competing against Minnesota's best teams.
- ◆ Setting a team record having 26 wrestlers have an opportunity to wrestle a varsity match.
- ◆ Having 10 wrestlers place at the section individual tournament with 3 state qualifiers.
- ◆ Earned 292 match wins, 1359 team points, 134 falls, and 699 takedowns.

The **Class of 2004** includes 11 highly dedicated seniors who together completed "The Long March". The senior class leaves having earned 375 wins, 166 falls, and 1655 team points. To each of the seniors, we thank you for your hard work, commitment, and your ability to achieve things nobody would have believed. We wish you the best of luck in your future endeavors and we hope that the Lightning Pride you developed over the past 4 years will be with you forever.

I share with you some final thoughts about the **future of Eastview Wrestling**. The **coaching staff** is committed to continually making improvements needed to the overall program including offering wrestlers multiple opportunities and challenges. **Wrestlers** on the team must take charge and inspire teammates to work harder than ever, make sacrifices, and do the little things needed to become a champion. **Parents** must continue to offer their support and work with the wrestlers and coaching staff to meet the goals that are set. 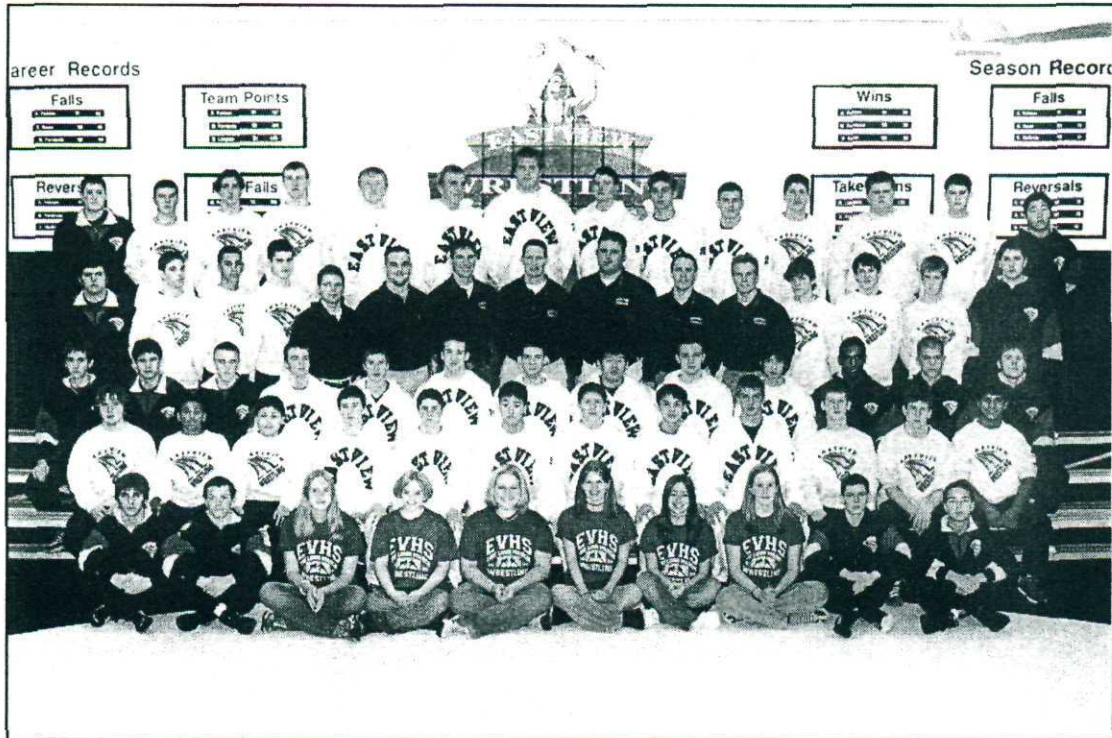

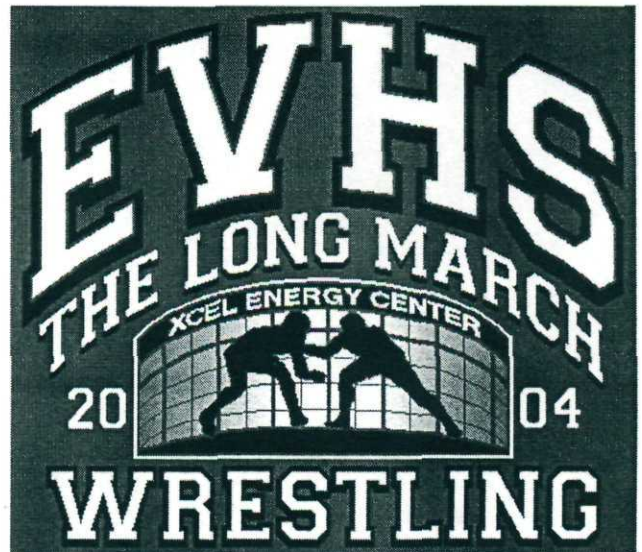
Each of the preceding items serves a purpose (except for the shaved legs): to help you accomplish your goals.

*I'd like to say that the quality of any man's life is a full measure of that man's personal commitment to excellence and to victory, regardless of what field he may be in.*

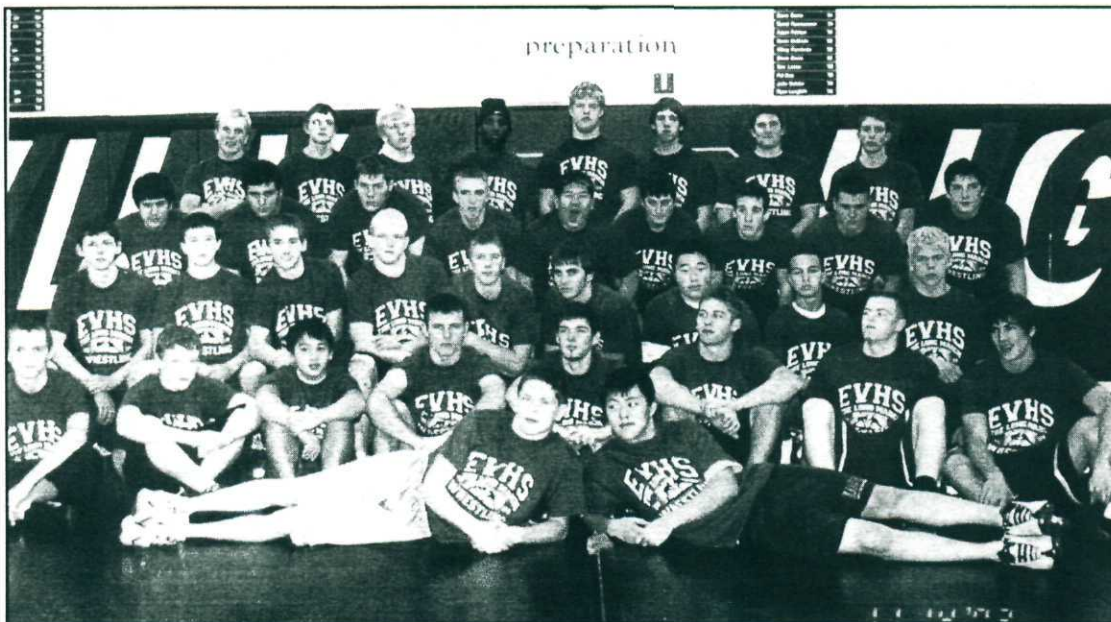

# Eastview seeks more progress

## Season-opening quadrangular Saturday

Even though it operates in the shadow of Minnesota high school wrestling behemoth Apple Valley, Eastview's program made noteworthy strides last year.

The Lightning set school records for dual-meet victories at the varsity (21) and junior varsity (19) levels. Eastview was runner-up in the Lake Conference with a 7-1-1 record and sent four wrestlers to the state tournament.

With 10 letter-winners returning, the Lightning does not plan to take a step back this season. Head coach Kurt Habeck, in his seventh year at Eastview, said his team has the potential for high finishes in the Lake Conference and Section 6 of Class 3A.

All four of the Lightning's state tournament qualifiers from last year graduated, including medal-winner John Getzke (fifth at 152 pounds) and Nate Kocer (sixth at 189).

Returnees include captains Ryan Langlais, Kevin Eich, Jeremiah Foertsch and Tylar Cookas, who combined for 100 victories last season. Cookas is a junior, while the other three captains are se-

niors.

Langlais, who is expected to wrestle at 171 pounds, is a two-time state qualifier. He won 33 matches last season and has 102 career victories. A multifaceted athlete, Langlais also played quarterback for the Eastview football team and has signed to play baseball at North Dakota State University.

Langlais and senior Pat Dea (125 pounds) are returning All-Lake Conference wrestlers. Dea had 27 victories last season, as did Cookas, who will wrestle at 152.

Eich, who will wrestle at 119, won 24 matches last season.

Jeremiah Foertsch, another senior, won 16 matches last season and will wrestle at 135 this year. Cory Wagner is expected to move into the lineup at 215.

Other juniors expected to contribute are Kane Bechstein (145), Sam Voyles (140) and Ryan Ruckdashel (heavyweight). Ninth-grader Ryan Stepan will start at 112 pounds.

The Lightning has an intrasquad meet that will be open to the public at 6:45 p.m. Friday, Dec. 5.

The team's regular-season opener is the Eastview Quadrangular at 10 a.m. Saturday, Dec. 6.

## Eastview

After its best season in school history, the Eastview wrestling program will look to build on that success.

The Lightning finished last season with a 21-5-1 record and finished second in the Lake Conference with a 7-1-1 record.

That solid season has raised expectations and the Lightning return seniors Ryan Langlais, Pat Dea, Jeremiah Foertsch, Kevin Eich and Cory Wagner to the team.

Helping the seniors will be juniors Sam Voyles, Ryan Ruckdashel, Tyler Cookas and Kane Bechstein.

Langlais will be the leader of the Lightning as he looks to make a return trip to the state tournament at 171 pounds.

With 10 letter winners returning, the Lightning think they can duplicate, if not improve on last year's success.

Head coach Kurt Habeck said his team's strengths will be their senior leadership and a balanced lineup.

He said his concern as always is that they compete in the top conference and section and that they do have some inexperience at certain weights.

Eastview senior Ryan Langlais placed first at 171 after defeating Burnsville's Matt Nelson in double overtime in the finals. It's the third time Langlais has won his weight class at the Burnsville tournament. He is 13-2 this season.

The Lightning will play host to Albert Lea, Bemidji, Coon Rapids, Dassel-Cokato, Faribault and Prior Lake in its invitational wrestling tournament starting at 9 a.m. Saturday, Jan. 24.

Eastview is 6-10 overall, but won two of three matches Saturday to place fifth in the Pory Stampede in Stillwater. The Lightning defeated Burnsville 47-31 in the fifth-place match.

Senior Ryan Langlais was 14-2 going into last week's action and was ranked fifth in the state at 171 pounds by The Guillotine. Kevin Eich was 11-4 at 119 and Pat Dea was 12-3 at 125.

"It's been a humbling year for the kids and the coaches," said head coach Kurt Habeck. "I think our expectations were a little higher, but we are wrestling a tough schedule. By the time the regular season is over, we will have wrestled 10 of the top 12 teams in [class] 3A. We're telling our kids every day is practice and every match is practice for the section meet. That's when it counts."

Eastview rolled past Prior Lake 66-3 in the consolation semifinals at Saturday's tournament before losing to Dassel-Cokato 31-26 in the fifth-place match.

Friday, the Lightning defeated Bloomington Jefferson 63-14 and lost to Scott West 33-23 in a quadrangular at Eastview High. Scott West is the No. 1-ranked team in Class 2A.

Lightning senior Ryan Langlais went 5-0 in Friday's and Saturday's matches

with three pins, a technical fall and a forfeit. He's now 23-2 overall and has 125 career victories. Langlais is ranked fifth in Class 3A at 171 pounds, but probably will wrestle at 160 the rest of the season.

Kevin Eich (119 pounds) is 18-6 and has the second most victories on the team. Minh Huynh, in just his second year of wrestling, is 17-9 at 103. Tyler Cookas (140) has 16 victories, and Pat Dea (125) and Ryan Ruckdashel (heavy-weight) each have 15 wins.

Langlais is seeking a return to the state tournament after qualifying as a freshman and sophomore. Habeck said Eich also has the potential to get there, but he will have his work cut out if he stays at 119 pounds. Two state champions from last season (Apple Valley's Charlie Falck and Bloomington Kennedy's Jayson Ness) are ranked first and second at that weight.

The Lightning will wrestle in a Lake Conference quadrangular Thursday, Jan. 29, at Lakeville. Eastview faces Lakeville at 6 p.m. and wrestles Chaska at 7:30.



# Langlais will concentrate on baseball in college

Multi-talented Eastview senior also quarterbacked football team and has more than 125 career victories in wrestling

Like father, like son. But even that adage has its limits.

Mike Langlais was one of Apple Valley High School's first great wrestlers. And he was the first from Apple Valley to win a state individual title, back in 1980.

His son, Ryan, also is an outstanding wrestler - for Eastview, Apple Valley's crosstown rival.

Mike went to North Dakota State University and became one of the best wrestlers in Bison history, winning two NCAA championships. He also earned All-America honors five times (four in Division II, one in Division I).

Ryan is also headed to NDSU in the fall - but, to play baseball.

Ryan is a gifted athlete who has excelled in several sports, one of which happens to be wrestling. He also was the starting quarterback for Eastview's football team last fall.

In baseball, he has been a standout for Eastview High and the Apple Valley American Legion team. In Legion ball last summer he batted close to .400, including .615 at the state tournament. He had three home runs, 12 doubles, 37 runs batted in and was thrown out only once in 12 steal attempts.

Plus, he can pitch. His fastball has been clocked in the high 80s.

"I'm a pretty good pitcher for high school, but I'm really more of a thrower," Langlais said. "[NDSU's coaches] see me playing in the infield somewhere. They thought I would have a chance to play right away, maybe even start, but nothing's guaranteed."

NDSU's baseball program will be in Division I by the time Langlais gets there.

He had considered Valparaiso and attracted some interest from the University of Minnesota before deciding on North Dakota State.

Langlais said it should be fun to play for a college where his father is well known. Mike Langlais is in the school's athletic hall of fame. But Ryan said the direction of the baseball program had an even bigger influence on his decision.

"Their sports facilities are new, and their baseball field is one of the best in the country. I think Minnesota would like to get one like it," he said. "Roger Maris is from there [Fargo, N.D.], and he donated something like \$7 million to the baseball program. Now they have super-nice facilities."

Before he dives into baseball full time, Langlais has things he wants to accomplish in wrestling.

He's already accomplished quite a bit. He went 6-0 last week with one pin, three major decisions, one decision and a forfeit, and is 29-2 this season.

Langlais has 131 career victories, which puts him at No. 2 on the Lightning's all-time list. But Langlais has won more matches than anybody in an Eastview singlet. Adam Fokken, a 2001 graduate, had 147 wins in a high school career that started at Eagan and ended at Eastview.

This year, Langlais is out to erase a spot on his record. After qualifying for state as a ninth- and 10th-grader, he missed going to state last season. He lost

in the finals of the Class 3A, Section 6 tournament, then lost a match for true second, which prevented him from reaching state. He considers that his biggest disappointment in any sport.

"Not qualifying for state last year was a humbling experience for him," said Eastview wrestling coach Kurt Habeck. "This year, he's set some pretty high goals. Ryan wants to get back to state and once he gets there, he wants to medal."

Langlais is ranked fifth in Class 3A at 171 pounds by *The Guillotine*, a statewide wrestling newspaper. But he's expected to wrestle the remainder of the season at 160.

Not surprisingly, Langlais' father introduced him to wrestling at an early age. But as Ryan's athletic interests expanded, he had less time to wrestle. Now he rarely steps on a mat outside of the high school season.

A lot of wrestlers hone their skills in the freestyle season, which takes place in the spring and summer. For Langlais, however, that would conflict with baseball.

Habeck said he has no doubt that Langlais could wrestle on scholarship in college if he wanted. But Habeck understands that "baseball is Ryan's No. 1 passion."

"Having three-sport athletes is something all the coaches at Eastview promote," Habeck said. "Ryan is someone we point to. He's a great kid, well respected by his teammates and the school. He's quiet; he just goes out and does his job. And obviously he's very talented. To accomplish what he has in wrestling, even though he wrestles only three months a year, is amazing."

Langlais said he wonders what it will be like to concentrate on one sport in college and how he will adjust. He talked about possibly joining the football team at some point in his career at NDSU. Several colleges, most notably St. Cloud State, recruited Langlais as a defensive back.

But he thinks he's figured out how to feed his competitive hunger during the baseball off-season.

"I'll probably play a lot of intramurals," he said.

# Langlais excels at three sports

Senior has already signed with North Dakota State University to play baseball

"That's filed in his memory bank. It was a devastating situation for him last year but that has served as motivation for the past 11 months," Habeck said.

As for Langlais, he said the loss has made him set his goals even higher.

"I want to place in the top-four at state and hopefully a state championship," Langlais said.

Langlais is on the verge of breaking Eastview's all-time record in takedowns.

He has wrestled for the Lightning and Habeck since the eighth grade. He has come along way in five years.

With a career record of 131-51, Langlais began his career as "string bean," 130-pound wrestler.

Since then he has moved up in weight every year and adjusted well. He is wrestling at 171

pounds this year.

What makes him so successful on the mat?

"He has a lot of experience, a large background in wrestling and he is very athletic," Habeck said. "His number one feature is his athleticism. That makes him special. He gets a lot of wins because of that."

Langlais learned to wrestle from his dad, who was the first ever state champion at Apple Valley High School.

After the wrestling season, Langlais will move to the baseball diamond to play his favorite sport.

As the starting shortstop and pitcher for the Lightning, he has a lot of responsibility on the diamond.

He has played on the varsity since his sophomore year and earned a scholarship to play at North Dakota State University.

As a junior, Langlais hit .307 with 21 runs scored. He also pitched 52 innings, giving up only 37 hits, 16 earned runs and striking out 35 to earn all-conference honors.

Eastview won the final two matches, but that wasn't enough as Eagan won 30-27.

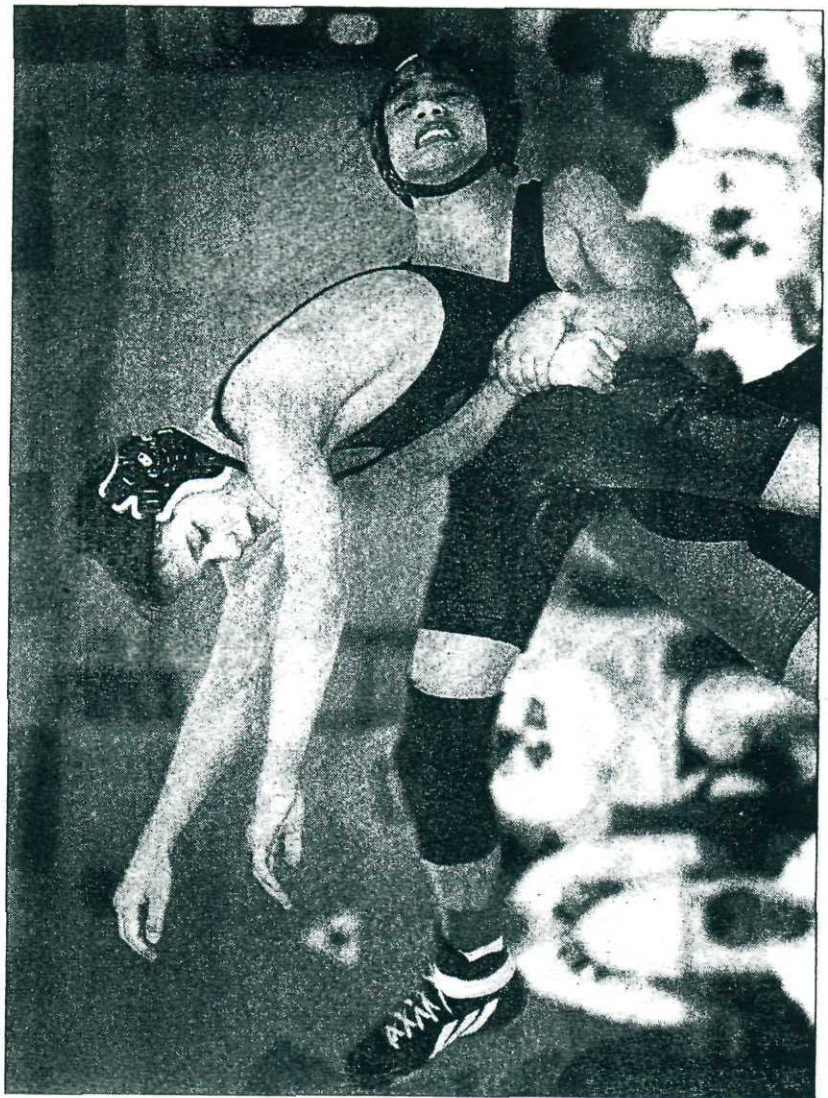
